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NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held by the Council of the County of Maui, State of Hawaii, on Friday, April 17, 2020, beginning at 9:00 a.m., or soon thereafter, via BlueJeans link <https://maui.bluejeans.com/295235670> for the purpose of receiving testimony on the following:

1. RESOLUTION NO. 20-59, entitled "PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO SECTION 9-20 OF THE REVISED CHARTER OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI (1983), AS AMENDED, RELATING TO THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING FUND".

The purpose of this resolution is to place on the next General Election ballot the question of whether Section 9-20 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended, shall be amended, effective July 1, 2021, to require an increase in the minimum annual appropriation to the Affordable Housing Fund from 2 percent of certified real property tax revenues to 3 percent, and that the appropriation remain in perpetuity.

2. RESOLUTION NO. 20-60, entitled "PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE REVISED CHARTER OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI (1983), AS AMENDED, TO REORGANIZE THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH TO ESTABLISH AN OFFICE OF THE MANAGING DIRECTOR AND PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF THE MANAGING DIRECTOR AS THE COUNTY'S CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER".

The purpose of this resolution is to place on the next General Election ballot the question of whether the Charter should be amended to reorganize the executive branch to promote professionalism in the management of the County by 1) establishing an Office of the Managing Director, where a Managing Director would be hired by the Mayor through a recruitment and selection process involving an ad hoc committee comprised of the Mayor, Council Chair, and a three-member citizen group; 2) allowing the Managing Director to function as the County's chief operating officer responsible for daily operations, the appointment and removal of most department heads, and the implementation of County

policy; 3) making the Mayor the County's chief executive officer responsible for supervising the managing director's work, representing the County in intergovernmental affairs, having the authority to approve or veto bills, nominating board and commission members, and enforcing provisions of the Charter, County ordinances, and all applicable laws; and 4) authorizing various housekeeping revisions.

The proposed resolutions may be examined between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., by appointment, on regular business days in the Office of the County Clerk, County of Maui, 7<sup>th</sup> Floor, Kalana O Maui Building, 200 South High Street, Wailuku, Maui, Hawaii, and online at <https://mauicounty.legistar.com>.

"Board Packets", as defined in Section 92-7.5 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, are available for inspection at the Office of the County Clerk, between 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m., by appointment, on regular business days. "Board Packets" are also available electronically as soon as practicable upon request.



If the connection between any testifier and the videoconference is lost, the public hearing will still continue. Members of the public interested in information about offering testimony at the public hearing may contact the Office of the County Clerk (808-270-7748) prior to the public hearing.

Each testifier shall be allowed to speak for up to three minutes. If approved by the presiding officer and announced prior to any oral testimony being taken, the testifier may be allowed one minute to conclude their testimony. No further oral testimony by the testifier shall be permitted. An individual's request to testify may be deemed withdrawn if the individual does not answer when called to testify.
