RULES GOVERNING CONDUCT AT COUNTY PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES

DESCRIPTION: The Committee is in receipt of County Communication No. 01-176, from the Council Chair, transmitting a memorandum from Cherrie-Ann K. Akina, dated May 5, 2001, relating to sanctions for the misuse of County parks and facilities.

STATUS: The Department of the Corporation Counsel will provide the Committee with a recommendation for how the Director of Parks and Recreation may address certain abuses by individuals using County parks and facilities. The Committee will consider whether to recommend any legislative action. The Committee may consider other related action, including the possible filing of County Communication No. 01-176.

PR-14 CONCERNS AT POHAKU PARK (A.K.A. S-TURN PARK)

DESCRIPTION: The Committee is in receipt of County Communication No. 01-177, from the Council Chair, transmitting a letter from Carole Joy Ameal, Executive Director, West Maui Taxpayers Association, dated June 2, 2001, relating to concerns at Pohaku Park (a.k.a. S-Turn Park).

STATUS: The Committee will review concerns regarding the cleanliness, maintenance, safety, and lighting of Pohaku Park, which is located in Kahana. The Committee will consider whether to recommend any legislative action. The Committee may consider other related action, including the possible filing of County Communication No. 01-177.

PR-16 A PROPOSED BILL AMENDING CHAPTER 13.04, MAUI COUNTY CODE, PERTAINING TO PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES CUSTODIAL DEPOSITS AND CAMPING AREAS (Papalaua Wayside Park, a.k.a. Ukumehame Beach Park, Parts A and B; Honomanu Beach Park and Waihee Beach Park)

DESCRIPTION: By County Communication No. 01-204, Mayor James "Kimo" Apana transmitted a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 13.04, MAUI COUNTY CODE, PERTAINING TO PARKS AND RECREATIONAL FACILITIES CUSTODIAL DEPOSITS AND CAMPING AREAS". The purpose of the proposed bill is to designate Papalaua Wayside Park, a.k.a. Ukumehame Beach Park, Parts A and B; Honomanu Beach Park, and Waihee Beach Park as camping sites.

STATUS: At its meeting of July 30, 2001 and August 1, 2001, the Committee deferred consideration of the proposed bill. The Committee will consider whether to authorize the Committee Chair and the Director of Parks and Recreation to hold three informal community meetings to discuss site-specific proposals for the camping sites as proposed by the Mayor. The meetings dates and times to be announced. The Committee will consider whether to recommend any legislative action. The Committee may consider other related action, including the possible filing of County Communication No. 01-204.
