COMMERCIAL SIGNS

DESCRIPTION:

The Committee is in receipt of the following:

1. County Communication No. 10-187, from Councilmember Sol P. Kaho'ohalahala, relating to proposed amendments to Chapter 16.13, Maui County Code, regarding commercial signs.
2. Correspondence dated August 27, 2010, from the Council Chair, transmitting correspondence dated August 27, 2010, from Councilmember Sol P. Kaho'ohalahala, transmitting a draft bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 16.13, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO COMMERCIAL SIGNS". The purposes of the draft bill are to: (a) amend the definition of "Information sign" to include signage identifying a business establishment's product or service; (b) allow up to two signs identifying a product or service per business establishment; and (c) allow up to six square feet combined per business establishment

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for signs identifying a product or service within a multi-tenant building, up to four square feet combined per business establishment for all other information signs within a multi-tenant building, and up to ten square feet combined per single business building.

3. Correspondence dated September 2, 2010, from the Council Chair, transmitting correspondence dated September 1, 2010, from the Planning Director, relating to sign enforcement.

STATUS: The Committee may consider whether to recommend passage of the draft bill on first reading, with or without revisions. The Committee may also consider the filing of County Communication No. 10-187 and other related action.

GENERAL PLAN UPDATE (MAUI ISLAND PLAN)

DESCRIPTION:

The Committee is in receipt of the following:

1. Correspondence dated October 16, 2009, from Council Chair Danny A. Mateo, transmitting the draft Maui Island Plan and the related recommendations of the Planning Director, the Maui General Plan Advisory Committee, and the Maui Planning Commission, submitted by the Department of Planning pursuant to Chapter 2.80B, Maui County Code.
2. Correspondence dated December 10, 2009, from the Planning Director, transmitting a document entitled "Maui Island Plan; General Plan 2030; DRAFT" (the consolidated draft Maui Island Plan), relating to the following components:
 - Introduction (and other prefatory documents)
 - Chapter 1 (Population)
 - Chapter 2 (Heritage Resources)
 - Chapter 3 (Natural Hazards)
 - Chapter 4 (Economic Development)
 - Chapter 5 (Housing)
 - Chapter 6 (Infrastructure and Public Facilities)
 - Chapter 7 (Land Use)
 - Chapter 8 (Directed Growth Plan)
 - Chapter 9 (Long Range Implementation Plan)
 - Chapter 10 (Monitoring & Evaluation)
 - Appendices (and other resource documents)
3. Correspondence dated December 14, 2009, from the Planning Director, transmitting a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 2.80B.030, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO THE MAUI ISLAND PLAN". The purpose of the proposed bill is to adopt the Maui Island Plan, pursuant to Chapter 2.80B, Maui County Code, including the following elements: an island-wide land use strategy, a Water Element, a Nearshore Ecosystem Element, an Implementation Program, and Milestones. The proposed bill's Exhibit B is to be the consolidated draft Maui Island Plan, subject to revisions recommended by the Planning Committee.
4. Correspondence dated May 18, 2010, from the Planning Director, transmitting supplemental portions of the draft Maui Island Plan, including Chapter 6 (Infrastructure and Public Facilities).
5. Matrices listing the recommendations of the Planning Director, the Maui Planning Commission, and the Maui General Plan Advisory Committee with respect to the objectives, goals, policies, and implementing actions that correspond to the text of Chapters 1-6 of the consolidated draft Maui Island Plan. The matrices are available on the Planning Committee website and are used to facilitate the Committee's deliberations.

STATUS: The Committee may review, revise, and recommend approval of the following components of the consolidated draft Maui Island Plan: Introduction (and other prefatory documents), Chapter 1 (Population), Chapter 2 (Heritage Resources), Chapter 3 (Natural Hazards), Chapter 4 (Economic Development), Chapter 5 (Housing), and Chapter 6 (Infrastructure and Public Facilities). Other components will not be considered. The Committee has completed its initial review of the matrices for Chapters 1-4. In addition, the Committee has completed its initial review of lines 574-830 of the matrix for Chapter 6. The Committee will begin its deliberations at line 831 of the matrix for

Chapter 6. Upon completion of its initial review of Chapter 6, the Committee will begin its review of Chapter 5 (previously deferred).

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
