PR-16 RESOLUTION ACCEPTING DEDICATION OF LAND (Wahikuli State Wayside Park, Launiupoko State Wayside Park, Papalaua State Wayside Park, Ukumehame Beach Park, Kihei Beach Reserve) FROM THE STATE; AND A PROPOSED BILL AMENDING CHAPTER 13.04, MAUI COUNTY CODE, PERTAINING TO PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES CUSTODIAL DEPOSITS AND CAMPING AREAS (Papalaua Wayside Park, Honomanu Beach Park, Waihee Beach Park)

DESCRIPTION: By County Communication No. 01-204, Mayor James “Kimo” Apana transmitted the following:
1. A proposed resolution entitled “ACCEPTING DEDICATION OF LAND PURSUANT TO SECTION 3.44.015, MAUI COUNTY CODE”. The purpose of the proposed resolution is to accept the Wahikuli State Wayside Park, Launiupoko State Wayside Park, Papalaua State Wayside Park, Ukumehame Beach Park and Kihei Beach Reserve from the State.
2. A proposed bill entitled “A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 13.04, MAUI COUNTY CODE, PERTAINING TO PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES CUSTODIAL DEPOSITS AND CAMPING AREAS”. The purpose of the proposed bill is to permit camping at Papalaua Wayside Park, Honomanu Beach Park and Waihee Beach Park.

STATUS: The Committee has also scheduled a meeting on this item for July 30, 2001, at 6:00 p.m., at Lahaina Intermediate School Cafeteria (please see separate meeting agenda). At its meeting of August 1, 2001, the Committee will consider whether to recommend adoption of the proposed resolution and passage on first reading of the proposed bill. The Committee may also consider other related action, including the filing of County Communication No. 01-204.
