CHAIR MOLINA: ...*(gavel)*... The Committee of the Whole meeting for June 25th, 2009 is now in session. It is one minute after the hour of 9 a.m. For the record, we have in attendance, Committee Vice-Chair Danny Mateo; Committee Member Gladys Baisa; Committee Member--

COUNCILMEMBER BAISA: Good morning.

CHAIR MOLINA: --Joe Pontanilla; Committee Member Wayne Nishiki; and Committee Member Michael Victorino.

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: Good morning, Chair.

CHAIR MOLINA: Good morning, Members.

COUNCILMEMBER BAISA: ...*(inaudible)*...

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CHAIR MOLINA: Excused are Members Johnson, Kaho‘ohalahala, and Medeiros. Members, we have. . .uh. . .an ambitious agenda this morning, but I believe we can finish hopefully in a very. . .convenient time ‘cause I know we do have an afternoon Economic and Agriculture Committee meeting at 1:30 this afternoon, which I anticipate will be a somewhat long meeting. Anyway for the record, in attendance we have our Committee Analyst Kirstin Hamman, and we also have our Committee Secretary Camille Sakamoto. And from the Administration, Corporation Counsel’s office, we have Mr. Michael Hopper; as well as Marian Feenstra. So Members, let me find out if we have any signups for public testimony. Committee Secretary, have we has any signups?

MS. SAKAMOTO: No, Mr. Chair.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Seeing that no one has signed up for any of our agenda items, if there are no objections, the Chair will close public testimony for today.

COUNCIL MEMBERS: No objections.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay, so ordered by the Committee. All right, Members, let’s go ahead and jump right into our first item. . .which is Committee of the Whole Item 2(5), nominations to boards, committees, and commissions.

ITEM NO. 2(5): NOMINATIONS TO BOARDS, COMMITTEES, AND COMMISSIONS
(MAUI COUNTY CULTURAL RESOURCES COMMISSION) (C.C. No. 09-15)

CHAIR MOLINA: The Committee is in receipt of. . .a correspondence dated May 8th, 2009 from the Mayor, requesting consideration of Doradeen Kanuha to the Maui County Cultural Resources Commission for a term expiring on March 31st, 2014. The Council must approve or disapprove this nomination by July 11th of 2009 or the nomination will be deemed approved. So at this point, Members, we will have, first, Ms. Feenstra to give us a brief overview of the nominee to the committee, or to the commission, I should say. Ms. Feenstra?

MS. FEENSTRA: Yes. Good morning, Committee of the Whole Chair Mike Molina, Council Members. . .and staffers. Mayor would like to thank Doradeen Kanuha for her willingness to serve our community as a member of the Cultural Resource Commission. Mayor would like to thank Council Members for their consideration of her nomination.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay, thank you.

MS. FEENSTRA: I think, I believe that you do have her application, and she did also include quite a lengthy list of her activities. So if there is any questions?

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay, thank you, Ms. Feenstra. Prior to opening the floor up for questions regarding the nominee, for the record there were two requests made by Members to have Ms. Kanuha to appear. However, staying. . .being consistent with past policies of the

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Committee of the Whole, if three Members request then, then we will bring in the nominee. One of the Members requesting, Mr. Medeiros, is not here this morning as well. And I believe the other Member was Member Baisa--

COUNCILMEMBER BAISA: Yes.

CHAIR MOLINA: --making the request. So, Members, we do have the . . . application of the nominee in your binder. The Chair will open up the floor for any questions to Ms. Feenstra regarding the nominee. Floor is now open for questions, Members.

. . . Okay, if there are no questions, then the Chair will then offer a recommendation.

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: Recommendation?

COUNCILMEMBER BAISA: Recommendation?

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Chair's recommendation is to approve the nominee, Doreen. . . Doradeen Kanuha to the Maui County Cultural Resources Commission for a term expiring on March 31st, 2014.

VICE-CHAIR MATEO: So moved.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay, it's been moved by--

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: Second.

CHAIR MOLINA: --Member Mateo, seconded by Member Victorino. Any discussion?

COUNCILMEMBER PONTANILLA: Chairman?

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay, Mr. Pontanilla?

COUNCILMEMBER PONTANILLA: Thank you. Uh. . . this is for the Administration. In regards to her present. . . employment as the Hotel Cultural Resource Advisor, can you expound on her duties?

CHAIR MOLINA: . . . Ms. Feenstra?

MS. FEENSTRA: She currently works with Kaanapali Beach Hotel, and she is the Cultural, one of the Cultural Liaisons. They have quite a, an intensive program there. . . they like to be known as the most Hawaiian hotel, you know, on our island. And as far as that having any conflicts, I, I don't perceive any conflicts. And the employer. . . is very willing to allow her to attend meetings and flex her schedule for. . . for those meetings.

COUNCILMEMBER PONTANILLA: Uh-huh. Thank you.

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CHAIR MOLINA: Okay.

COUNCILMEMBER PONTANILLA: Thank you, Chairman.

CHAIR MOLINA: All right, thank you, Mr. Pontanilla. Committee Members, any other questions? Member Baisa?

COUNCILMEMBER BAISA: Not necessarily a question, but I wanted to explain the reason why I had made the request and hoped that you know she would have been with us today. I don't know the lady personally. She has a very impressive background. But it would have been nice to at least meet her and have the opportunity to chat with her for a bit. But that, that was the reason for my request.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Thank you, Member Baisa. And, Members, you know. . .none of us are prohibited from I guess calling the applicant to meet with them separately if we want to, to ask any questions with regards to why they, you know, any person wants to be on, on a commission like this. So the application is there, and as well you can also contact Ms. Feenstra from the Mayor's Office as well if you have additional questions about the nominees. Any other questions for Ms. Feenstra from the Administration regarding the nominee?

. . . Seeing none, the Chair will call for the vote. All those in favor, signify by saying "aye".

COUNCIL MEMBERS: Aye.

CHAIR MOLINA: All those opposed?

. . . Okay, thank you. The Chair will mark it six "ayes" with three "excusals"--Members Johnson, Kaho'ohalahala, and Medeiros.

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CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Thank you very much, Members. Moving on, we're now on Committee of the Whole Item 1(5).

ITEM NO. 1(5): LITIGATION MATTERS (INDEMNIFICATION AUTHORIZATION: SANDHILLS GANG PARTNERS V. MALAFU CONTRACTORS LLC, ET AL.; CIVIL NO. 08-1-0585(3)) (C.C. No. 09-14)

CHAIR MOLINA: The Committee is in receipt of a correspondence dated May 5th, 2009 from the Department of the Corporation Counsel requesting consideration of a proposed resolution entitled: indemnifying David I. Sakoda in Sandhills Gang Partners versus Malafu Contractors, LLC, et al., Civil Number 08-1-0585(3); and transmitting a copy of the complaint. The complaint alleges Plaintiff suffered damages as a result of the removal of a tree from Plaintiff's property. The purpose of the proposed resolution is to indemnify David I. Sakoda, a County employee, in this particular case. And from the Corporation Counsel's office, we welcome Ms. Moana Lutey, as well as Ms. Lauren Martin. Thank you, ladies, for appearing this morning. And I'll go ahead and give you the floor to give us a brief overview of this matter.

MS. LUTEY: Thank you, Chairman. Good morning. This case is currently in active litigation. I believe this is something we can handle on the floor. But if you start going off into questions that require me to ask for executive, then I'll need to do it at that point. But I'll let you know.

. . . Sandhill Gangs allege that on June 20th, 2008 an old tree was cut down at the direction of David Sakoda. The tree was termite damaged and so decayed that large portions of its trunk were completely hallow. The decayed and rotten condition of the tree was apparent. The dead tree was clearly encroaching on the public right-of-way and posed a hazard to anyone passing by. David Sakoda has been named as a Defendant in this lawsuit, and I am asking that Council agree to indemnify Mr. Sakoda.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Thank you, Ms. Lutey. Members, before the Chair opens up the floor for questions, the Chair would like to remind you that in order to ensure that we comply with Sunshine Law, I would ask that you confine your questions only to the County employee that is being considered for indemnification for today's purposes. Until we get settlement proposal, then as far as other matters related to the case, that will be the appropriate time to ask questions about specific matters regarding the case. But for today's purposes, I would ask that you keep your questions related to the indemnification of the County employee. Okay, Members? Members, any questions on the indemnification or the County individual that is being considered for indemnification? Mr. Mateo?

VICE-CHAIR MATEO: Chairman, thank you. Ms. Lutey, good morning.

MS. LUTEY: Good morning.

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VICE-CHAIR MATEO: Can, can you just provide additional information for me? The request is for indemnification, as the Chair had just indicated. Because this is ongoing litigation at this point, you expect to come back to this body to provide more in-depth information at what point?

MS. LUTEY: I think once we get closer to trial. We don't have a trial date right now. Or if there's an offer that's conveyed by the Plaintiff's counsel, that is something I need to transmit to this body, I'll be back to give you a significant amount of, a significant, more amount of information.

VICE-CHAIR MATEO: Okay. Thank you. Thank you, Mr. Chair.

CHAIR MOLINA: Thank you, Mr. Mateo. Ms. Baisa?

COUNCILMEMBER BAISA: Yes, thank you, Chair. And thank you, Ms. Lutey. I think it would be relevant because we're assuming that Mr. Sakoda was acting as, in his official capacity as a County employee--what was he doing? What's his job?

MS. LUTEY: He's an Arborist. And he's employed under the Parks. . .Department. I did ask someone from Parks to be present today. I don't think they're really necessary at this point, but they were told 9:15. Because of the timing, so they're not here yet. But he is the Arborist. He did inspect the tree and determined that it was something that needed to be removed due to the damage that was actually visual. . .visible to anyone in the general vicinity. But for him, as the Arborist, clearly within his qualifications to determine.

COUNCILMEMBER BAISA: Thank you. I think that's relevant. Thank you.

MS. LUTEY: Thank you.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay, thank you, Member Baisa. Committee Members, any other questions related to this particular item?

. . . Okay, seeing none, then the Chair will offer a recommendation.

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: Recommendation?

COUNCILMEMBER BAISA: Recommendation?

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay, thank you, Members. The Chair will. . .like to. . .entertain a motion to support the. . .the resolution to indemnify David Sakoda in the Sandhills Gang Partners versus Malafu Contractors matter.

CHAIR MOLINA: --moved by Member Mateo, seconded by Member Victorino. Any discussion?

ITEM NO. 1(7): LITIGATION MATTERS (INDEMNIFICATION AUTHORIZATION: TINA BASS V. MAUI COUNTY POLICE DEPARTMENT, ET AL.; CIVIL NO. CV08-00280 HG BMK) (C.C. No. 09-14)

CHAIR MOLINA: Members, this matter deals with an indemnification authorization, Tina Bass versus Maui County Police Department, et al; Civil Number CV08-00280 HG BMK. We have received a letter from. . .Mr. Rost from the Corporation Counsel's office. And this, I believe, the matter has been withdrawn. Staff, could you provide us an additional commentary on the matter at this point?

MS. HAMMAN: Yes, Chair. We received, the Committee received a letter dated June 23rd from Deputy Corporation Counsel Richard Rost that does indicate that the Plaintiff in the

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lawsuit, Tina Bass, has agreed to dismiss her case with prejudice. And that the Corporation Counsel has filed a stipulation to that effect with the Court.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Thank you, Ms. Hamman. Committee Members, you have the information. Mr. Victorino?

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: Yeah, just, just a question and I may understand it but I just wanna make sure I understand it. When someone. . .ask to be. . .dismissed with prejudice, can--'cause I know there's without prejudice, there's with prejudice. . .and I always get mixed up, so I wanna. . .and the public would like to know what does that mean specifically to us?

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Ms. Lutey?

MS. LUTEY: Thank you, Chairman. Mr. Victorino, that means that they cannot bring this lawsuit ever again. It's permanently gone.

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: Thank you.

MS. LUTEY: That's--

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: Thank you. And I, I wanted that made perfectly clear. Thank you very much, Chair.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Thank you very much, Mr. Victorino. Committee Members, any other questions regarding this matter, this dismissal. . .of this case?

COUNCILMEMBER BAISA: Recommendation?

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Seeing none, then the Chair will offer a recommendation.

COUNCILMEMBER BAISA: Recommendation?

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: Recommendation?

CHAIR MOLINA: Thank you. Chair will make a recommendation that we file both correspondences dated May 6, 2009 and May 27th, 2009 related to the Tina Bass versus Maui County Police Department matter.

VICE-CHAIR MATEO: Move to file

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: Second.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. A motion has been made by Vice-Chair Mateo and seconded by Member Victorino to file both of the correspondence. Any discussion?

ITEM NO. 1(8): LITIGATION MATTERS (INDEMNIFICATION AUTHORIZATION: CHRISTOPHER GRINDLING V. SGT. ROY HIRAYAMA, ET AL.; CIVIL NO. CV05-00694 DAE BMK) (C.C. No. 09-14)

CHAIR MOLINA: The Committee is in receipt of a correspondence dated May 6th, 2009 from the Corporation Counsel's office, transmitting the following, one, a proposed resolution entitled: indemnifying Aaron Won in Christopher Grindling versus Sergeant Roy Hirayama, et al; Civil Number CV05-00694 DAE BMK; and a copy of the complaint. The complaint alleges personal injury, infliction of emotional distress, and violation of Plaintiff's constitutional rights. The purpose of the proposed resolution is to indemnify Aaron Won, a former police officer, in the case. And two, a copy of a correspondence dated November 19th, 2008 from the Chair of the Police Commission to the Chief of Police, informing that the Police Commission voted to approve legal representation for Mr. Won. And to give us an overview of this matter, Ms. Lutey?

MS. LUTEY: Thank you, Chairman. This, too, likewise, Council Members, is currently in active litigation. We're actually in a appeal state with this. All of the Federal claims that Mr. Grindling filed against the County and the individually named Defendants has been dismissed, and he is currently appealing that. But basically the same situation here--if

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you wanna ask questions more than just about the indemnification of Aaron Won, I'll need to ask for executive session to deal with that so that we don't hinder our litigation. The basic facts of this are that on June 4th, 2004, Christopher Grindling was arrested for assault in the second degree, which is a felony. He was taking. . . taken to the holding cell at Maui Police Department. When he was there. . . former Officer Aaron Won was also working, assigned to cell block. While he was in custody, the Plaintiff, Christopher Grindling, was agitated; urinated on the floor at the cell entrance; obstructed the surveillance cameras with wet toilet paper. And as a result of his actions, we moved him to an individual cell. While he was there, he began kicking the door that has a Plexiglas™ plate on it. And when it appeared as though he was going to separate that door from its frame, which would prevent anyone from getting in or out of that cell and also that he may have broken the Plexiglas™, he was taken to an individual. . .uh, sorry, he was taken to his bed and handcuffed down. At no time did Aaron Won strike the Plaintiff, although there are allegations against him. And the Police Commission has determined that Aaron Won is entitled to representation. I am requesting that Council indemnify Mr. Won.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Thank you, Ms. Lutey. And again, Committee Members, just as a reminder again, if you could confine your questions only to the indemnification of the County employee? And again the Corporation Counsel, if there is any type of settlement or movement in the future, they will have to come back to us. And at that point, we can ask. . .ask that you have your questions related to the case--other than the indemnification, those questions should be asked at that time. So, again, questions only for the indemnification of Mr. Won. Questions, Committee Members, for Ms. Lutey?

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: No.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Seeing none, all right, Chair will offer a recommendation.

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: Recommendation?

COUNCILMEMBER BAISA: Recommendation?

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Chair will recommend the indemnification. . .approving the indemnification of Aaron Won in the Christopher Grindling versus Sergeant Roy Hirayama matter.

VICE-CHAIR MATEO: So moved.

COUNCILMEMBER VICTORINO: Second, Chair.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay, moved by Vice-Chair Mateo, seconded by Member Victorino. Any discussion?

. . . Seeing none, all those in favor, signify by saying "aye".

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COUNCIL MEMBERS: Aye.

CHAIR MOLINA: All those opposed?

. . . Thank you. The Chair will mark it six "ayes" with three "excusals",--Members Johnson, Kaho'ohalahala, and Medeiros.

**ITEM NO. 1(9): LITIGATION MATTERS (PROPOSED SETTLEMENT:
DESIREE ALVARADO V. COUNTY OF MAUI; CIVIL NO. 05-1-0250(1))
(C.C. No. 09-14)**

CHAIR MOLINA: The Committee is in receipt of a correspondence dated June 1st, 2009 from the Department of the Corporation Counsel, requesting consideration of a proposed resolution entitled: authorizing settlement of Desiree Alvarado versus County of Maui, et al., Civil Number 05-1-0250(1); and transmitting a copy of the complaint. The complaint alleges that the Plaintiff sustained injuries as a result of the negligent operation of a grass-cutting machine by a County employee on July 3rd, 2003. The purpose of the proposed resolution is to authorize settlement of the case. And to give us an overview of this matter, we have Corporation Counsel Martin.

MS. MARTIN: Thank you, Chairman Molina. On July 1st, 2003, Desiree Alvarado was walking on Haiku Road towards Fukushima Store. While walking, she encountered County workers who were cutting brush alongside the road. Ms. Alvarado alleges she was injured by a rock which was thrown from the equipment. This case is currently pending, and therefore I am requesting executive session in order to discuss this matter further.

CHAIR MOLINA: Okay. Thank you, Ms. Martin. Members, any questions in open session for Ms. Martin related to this matter?
