2. Parks and Recreation – concerns regarding the Department of Parks and Recreation accessibility equipment such as the condition of pool hooyer lifts and other equipment
 3. Housing – concerns regarding HUD vouchers and the need for HUD voucher extensions; concerns regarding the lack of affordable housing and housing for HUD recipients; possibility of getting “tiny” houses in Maui; need of auxiliary aids for deaf and hard of hearing people living in HUD housing; need of ADA compliant accessible housing units in Maui County
 4. Communication – need for visual auxiliary aids; need for flashing lights near the Fire Departments and the Police Departments; concerns that the blue lights on police cars are not very visible; need for individual supports such as cards that say “I am Deaf” to be able to show to police when needed

 6. County facilities – On Lanai, accessibility to County restrooms is limited because they are locked during public usage time
