Your Policy and Intergovernmental Affairs Committee, having met on June 29, 2015, makes reference to County Communication 15-169, from the Chief of Police, transmitting a proposed resolution entitled "AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE OF A DONATION OF A MORPHOTRAK LIVESCAN MACHINE REPLACEMENT FOR THE KIHEI POLICE STATION FROM THE HAWAII CRIMINAL JUSTICE DATA CENTER TO THE COUNTY OF MAUI, DEPARTMENT OF POLICE, PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 3.56, MAUI COUNTY CODE."

The purpose of the proposed resolution is to authorize the acceptance of a MorphoTrak LiveScan digital fingerprinting, photographing, and imaging machine, valued at \$25,586.38, from the Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center to the Department of Police, for use at the Kihei Police Station.

Your Committee notes Section 3.56.030, Maui County Code, requires Council approval of any gift or donation by resolution.

A Police Lieutenant stated the machine produces digital fingerprints, photographs, and other images, including during booking of arrestees, and will replace the Kihei Police Station's aging LiveScan machine.

Your Committee voted 9-0 to recommend adoption of the proposed resolution and filing of the communication. Committee Chair Victorino, Vice-Chair Couch, and members Baisa, Carroll, Cochran, Crivello, Guzman, Hokama, and White voted "aye."

Dear *Chief* Faaumu:

The Hawaii Criminal Justice Data Center (HCJDC) has been awarded Federal grant funding from the Justice Assistance Grant Program (JAG) to purchase one replacement livescan for the Maui County Police Department (MPD). With your concurrence, we would like to replace the livescan at the Kihei Station. This new livescan will be able to capture the entire palm print image including the upper palm portion which the older livescan is unable to do. Being able to submit the entire palm print image will enable the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) to accept our palm print images and add them to the national database for latent searching.

Once this livescan is purchased, delivered and installed, there will be one year of warranty on the livescan. The maintenance cost for this livescan will be \$4,154.00 starting 1 year after the installation date, which is a cost savings to MPD as you are currently paying \$9,502.21 in annual maintenance for the existing livescan. The State vendor, MorphoTrak, will contact MPD to establish the maintenance contract for the newly installed livescan.
