ORAL OR WRITTEN TESTIMONY on any agenda item will be accepted. Each testifier shall be allowed to speak for three minutes on each item. If additional time is requested, the testifier shall be allowed one minute to conclude the testimony on the item. These time limits may be modified pursuant to the Rules of the Council, provided a modification would apply equally to all testifiers and all items. No further oral testimony by the testifier on the item shall be permitted. An individual's request to testify shall be deemed withdrawn if the individual does not answer when called to testify. To ensure its distribution prior to the meeting, written testimony must be received in the Office of Council Services at least 24 hours prior to the meeting; provided, that if a meeting will be held on a Monday, written testimony shall be received by 12:00 noon on the business day preceding the meeting. If written testimony is submitted at the meeting, 16 copies are requested to ensure distribution at the meeting.

UPCOUNTRY WATER METER ISSUANCE

DESCRIPTION:

The Committee is in receipt of the following:

1. County Communication 12-97, from Councilmember Victorino, relating to water meter issuance for the Upcountry area.
2. County Communication 12-216, from the Director of Water Supply, transmitting a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO WATER METER ISSUANCE PROVISIONS FOR THE UPCOUNTRY WATER SYSTEM". The purposes of the proposed bill are to (1) require the Department of Water Supply to stop accepting applications for new or additional water service from the Upcountry Water System as of a date to be determined by the

Council; and (2) ensure that no water meter will be issued to an applicant who is not on the Upcountry Water Meter Priority List ("Priority List") as of a date to be determined by the Council until all applicants on the Priority List have accepted water service or been removed from the Priority List.

STATUS: The Committee may consider whether to recommend passage of the proposed bill on first reading, with or without revisions. The Committee may also consider the filing of County Communications 12-97 and 12-216, and other related action.

WATER USAGE DURING WATER SHORTAGE DECLARATION

DESCRIPTION: The Committee is in receipt of County Communication 12-217, from the Director of Water Supply, transmitting a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 14.06, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO DECLARATION OF WATER SHORTAGES". The purposes of the proposed bill are to (1) authorize the Director of Water Supply, with the approval of the Mayor, to declare water shortages when the water supply becomes inadequate in any area of the County; (2) establish stages of a water shortage based on the severity of the shortage; and (3) clarify the Director's authority to control water usage during a water shortage, including the application of water shortage rates.

STATUS: The Committee may consider whether to recommend passage of the proposed bill on first reading, with or without revisions. The Committee may also consider the filing of County Communication 12-217 and other related action.
