I'm submitting written testimony for the 06/24/20 Public Works Commission meeting agenda item C.1. to rename Kaka'alaneo Drive for the Honokowai Subdivision (<https://www.mauicounty.gov/ArchiveCenter/ViewFile/Item/27404>).

My name is Chad Fukunaga, I represent the land owner of the subject roadway, and I'm the applicant for this action. I'm providing testimony to explain our request for Street Naming Application, and to amend our application. We believe the street name "Kaka'alaneo Drive" was originally assigned in error to what should have been two separate roadways. We submitted our Street Naming Application to recognize Kaka'alaneo as two separate roadways and to rename each section of roadway. Upon further consultation with Roselle Bailey, we would like to amend our application to separate the roadway but keep the name "Kaka'alaneo Drive", and rename the other roadway section as "Nani 'Ikena Street". 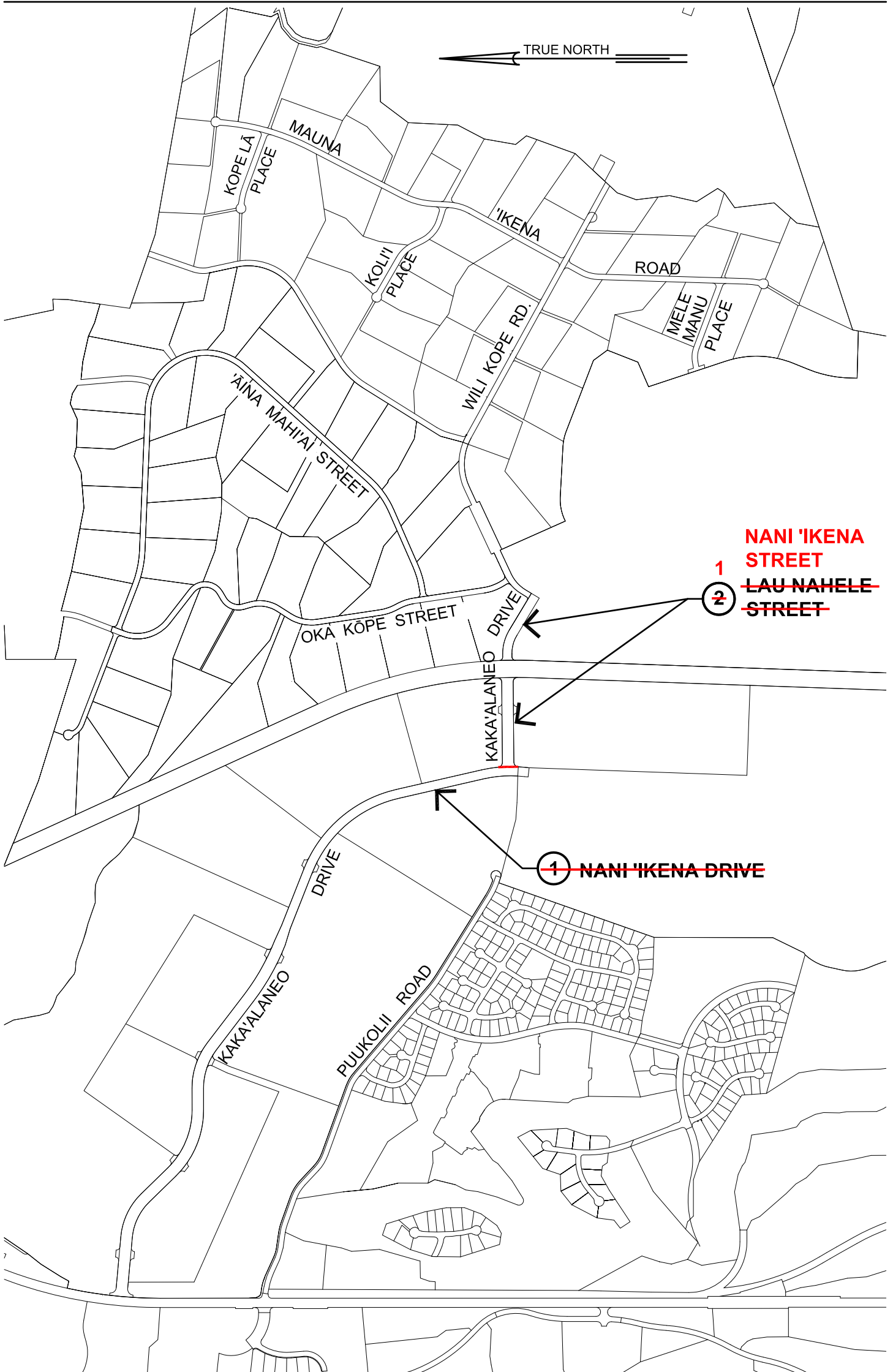

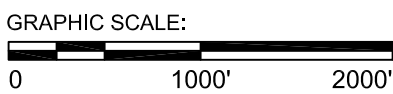

Honorable Commission Members:

I am the Project Manager for the Makali‘i at Wailea project, which is located in Wailea at the intersection of Wailea Alanui Drive and Kaukahi Street. The project sits upon the sloping property mauka of the Fairmont Kea Lani Hotel.

The Makali‘i project is a new community of 68 open plan townhomes that step gently along the hillside. The homes incorporate a character and style inspired in part by the best of the Mid-Century Modern and Early Hawaiian Statehood Style and new energy-efficient technology and design, including soaring floor-to-ceiling windows and skylights for natural light and views, generous indoor/outdoor living spaces, and a layout that captures the prevailing winds for natural cooling, and energy-efficient and renewable energy technology.

The design and feeling projected by Makali‘i is one of exploration, adventure, and setting a new direction for living in Wailea. Below are a few renderings that show the adventurous and nautical feel of the Makali‘i homes. After visiting the property a number of times and reviewing the design and spirit of the project, our cultural adviser, Kimokeo Kapahulehua, chose the name “Makali‘i,” which is the Hawaiian name for the Pleiades Constellation. He explained that the Hawaiian people used Makali‘i as an important navigational celestial landmark.

In keeping with exploration, adventure, and navigating the open ocean by looking to the stars, we would like to name the private road that runs through the Makali‘i project “Holomoana Drive.” As set forth in our application, “Holomoana” means seaman, seafarer, to sail on the sea.
