Chair and Members:

Your Infrastructure and Environmental Management Committee, having met on September 12, 2016, makes reference to County Communication 16-187, from the Director of Public Works, transmitting a proposed bill entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 10.60.042, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO CROSSWALKS ESTABLISHED."

The purpose of the proposed bill is to establish a mid-block crosswalk fronting Kihei Holiday Resort, located at 483 South Kihei Road, approximately 1,525 feet south of Ohukai Road, Kihei, Maui, Hawaii.

Your Committee noted the Public Works Commission unanimously recommended approval of the proposed bill at its meeting of December 16, 2015.

The Director of Public Works said the crosswalk request was prompted by residents and visitors of Kihei Holiday Resort and other neighboring condominiums who use the beach access across the street. Establishing a crosswalk in this area would provide a safe way for individuals to cross South Kihei Road. Your Committee noted the nearest crosswalks are located approximately seven hundred feet away on the north and south sides of Kihei Holiday Resort.

Your Committee agreed the crosswalk will address safety issues for pedestrians traversing South Kihei Road. However, your Committee voiced concerns over potential liability to the County since the beach access is located on State property.

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Your Committee requested the State Department of Land and Natural Resources and an organization in South Maui that handles coastal dune restoration be contacted to confirm maintenance responsibility for the beach access, and to determine whether there may be changes to its location in the future.

The Director said signage will be placed on South Kihei Road to notify motorists of the crosswalk once it is installed. Department staff will need to evaluate site-specific data relating to road traffic and the number of pedestrians using the crosswalk to determine whether flashing devices are warranted.

Your Committee is in receipt of a revised proposed bill, approved as to form and legality by the Department of the Corporation Counsel, incorporating nonsubstantive revisions.

Your Committee voted 6-0 to recommend passage of the revised proposed bill on first reading and filing of the communication. Committee Chair Cochran, and members Baisa, Carroll, Crivello, Guzman, and White voted "aye." Committee Vice-Chair Hokama was excused.

Your Infrastructure and Environmental Management Committee **RECOMMENDS** the following:

1. That Bill _____ (2016), as revised herein and attached hereto, entitled "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 10.60.042, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO CROSSWALKS ESTABLISHED," be **PASSED ON FIRST READING** and be **ORDERED TO PRINT**; and
2. That County Communication 16-187 be **FILED**.

A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 10.60.042,
MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO CROSSWALKS ESTABLISHED

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI:

SECTION 1. Section 10.60.042, Maui County Code, is amended by
amending subsection A to read as follows:

“A. Wailuku district. Pedestrian crosswalks are established
in the Wailuku district at the following locations:

1. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion
of Lower Main Street in Wailuku, the center line of the
crosswalk being three hundred feet southwest of the
prolongation of the south curblane of Hoomana Street across
Lower Main Street.

2. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion
across Nakoa Drive in Wailuku, along the prolongation of the
southerly shoulder of Kainani Street.

3. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion
of Puunene Avenue in Kahului, between the northern end of
[H.C.&S.] Hawaiian Commercial & Sugar Company garage
and [the H.C.&S. Co.] automotive maintenance repair shop at
Puunene.

4. Not less than ten feet in width on that portion
across Mill Street in Wailuku, approximately two hundred
ninety feet east of the junction of Mill Street and Halewili
Drive.

5. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion
of South Kihei Road in Kihei, near power pole number 187 of
Maui Electric Company, approximately one thousand two
hundred feet north of the junction of South Kihei Road and
Kilohana Drive.

6. Not less than ten feet on that portion of South
Kihei Road across Kalama Park in Kihei, the center line of the
crosswalk being opposite power pole number 149 of Maui
Electric Company.

7. Not less than eight feet in width on that portion of Wells Street in Wailuku, approximately one hundred eighty feet from High Street, in line with the walkway leading to the State ~~[Building;]~~ building.

8. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, near utility pole number 97, approximately two hundred feet north of Uwapo Road.

9. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, on the south side of the intersection of South Kihei Road and Wailana Place.

10. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, near Kaonoulou Street fronting the old Maui Lu Resort.

11. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, near utility pole number 146 fronting Kalama Park.

12. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, near utility pole number 150A fronting Kalama Park.

13. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, across Kamaole Beach Park [number one] I.

14. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, near utility pole number 176A fronting Kamaole Beach Park [number two] II.

15. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of Lipoa Street in Kihei, west [(Makai)] of the entrance to Kihei Elementary School.

16. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of South Papa Avenue in Kahului, approximately one hundred feet from the Kihei side of the entrance to Lihikai Elementary School.

17. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of South Papa Avenue in Kahului, approximately seventy-five feet from the Waihee side of the exit to Lihikai Elementary School.

18. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of Maalo Street in Kahului, approximately two hundred eighty feet east of South Papa Avenue.

19. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of Kaohu Street in Wailuku, along the westerly prolongation of the shoulder area of Kiele Street.

20. Not less than eight feet in width on that portion of Kaohu Street in Wailuku, four hundred fifty feet west of Waiale Road.

21. On that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, fronting Kai Makani Beach Villas, approximately eight hundred feet south of Ohukai Road.

22. Not less than ten feet in width on that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, fronting Kamaole Beach Park [number two] II and approximately seven hundred feet north of Keonekai Road.

23. Not less than ten feet in width on that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, six hundred twenty feet south of the centerline of Keonekai Road.

24. Not less than ten feet on that portion of Lower Main Street in Wailuku, fronting Hale Makua, approximately six hundred twenty-five feet southwest from the edge of Mill Street.

25. Not less than ten feet on that portion of Lower Main Street in Wailuku, fronting St. Anthony Grade School, approximately seven hundred ten feet southwest from the edge of Mill Street.

26. Not less than ten feet on that portion of Lower Main Street in Wailuku, fronting St. Anthony Junior-Senior High School football field, approximately three hundred seventy-five feet northwest from the edge of Mission Street.

27. Not less than twelve feet in width on that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, approximately one thousand three hundred feet south of the intersection of Alanui Ke Alii and South Kihei Road.

28. On that portion of South Kihei Road in Kihei, fronting Mana Kai Maui Resort, approximately four hundred feet south of the intersection of Ala Koa Street and South Kihei Road.

29. On that portion of Kanani Road in Kihei, approximately four hundred fifty feet east of South Kihei Road.

30. On the portion of Lower Main Street in Wailuku, approximately four hundred feet north of Mill Street.

31. On that portion of South Kihei Road, approximately one thousand five hundred twenty-five feet south of Ohukai Road."

SECTION 2. Material to be repealed is bracketed. New material is underscored. In printing this bill, the County Clerk need not include the brackets, the bracketed material, or the underscoring.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon its approval.
