**DISPARITY OF REAL PROPERTY ASSESSMENTS FOR AGRICULTURAL VERSUS NON-AGRICULTURAL LANDS**

**DESCRIPTION:**

The Committee is in receipt of the following:

1. County Communication No. 11-227, from Councilmember Mike White, regarding the matter relating to the disparity of real property assessments for agricultural versus non-agricultural lands, including the matter of an investigative group as permitted under Section 92-2.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes.
2. Correspondence dated September 27, 2011, from Councilmember Mike White, relating to a proposal to establish a temporary investigative group to make findings and recommendations on policies relating to real property assessments of agricultural and non-agricultural lands.

**STATUS:**
