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## SHORT-TERM RENTAL HOMES

### DESCRIPTION:

The Committee is in receipt of the following:

1. County Communication 11-70, from Councilmember Gladys C. Baisa, transmitting a proposed resolution to refer to the planning commissions a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE 19, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO SHORT-TERM RENTAL HOMES". The purpose of the proposed bill is to permit short-term rental homes in certain areas, subject to appropriate restrictions and standards.
2. Correspondence dated August 23, 2011, from the Planning Director, transmitting comments from the planning commissions and the Hana Advisory Committee in response to Resolution 11-24 entitled "REFERRING TO THE LANAI, MAUI, AND MOLOKAI PLANNING

COMMISSIONS A DRAFT BILL AMENDING TITLE 19, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO SHORT-TERM RENTAL HOMES”, adopted on March 18, 2011.

3. Correspondence dated September 19, 2011, from the Planning Director, transmitting the following:
  - a. Summary of a community meeting held in Hana on September 8, 2011, to discuss the proposed bill and other issues relating to short-term rentals.
  - b. Summary of a Maui Planning Commission meeting held on August 23, 2011, to discuss the proposed bill and other issues relating to short-term rentals, including a proposed amendment to the draft bill to establish a “rebuttable presumption” that the advertisement of short-term rental operations means such operations are occurring.

**STATUS:**

The Committee may consider whether to recommend passage of the proposed bill on first reading, with or without revisions. The Committee may also consider the filing of County Communication 11-70 and other related action.

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
