NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a public hearing will be held by the Council of the County of Maui, State of Hawaii, on Friday, July 24, 2020, beginning at 9:00 a.m., or soon thereafter, via BlueJeans link <https://maui.bluejeans.com/295235670> for the purpose of receiving testimony on the following:

1. RESOLUTION NO. 20-98, entitled "PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE REVISED CHARTER OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI (1983), AS AMENDED, TO ESTABLISH STRICTER TERM LIMITS FOR COUNCIL MEMBERS".

The purpose of this resolution is to place on the next General Election ballot the question of whether the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended, should be amended, effective January 2, 2021, to establish stricter term limits for Councilmembers by limiting the number of terms a person may serve as a Councilmember to five full two-year terms.

2. RESOLUTION NO. 20-99, entitled "PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE REVISED CHARTER OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI (1983), AS AMENDED, RELATING TO CONFLICTING INTERPRETATIONS OF THE CHARTER".

The purpose of this resolution is to place on the next General Election ballot the question of whether the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended, should be amended, effective January 2, 2021, to establish standards for interpreting and complying with the Charter, including by requiring a viable judicial action to be filed within 30 days to seek clarity when a conflict in the interpretation of the Charter is identified.

3. RESOLUTION NO. 20-100, entitled "PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE REVISED CHARTER OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI (1983), AS AMENDED, RELATING TO CHARTER COMMISSION".

The purpose of this resolution is to place on the next General Election ballot the question of whether Section 14-3 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui

(1983), as amended, should be amended, effective January 2, 2021, to authorize the Council to appoint nine members and the Mayor to appoint two members of the 11-member Charter Commission, which is required to study and review the operation of the County government.

4. RESOLUTION NO. 20-101, entitled "PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE REVISED CHARTER OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI (1983), AS AMENDED, TO ESTABLISH STRICTER TERM LIMITS FOR THE MAYOR".

The purpose of this resolution is to place on the next General Election ballot the question of whether Section 7-2 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended, should be amended, effective January 2, 2021, to establish stricter term limits for the Mayor by limiting the number of terms a person may serve as Mayor to two full four-year terms.

5. RESOLUTION NO. 20-102, entitled "PROPOSING AN AMENDMENT TO THE REVISED CHARTER OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI (1983), AS AMENDED, RELATING TO ESTABLISHING A DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE".

The purpose of this resolution is to place on the next General Election ballot the question of whether Article 8 of the Revised Charter of the County of Maui (1983), as amended, should be amended, effective July 1, 2022, to establish a Department of Agriculture to provide advocacy, and not create additional regulatory barriers, on all matters related to agriculture.

"Board Packets", as defined in Section 92-7.5 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, are available for inspection at the Office of the County Clerk, 200 South High Street, Wailuku, Hawaii. "Board Packets" are also available electronically as soon as practicable upon request.

If the connection between any testifier and the videoconference is lost, the public hearing will still continue. Members of the public interested in information about offering testimony at the public hearing may contact the Office of the County Clerk (808-270-7748) prior to the public hearing.

Each testifier shall be allowed to speak for up to three minutes. If approved by the presiding officer and announced prior to any oral testimony being taken, the testifier may be allowed one minute to conclude their testimony. No further oral testimony by the testifier shall be permitted. An individual's request to testify may be deemed withdrawn if the individual does not answer when called to testify.

To ensure its distribution prior to the public hearing, written testimony must be received, e-mailed (county.clerk@mauicounty.us), or faxed (808-270-7171) to the Office of the County Clerk at least 24 hours prior to the public hearing.
