**MINUTES**

**I. CALL TO ORDER**

The meeting was called to order at 9:05 a.m. by Chair Vargas

**III. PUBLIC TESTIMONY**

A. No one offered public testimony when the agenda item for public testimony was called. However, Uvette Sakamoto responded that she would reserve her testimony for the Dangerous Dog Designation hearing concerning Daniel Cretton's dogs "Xena" and "Bamboo". The hearing was subsequently continued due to election to obtain counsel, and Uvette Sakamoto requested that public testimony be re-opened so she could present public testimony. Chair reconvened the board meeting at 9:20 a.m. to allow Ms. Sakamoto the opportunity to present public testimony. Board members were present as previously announced.

Uvette Sakamoto stated she wanted to testify so that it could be presented for further discussion and for public awareness. Ms. Sakamoto stated she had a timeline which was made in collaboration with MHS, along with photos and documentation from a certified veterinarian, indicating dates in addition to the March 28, 2017 incident which is the subject of the continued hearing. Ms. Sakamoto stated that the public should be made aware as each person may interpret the term "dangerous dog" differently. Ms. Sakamoto testified that there were no personal feelings involved and that she was just stating the facts.

Chair accepted Ms. Sakamoto's written timeline and photos she had noted as exhibits A, B, C & D, to be attached to the meeting minutes, attached herewith.

Ms. Sakamoto stated she and her husband Bruce tried to work it out with Daniel Cretton as neighbors, and that she feels sorry for any animal that needs to go through this. She also noted that the photos she provided are very gory, and stated these photos were not related to the incident of March 28, 2017, which is the subject of the continued hearing. Ms. Sakamoto stated the photos range from Nov. 6, 2016, to the present as her dog was attacked multiple times. In closing, Ms. Sakamoto stated that she wanted to present her testimony and have it on record so the public is aware until the next hearing.

#### **IV. APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

- A. Chair Vargas entertained a motion to approve the minutes of the March 16, 2017 board meeting. Motion moved by Member Winer, seconded by Chair Vargas. All members present were in favor of approving minutes as written. Motion carried.

#### **V. NEW BUSINESS**

- A. Introduction of new board member Patrick Borge  
Chair Vargas welcomed newly appointed member Patrick Borge to the Animal Control Board.
- B. Daniel Cretton's request to appeal the Dangerous Dog Designations placed on his dogs "Xena" and "Bamboo" was convened immediately following the board meeting. However, due to election by Mr. Cretton to obtain counsel, the case was continued to the next meeting.

#### **VI. ANNOUNCEMENT OF NEXT MEETING DATE AND AGENDA ITEMS**

- A. Next meeting will be held on June 6, 2017 at 9:00 a.m. to continue the appeal of Dangerous Dog Designations placed on Daniel Cretton's dogs "Xena" and "Bamboo". Location to be announced.

**VII. ADJOURNMENT**

Chair Vargas entertained a motion to adjourn the meeting. Motion moved by Member Winer, seconded by Member Borge. All in favor, motion carried. Meeting originally adjourned at 9:10 a.m. by Chair Vargas. Upon continuation of the Dangerous Dog appeal by Mr. Cretton, Chair Vargas re-convened the board meeting and accepted public testimony by Uvette Sakamoto as noted above. After the public testimony was presented, Chair Vargas entertained a fresh motion to adjourn the meeting once again. Motion moved by Member Winer, seconded by Member Borge. All in favor, motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 9:25 a.m. by Chair Vargas.

## Timeline Summary

11/08/16 - C1, Uvette Sakamoto reported she had found her dog torn up and had to take her dog to be treated by a vet. C1 said after contacting R1, Daniel he admitted it must have been his dogs as they did have blood on them. Ofc. Carcamo determined it was unclear if the attack on C1's was unprovoked as there were accusations the victim dog may have been loose as well. Daniel paid the vet bills for C1's dog.

2/01/17- C2, Bruce Sakamoto reported his dog Chubs was restrained within his fully fenced yard and R1's two unrestrained dogs attacked his dog thru the fencing of his yard. R1 admitted his dogs had escaped from his yard and he had to jump into C1's yard to break up the fight. R1 said he was bitten by Chubs when he pulled off his dogs. R1 identified the culprit dogs by name as Xena and Bamboo. R1 was given a verbally warning regarding dangerous dog definitions.

2/16/17 C2 reported one of R1's dogs was loose again and trying to attack his dog through his fencing. I left a message for R1 advising he if his dogs were found running loose they may be impounded and possible euthanized. I also spoke to the dogs former owner Janice Cretton and advised her of the complaints of Daniels dogs running loose and of the resent attacks to the C1 and C2's dog. R1 later came into MHS and was given copies of CCM Codes pertaining to Dangerous Dog and Dog Impounds.

3/28/17- C2, Bruce called to report his restrained dog had been attacked again by R1's two unrestrained dogs. C2 said he witnessed the attack and feels his dog would have been seriously injured or killed if he had not intervened. C2 said he probably wouldn't be home when I arrived as he was taking his dog to the vet. I contacted R1 at his residence and advised his dogs named Xena and Bamboo fit the definition of a Dangerous Dogs under the imminent threat section, and I would like him to come to MHS to go over the paperwork or I could make an appointment to meet with him at his residence. I received no response from R1.

3/31/17 - I served the Dangerous Dog Paperwork to R1 at his residence , along with two citations for CCM 6.04.040 (A) Leash Law and 6.04.040 (E) Dog Attack to Dog immediate threat. R1 signed and accepted the paperwork.

4/05/17 C2 reported a family member just informed him the neighbors dogs were loose. I went up and checked to find Xena and Bamboo restrained in fenced yard but not to be in compliance with the Dangerous Dog restraint portion of the law. I issued two more citations for

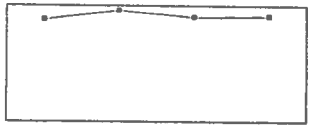

I paid the only time there was a witness (me) that mine got out and were fighting yours through the fence and I paid the first 2 x's when there were no witnesses and Chubs may have come over and challenged mine like the day she came over for a challenge with the dressing still on her from the second fight. I will pay again. Should I call your vet?

I had to go in your property to break up the last fight because I couldn't get in between the two fences where my dogs were. I got my dogs and Chubs to stop fighting each other through the fence and I was trying to be watchful knowing this is a tense situation for all the dogs but after breaking it up and starting to leave Chubs came up behind me and bit me twice on my leg. Not bad just puncture wounds and blood. I showed the animal control lady and she said something like " it's natural for them to protect their property" and I agreed. I was a little apprehensive about taking Chubs to the vet after she bit me but did it anyway and she was fine with me.

My dogs are all the most loving dogs I've ever had, especially the feral dog...she wags her entire body when she sees me (or Lani, she loves Lani -the big dog-to death). Chubs and her (and her pup) want to fight each other. I am very sorry for their pain (my dog has a hole in her head also) and forgetting to close that gate.

Oops maybe I am rambling. Bottom line shall I call your vet to arrange payment?

I was in the shower the second time you called but after listening to your first call and message decided I do not want to talk to someone who

wants to scold me for being irresponsible after paying over \$2,000 in vet bills for poor, old, blind, crippled (can't even walk out of the yard) chubs. That is what Bruce told me after the first fight (not witnessed, very well Chubs was out also and they were fighting in the easement...and other neighbors reports that poor, crippled Chubs is known to be aggressive). Second fight also not witnessed but once again irresponsible me forks over another \$1,000. You tried to get me to pay some more follow-up costs but Chubs make a visit over to my gate and was on the other side (in the easement) all bandaged up from the fight not even 1 week earlier and barking her raspy bark wanting a rematch.

I have made a secure area around my place by buying 50' rolls of 3' chicken wire bending it in half and attaching 18" to the fence and 18" on the ground so they cannot dig out.

I have already purchased additional rolls to do the same thing to the outside fence which will eliminate their ability to get out. It hasn't been a high priority for me because I am always with them when we go out of the smaller secured area.

Today when I had them out they suddenly went charging to the back corner of the property (nearest to you) and my dogs and your dogs were barking ferociously at each other. They cannot get out over there and I don't know if yours were out but I called them back and took them into the secure area. There are two gates in the secure area and when I brought them in at the bottom

gate and went in to do some work on the computer  
I did not remember that we went out through the  
top gate and I had left it open.

I intend to install the chicken wire tomorrow and  
then the entire property will be secure.

Speaking of secure. One morning I came out of  
the storage building below and one of your little  
dogs was standing there to greet me. Fortunate my  
dogs were in the secure area sleeping.
