LITIGATION MATTERS (SPECIAL COUNSEL ADDITIONAL COMPENSATION: HARRY DONENFELD V. COUNTY OF MAUI, ET AL.; CIVIL 16-00381 DKW-KJM) (PRL-1(24))

<u>Description:</u> The Committee is in receipt of the following:

- 1. Correspondence dated September 12, 2017, from the Department of the Corporation Counsel, requesting consideration of a proposed resolution to authorize an increase in compensation for special counsel Kobayashi Sugita & Goda, LLP by \$75,000 for trial preparation and trial of the case, for a total compensation not to exceed \$150,000, and transmitting a copy of the complaint. The First Amended Complaint alleges Harry Donenfeld was terminated as the Maui County Film Commissioner in violation of his due process rights under the United States and Hawaii Constitutions, breach of contract, defamation, and violations of statutory privacy interests, among other things.
- 2. Correspondence dated January 9, 2018, from the Department of the proposed Corporation Counsel. transmitting a revised resolution entitled "AUTHORIZING ΑN **INCREASE** IN COMPENSATION **SPECIAL** RELATED TO THE **EMPLOYMENT** OF COUNSEL KOBAYASHI SUGITA & GODA, LLP IN HARRY DONENFELD v. COUNTY OF MAUI, ET AL., USDC CIVIL NO. 16-00381 DKW-KJM." The purpose of the revised proposed resolution is to authorize an increase in compensation for special counsel Kobayashi Sugita & Goda, LLP by \$21,815.33 for payment of special counsel's final billing

for the case, for a total compensation not exceeding \$96,815.33.

<u>Status:</u> The Committee may consider whether to recommend adoption of the revised proposed resolution, with or without further revisions. The Committee may also consider the filing of the correspondence and other related action.

Description: The Committee is in receipt of the following:

- Correspondence dated January 9, 2015, from the Department of the Corporation Counsel, requesting the opportunity to provide a status update on <u>Ocean Resort Villas Vacation Owners Association</u>, et al. v. <u>County of Maui</u>, et al., Civil 13-1-0848(2), and transmitting a copy of the First Amended Complaint filed on August 28, 2014.
- 2. Correspondence dated November 4, 2016, from the Department of the Corporation Counsel, requesting the opportunity to provide a status update on Ocean Resort Villas Vacation Owners Association, et al. v. County of Maui, et al., Civil 13-1-0848(2). The Second Amended Complaint, filed on August 12, 2016, alleges violations of the Due Process and Equal Protection Clauses of the United States and Hawaii Constitutions, and violations of Chapter 92, Part I, Hawaii Revised Statutes, known as the "Sunshine Law," in the determination of the timeshare real property tax rates for the County for Fiscal Years 2014 and 2015, and amended assessments issued for tax years 2006, 2007, and 2008.
- 3. Correspondence dated January 9, 2018, from the Department of the Corporation Counsel, requesting the opportunity to provide a status update on the case.

<u>Status:</u> The Committee may receive a status update on the case from the Department of the Corporation Counsel. No legislative action will be taken.
