At about 11:17 p.m., while standing in the 2 shared parking lot of the Dog & Duck Irish Pub, located at 3 1913-N South Kihei Road, Kihei, Maui, Hawaii, Liquor 4 Control Officer Cullen Kawano observed a male patron 5 standing on the front deck area fronting the Dog & Duck 6 Irish Pub vaping, which is a term used to describe smoking from an electronic cigarette. The male patron took three 8 9 large puffs within a few minutes, while standing less than five feet from an employee of the Dog & Duck Irish Pub. 10 The employee did nothing to stop the male patron from 11 12 smoking from the electronic cigarette.

At about 11:28, Liquor Control Officer Kawano entered the Dog & Duck Irish Pub premises, which was very full. Officer Kawano found it difficult to walk throughout the premises due to the large crowd. Numerous patrons were observed to be blocking the entrance, aisles and walkways. Additionally, Officer Kawano observed patrons dancing within areas of the premises which were outside of the approved dance floor area with many patrons holding drinks while dancing. There was, also, a male patron with a drink standing next to the female deejay within the entertainment area. The dance floor was not clearly defined.

At about 11:55, Officer Molina observed a female

1 standing by one of the picnic tables take a sip from a 2 glass of beer. The female appeared unsteady on her feet. After that, Officer Molina observed a female server, Hali Jo Thoma, serve the female patron a glass of beer. female patron took a sip of the beer and placed it on the 5 table. Later, the female patron walked over to the back exit door, opened the door and motioned for a male patron to come over to where the female patron was standing. Liquor Control Officers observed that there was no 9 security personnel or anyone else controlling the access 10 via the rear exit to the Dog & Duck Irish Pub. After the 11 12 male patron entered through the back exit, Liquor Control 13 Officers noted that he was unsteady on his feet, had a red flushed face, watery eyes, swayed from side to side, and 14 15 was leaning on the female patron for support. After checking to see if the patrons were okay, a bouncer 16 17 approached the couple and said something inaudible to 18 them, and then motioned them to exit through the back door. 19 20 Maui Police Sergeant David Leffler saw the 21 couple staggering about and around in the back parking lot 22 of the Kihei Kalama Village behind the Dog & Duck Irish 23 Pub. According to Sergeant Leffler, the couple were both 24 intoxicated. The male companion was unable to stand on 25 his own and was being supported by the female. When asked

1 if they had a ride home, they responded that they had called Uber. However, when the Uber ride came, the Uber 2 driver refused to give them a ride home due to their intoxication. Further, Sergeant Leffler called a taxi for the 5 couple; however, the couple mistakenly entered a white 6 7 vehicle driven by a female, when they thought that the vehicle was their taxi. A few minutes later, the actual 8 9 taxicab arrived and drove the couple to their hotel. Through the investigation, it was revealed that 10 the female had been drinking somewhere else prior to going 11 to the Dog & Duck Irish Pub. Once at the Irish -- Dog & 12 13 Duck Irish Pub, the female was served two Guinness beers. 14 According to server Hali Jo Thoma, the female patron did 15 not appear to be intoxicated when she was served the 16 beers -- when she served the beers to the female, but did 17 notice that the female had been drinking somewhere else prior to coming to the Dog & Duck Irish Pub. 18 19 Nothing further. Thank you, Chair. 2.0 CHAIR FUJII: Thank you, Mr. Hanano. Are there 21 any questions regarding the report as submitted by the 22 prosecutor, anyone? If not, we'll move on. It says under the 2 3 influence of liquor means that the person concerned has consumed intoxicating liquor sufficient to impair, at the particular time under inquiry, the person's normal mental 5 faculties or ability to care for oneself and quard against 7 casualty, or sufficient to substantially impair, at the time under inquiry, that the clearness of intellect and 8 control of oneself which the person would otherwise 9 normally possess. So that's the definition of under the 10 influence of liquor. 11 The charge in this case, also, includes drugs. 12 13 So it doesn't matter whether you're under the influence of liquor and/or drugs, you know, one or both. If you're 14 under the influence to the point where -- in fact, there's 15 16 a similar definition for under the influence of drugs 17 right above that, but it's the same -- pretty much the same thing. And, basically, you know, if you're -- if you 18 19 can't, basically, care for yourself and guard against 2.0 casualty, for instance, like driving a vehicle, then, 21 under the law, you're under the influence. And so that's 22 the definition that we go under when, you know, you don't 23 have a test. 24 In OUI, if you're .08 or over, you're 25 automatically per se, you know, under the influence. But

There's been one prior for the 11 same offense in December of 2009, which is outside, you 12 know, the five-year period that we normally look at. 13 14 addition, they had two prior convictions for serving 15 liquor to a minor; one in 2013 and another in 2017. 16 have, also, had previously been issued several written 17 cautions involving similar type of offenses or same offenses that we've been listening to today involving 18 19 congested aisles and walkways and consuming liquor on the dance floor and others. 2.0 21 So looking at the facts of this case as well as 22 considering the prior history of this licensee and the 23 fact, you know, that they're accepting responsibility, we 24 are recommending the following: In Count 1, \$2,000 fine; 25 Count 2, \$500 fine; Count 3, 500; Count 4, 500; Count 5,
