[GAVEL] . WILL THE MAUI COUNTY COUNCIL REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING OF AUGUST 5TH, 2022, PLEASE COME TO ORDER. ALOHA AND GOOD MORNING EVERYONE. THE MORNING GREETING IS FROM BELGIUM, GERMANY AND IT IS SALUT. SO STARTING WITH ROLL CALL, MR. CLERK. >> CHAIR, PROCEEDING WITH ROLL CALL, MEMBERS PARTICIPATING FROM NON-PUBLIC LOCATION STATE WHO, IF ANYONE IS PRESENT WITH THEM AS PART OF ROLL CALL. COUNCIL MEMBER SHANE SINENCI?\r\n\r\n>> SALUT, CHAIR AND ALOHA KAKAHIKA KAKOU, MAI MAUI AKINA. FOR THE RECORD, THIS MORNING WE'RE BROADCASTING FROM OUR COURTESY SITE IN EAST MAUI AT THE HANA CULTURE CENTER AND MUSEUM, AND CURRENTLY I'M HERE WITH MY DISTRICT STAFF AND THERE ARE NO PERSONS HERE TO TESTIFY AT THE MOMENT. >> THANK YOU. >> COUNCIL MEMBER MIKE MOLINA. >> EXCUSED . MR. CLERK, ARE YOU IN A TUNNEL OR SOMETHING? >> NO, CHAIR.\r\n\r\nJUST SET UP IN THE MAYOR'S LOUNGE. >> OH, THE MAYOR'S LOUNGE, OKAY. THANKS. PROCEED. >> COUNCIL MEMBER KELLY TAKAYA KING. >> EXCUSED. >> COUNCIL MEMBER GABE JOHNSON.\r\n\r\n>> GOOD MORNING, CHAIR. COUNCIL MEMBERS, COMMUNITY MEMBERS, SALUT TO ALL OF YOU. THERE ARE NO TESTIFIERS AT THE DISTRICT OFFICE AND I'M HERE TO MAKE, GOOD NECESSARY, TROUBLE, LIKE MY DOG. THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> COUNCIL MEMBER TAMARA PALTIN. >> SALUT AND ALOHA KAKAHIKA KAKOU AND BROADCASTING LIVE AND DIRECT FROM MY HOME IN NAPILI, WHERE I HAVE ONE MINOR, WHO SHALL NOT BE DISCLOSED AND A POCKET PIT. AND TO MY KNOWLEDGE WE HAVE NO TESTIFIERS AT THE LAHAINA DISTRICT OFFICE.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. >> COUNCIL MEMBER YUKI LEI SUGIMURA. >> SALUT EVERYBODY. I'M IN KULA, AND THE LOOK FORWARD TO A FAST MEETING WITH 59 ITEMS TO GO. THANKS. >> AND YOU'RE HOME ALONE.\r\n\r\nARE YOU HOME ALONE? >> MY HUSBAND IS DOWNSTAIRS, BUT I GUESS IT'S CONSIDERED -- [INAUDIBLE] >> THANK YOU. >> PRESIDING OFFICER PRO TEMPORE TASHA KAMA. >> ALOHA KAKAHIKA, CHAIR AND SALUT TO ALL OF MY COLLEAGUES AND EVERYBODY OUT IN AKAKU LAND. I'M HOME IN MY WORK SPACE AND IN NEXT ROOM IS ANY DAUGHTER, AND HER CAREGIVER. LOOKING FORWARD TO A WONDERFULLY BRIEF COUNCIL MEETING. AMEN.\r\n\r\nAMEN. AMEN. [LAUGHTER]. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> HALLELUJAH. >> COUNCIL VICE-CHAIR KEANI RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> ALOHA KAKAHIKA MAI MOLOKA'I -- THAT SOUNDS GOOD, MEMBER KAMA. I SECOND THAT.\r\n\r\nI AM AT A FRIEND'S RESIDENCE IN MAKAWAO, ALONG IN THE ROOM. I FORGOT I COULDN'T PARTICIPATE IN MEETING FROM MY OFFICE ON THE 8TH FLOOR, BECAUSE -- [INAUDIBLE] SO I'M HERE RIGHT NOW, AND I'M KEEPING MY VIDEO OFF, SO THAT MY AUDIO IS STRONGER. MAHALO, CHAIR. >> THANK YOU, VICE-CHAIR. MEMBERS, I BELIEVE THAT MEMBERS KING AND MOLINA WILL BE JOINING US LATER. SO THEY ARE EXCUSED FOR NOW, AND I'M PRETTY SURE THEY WILL BE JOINING US. MY NAME IS ALICE LEE, AND I'M THE CHAIR.\r\n\r\nWISHING YOU ALL A VERY GOOD MORNING AND I'M HOME ALONE TRANSMITTING FROM MY HOME OFFICE. SALUT TO ALL OF YOU AND TO EVERYONE WHO IS JOINING US TODAY. AS YOU KNOW, ALL OF US HAVE BEEN NOTIFIED THAT WE NEED TO CONCLUDE THIS MEETING BEFORE 4:30. SO I WOULD SAY 4:25, WILL BE THE DEADLINE FOR US. SO THAT WE CAN CLOSE DOWN WHAT WE'RE DOING IN THE MAYOR'S OFFICE. MAYOR'S CONFERENCE ROOM ON THE 9TH FLOOR. THEY CLOSE AT 4:30 SHARP. SO IN ORDER TO RESPECT THAT, I'M HOPING THAT YOUR QUESTIONS AND COMMENTS WILL BE CONCISE, AND IN THE FUTURE, I JUST WANT TO LET YOU KNOW, THAT WE MAY BE EXPERIMENTING IN A SENSE WITH TESTIMONY FOR COUNCIL MEETINGS.\r\n\r\nCOUNCIL MEETINGS, NOT NECESSARILY COMMITTEE MEETINGS, BECAUSE THE COUNCIL MEETINGS HAVE A LOT OF ITEMS TODAY. WE HAVE 59 ITEMS. SO WHAT WE'RE PLANNING TO DO, NOT TODAY, BUT THE NEXT -- GOING FORWARD IS

TO CALL UP TESTIMONY BEFORE EACH CATEGORY OF ITEMS. WE HAVE SIX CATEGORIES. SO WE HAVE SIX OPPORTUNITIES TO SPEAK, AND WE'RE GOING TO ELIMINATE THE TESTIMONY IN THE BEGINNING. SO WE HAVE CHECKED WITH OIP AND SEE IF THAT WORKS BETTER FOR US? THEN WE CAN PROBABLY CONFINE OUR MEETINGS TO NINE HOURS, INSTEAD OF 12. AND TRY AND WORK IT THAT WAY.

I DON'T SEE WHERE THE COMMITTEES NEED TO CHANGE NECESSARILY, BECAUSE YOU ONLY HAVE ONE TO FOUR ITEMS GENERALLY. BUT TODAY WE HAVE 59 ITEMS, AND WE HAVE SEVEN CATEGORIES. ANY QUESTIONS SO FAR, MEMBERS? I DIDN'T WANT TO SWITCH TO THE NEW SYSTEM YET, BECAUSE I THINK PEOPLE NEED TO BE KNOWING IN ADVANCE. MAYBE PEOPLE WERE EXPECTING TO TESTIFY AT THE BEGINNING OF THE MEETING. I DIDN'T WANT TO INCONVENIENCE ANYONE. YES, MR. SINENCI, YOU HAVE A QUESTION? >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. MAHALO FOR LETTING US KNOW ABOUT OUR HARD STOP TODAY. SHOULD WE GO OVER THAT, YOU ARE CONSIDERING RECESSING TO ANOTHER DATE? >> YES. AND PROBABLY MONDAY. BUT I DON'T SEE THAT WE HAVE ANY -- I SHOULDN'T SAY THIS, BUT I DON'T THINK WE HAVE ANY CONTROVERSIAL ITEMS THAT I'M AWARE OF. BUT YOU KNOW, THIS GROUP OF CHARACTERS, OUR COUNCIL, YOU KNOW, YOU NEVER CAN SAY NO. WE NEED TO BE OPEN AND FLEXIBLE, AND TAKE THINGS AS THEY COME. ANY MORE QUESTIONS? IF NOT, MR. CLERK. >> CHAIR, THERE ARE SEVEN MEMBERS PRESENT, TWO MEMBERS EXCUSED. A QUORUM IS PRESENT TO CONDUCT THE BUSINESS OF THE COUNCIL.

FOR THE RECORD, I'M DEPUTY COUNTY CLERK JAMES KRUEGER AND ALSO PRESENT ARE LEGISLATIVE DIVISION STAFF JOYCE MURASHIGE AND LAUREN SALDANA AND JOINING THE MEETING FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF CORPORATION COUNSEL, MOANA LUTEY AND FIRST DEPUTY CORPORATION COUNSEL RICHELLE THOMPSON. >> MEMBERS, I DID GET A TEXT THAT MEMBER MOLINA SHOULD BE JOINING US IN ABOUT 10-15 MINUTES AND MEMBER KING MAY BE IN AROUND 10:00 A.M. JUST FOR YOUR INFORMATION. AT THIS TIME I WOULD LIKE TO INVITE COUNCIL MEMBER TAMARA PALTIN TO PROVIDE OPENING REMARKS. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. AS YOU KNOW, LAST WEEK, COUNCIL MEMBER KAMA AND I RETURNED FROM THE NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF COUNTIES' CONFERENCE IN ADAMS COUNTY, COLORADO. I WANTED TO SHARE A LITTLE ABOUT THE VALUE OF GATHERING AS ELECTED PUBLIC SERVANTS TO RECOGNIZE ACCOMPLISHMENTS, DISCUSS SHARED CHALLENGES, AND RESOURCES OUTSIDE OF THE TRADITIONAL ROBERT'S RULES SETTINGS OF A COUNCIL MEETING. I DON'T KNOW THAT THE GENERAL PUBLIC REALIZES THAT WHILE THE SUNSHINE LAW ALLOWS FOR GREATER TRANSPARENCY, IT ALSO RESTRICTS US AS COUNCIL MEMBERS FROM GATHERING TOGETHER TO BRAINSTORM ON ISSUES OUTSIDE OF A FORMALLY AGENDIZED MEETING.

SO I WANTED TO EMPHASIZE THAT GATHERING TO DISCUSS ISSUES IN A MORE OPEN FORMAT IS A VALID STRATEGY TO ADDRESSING OUR ISSUES. GIVEN MY FORMER PROFESSION IN EMERGENCY MEDICAL RESPONSE, I WAS DRAWN TO MANY OF THE DISASTER RESILIENCE WORKSHOPS. I MET AND HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO TALK WITH MR. BROCK LONG, FORMER ADMINISTRATOR OF THE FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY. I WANTED TO SHARE HIS SAGE ADVICE, IF YOU ARE ABLE TO, GET INSURANCE, ESPECIALLY FLOOD INSURANCE. THAT IS IF YOU ARE ABLE. REGARDLESS OF WHETHER YOU LIVE IN AN AREA THAT FLOODS OR NOT.

AND TO PREPARE FOR THE SCENARIO, WHERE FEMA MAY NOT BE ABLE TO RESPOND TO THE UPCOMING VOLUME OF DISASTERS. I ALSO HEARD FROM A COUNTY ELECTED OFFICIAL, WHO FOUND HIMSELF IN THE MIDDLE OF THE CAMPFIRE OF 2018. UNLIKE OUR LAHAINA FIRE THAT SAME YEAR, THIS FIRE CAUSED AT LEAST 85 CIVILIAN FATALITIES. COVERED 153,336 ACRES AND DESTROYED MORE THAN 18,000 STRUCTURES INCLUDING HIS OWN HOME. I WANTED TO SHARE THAT MY TAKEAWAY IS THAT WE'LL ALL NEED TO BE RESILIENT IN THE COMING YEARS. BEING RESILIENT IS A PERSONAL CHOICE AND TO BE RESILIENT IS TO BE REFUSED TO BE DEFINED BY CIRCUMSTANCES, FATE OR THE OPINION OF OTHERS. RESILIENT INDIVIDUALS

DON'T WASTE TIME ON EXCUSES, CHOOSING INSTEAD TO FOCUS THEIR ENERGY ON FINDING SOLUTIONS. THEY'RE FLEXIBLE IN THEIR APPROACH, LEARN FROM THEIR MISTAKES, AND STAYING OPEN TO OPPORTUNITIES TO GROW THROUGH ALL THEIR EXPERIENCES.\r\n\r\nCOURAGEOUSLY EMBRACING THE EBB AND FLOW OF LIFE, MY ASPIRATION FOR OUR COUNTY IS TO BECOME MORE RESILIENT. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. WELL-SAID. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. NOW MEMBERS, I INVITE YOU TO JOIN ME IN THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE. I PLEDGE ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, AND TO THE REPUBLIC FOR WHICH IT STANDS, ONE NATION UNDER GOD, INDIVISIBLE, WITH LIBERTY AND JUSTICE FOR ALL.\r\n\r\n>> NOW EVERYONE BEFORE WE PROCEED WITH TODAY'S AGENDA, MAY I PLEASE REQUEST THAT EVERYONE KEEP THEIR MICROPHONES MUTED, UNLESS IT'S YOUR TIME TO SPEAK. DECORUM SHALL BE MAINTAINED AT ALL TIMES. MR. CLERK. >> CHAIR, PROCEEDING WITH TESTIMONY ON SETTING THE CONSENT CALENDAR. MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC MAY TESTIFY IN THE MAYOR'S CONFERENCE ROOM ON THE 9TH FLOOR AT COURTESY TESTIMONY SITES, OR REMOTELY THROUGH THE INFORMATION LISTED ON THE AGENDA. INDIVIDUALS MAY SIGN UP TO TESTIFY WITH A STAFF MEMBER LOCATED AT THE DESK AT THE BACK OF THE ROOM.\r\n\r\nINDIVIDUALS AT COURTESY TESTIMONY SITES MAY SIGN UP WITH STAFF AT SITE. INDIVIDUALS PARTICIPATING REMOTELY MAY SIGN UP IN MEETING CHAT. IF YOU ARE CONNECTED TO THE MEETING BY PHONE, YOU WILL BE AUTOMATICALLY BE ADDED TO THE TESTIFIER LIST. INDIVIDUALS CONNECTED BY PHONE ARE CURRENTLY ON MUTE AND UNMUTED WHEN IT'S THEIR TIME TO TESTIFY. LAST CALL.\r\n\r\nCHAIR, THERE'S NO ONE TO TESTIFY. >> ALL RIGHT, PLEASE PROCEED WITH THE CONSENT CALENDAR. >> CHAIR, AT THIS TIME, SETTING THE CONSENT CALENDAR, TO ADD OR REMOVE ITEMS. >> I'M SORRY, I DIDN'T QUITE HEAR YOU. >> APOLOGIES, CHAIR. AT THIS TIME, IF THE COUNCIL -- AT THIS TIME, THE COUNCIL COULD CLOSE TESTIMONY ON THE SETTING OF THE CALENDAR AND PROCEED TO SETTING THE CONSENT CALENDAR. >> MEMBERS, ARE THERE ANY OBJECTIONS TO CLOSING TESTIMONY ON THE CONSENT CALENDAR?\r\n\r\n>> NO OBJECTIONS. >> SO ORDERED. MR. CLERK. >> CHAIR, AT THIS TIME, THE MEMBERS CAN SET THE CONSENT CALENDAR. IF THE MEMBERS ARE OKAY WITH LEAVING THOSE ITEMS ON THE CONSENT CALENDAR AND DO NOT WISH TO ADD OR REMOVE ITEMS, THEY CAN SET IT. >> SO MOVED, CHAIR.\r\n\r\n>> SECOND. >> MOVED BY MEMBER KAMA, SECONDED BY MEMBER SUGIMURA TO SET THE CONSENT CALENDAR. ANY DISCUSSION? ALL THOSE IN FAVOR OF THE MOTION, RAISE YOUR HAND AND SAY AYE. >> AYE. >> OKAY. WE HAVE AUDIO AYE FROM MEMBER RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ.\r\n\r\nSO THE AYES HAVE IT. THE CONSENT CALENDAR IS SET. MR. CLERK. >> CHAIR, PROCEEDING WITH THE PRESENTATION OF TESTIMONY ON REMAINING AGENDA ITEMS OF AT THIS TIME

INDIVIDUALS MAY TESTIFY TO ALL REMAINING AGENDA ITEMS AND TESTIMONY WILL BE ALLOWED BEFORE EACH CATEGORY OF TODAY'S AGENDA AND INDIVIDUALS CAN CHOOSE TO TESTIFY DURING THE TESTIMONY PERIOD, BEFORE THE APPROPRIATE AGENDA CATEGORY. FOR OTHER INFORMATION AT FUTURE COUNCIL MEETINGS THE COUNCIL MAY RECEIVE TESTIMONY BEFORE EACH CATEGORY OF THE AGENDA ONLY.\r\n\r\nCHAIR, THE FIRST INDIVIDUAL TO TESTIFY IS SEAN METZGER, FOLLOWED BY ANDREW. >> YES, MA'AM, JUST TRYING TO FIGURE OUT HOW TO UNMUTE MY VIDEO. ALOHA KAKOU. IT'S WONDERFUL TO SEE ALL OF YOUR FACES AND THOSE WHICH WE CANNOT SEE BECAUSE OF THE VOTING AND THOSE WHO ARE ON THEIR WAY FROM THE AIRPORT. SO THANK YOU ALL FOR BEING HERE. I JUST WANT TO TAKE -- I'M GOING TO LITERALLY HAVE FIVE OR SIX THINGS, BUT TRY TO MAKE IT MANY 3-4 MINUTES AND TAKE 30 SECONDS TO SAY HOW EXTRAORDINARY TO HAVE OUR FORM GOVERNMENT IN THE TRANSITORY TIME THIS ENTIRE BODY WILL CHANGE. WE'LL DO IT WITH KINDNESS, AWARENESS AND PASS IT ON TO NEXT PEOPLE THAT WILL BE ON THE COUNCIL, OR THOSE WHICH ARE STAYING.\r\n\r\nI JUST WANT TO TAKE A SECOND TO REALLY LET THAT SOAK IN HOW PRECIOUS THAT IS IN THIS WORLD THAT WE LIVE IN. I WOULD LIKE TO SPEAK TO IS BILL 110, CD 1 FOR THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO HOMES OF UNMARRIED SURVIVING SPOUSES OF VETERANS. I CANNOT TELL YOU HOW MUCH I APPRECIATE THIS BODY TAKING THIS TO HEART, AND PUSHING IT FAST. SO THAT WE CAN GET THESE VETERANS TAKEN CARE AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE. YOU ONCE AGAIN, THE MAUI COUNTY COUNCIL IS SETTING PRECEDENCE FOR THE STATE, AND PERHAPS, FOR A GOOD PORTION OF THE UNITED STATES. SO THANK YOU FOR HAVING THAT FULL VISION AND I HIGHLY RECOMMEND THIS BE PASSED AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE. THE SECOND IS ON 93, BILL FOR ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 3.48450 RELATING TO HOMEOWNER EXEMPTIONS.\r\n\r\nONCE AGAIN, I THINK THIS IS A GOOD FIRST STEP, BECAUSE YOU ARE STARTING TO REALLY HELP PEOPLE, AS WELL AS PUSH TO TRY TO GET OUR RENTERS TO BE MOTIVATED TO DO THAT. I THINK THAT PERHAPS NEXT YEAR THERE WOULD BE MUCH MORE OF A POSSIBILITY OF BRINGING IN MORE TAXES TO TRY TO HELP WITH AFFORDABLE HOUSING. THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR THIS STEP. I KNOW IT'S BEEN A LOT OF WORK. ONTO COMMITTEE REPORT 22-70 ON AFFORDABLE HOUSING. RELATING TO USE OF VEHICLES FOR HUMAN HABITATION ON COUNTY PROPERTY. I KNOW THIS IS NOT AN EASY ONE TO WORK WITH, YET WE HAVE TO FIND SOME INTERIM SOLUTIONS AND ONCE AGAIN APPRECIATE YOU TAKING A LOOK AT THIS.\r\n\r\nI KNOW IT'S ONLY A FIRST STEP, BUT HIGHLY RECOMMEND THAT TO BE PASSED ON. I'M FOR THAT. 22-71, DEALING WITH AGRICULTURAL FENCING. YES, OVER 7' IS REALLY GREAT FOR THE DEER. WE JUST HAVE TO MAKE SURE THIS DOESN'T END UP WITH MEGA HOUSES PUTTING IN 20' WALLS. SO IF THERE NEEDS TO BE ANY CHANGES TO THAT, I WOULD SAY PERHAPS LOOK IN THE DIRECTION OF MAKING SURE IT'S BEING APPLIED FOR WHAT IT'S SUPPOSED TO BE AND NOT HELPING MILLIONAIRES MAKE THEIR PLACES INTO FORTRESSES. SO THAT IS SOMETHING THAT I WOULD BE REALLY BE CONCERNED ABOUT.\r\n\r\n22-73 AS FAR AS THE 22-159. DEALING WITH THE HOUSE -- WHATEVER THAT MEGA-MANSION IS ON LOWER HONOAPI'ILANI. THERE NEEDS TO BE QUESTIONS ASKED. HOW THIS ADMINISTRATION, HOW THE VICTORINO ADMINISTRATION ALLOWED THIS TO HAPPEN IS A TRAVESTY AND IT TAKE YOUR TIME TO GO BACK AND STRAIGHTEN OUT SOMETHING THAT THE ADMINISTRATION IS JUST UNCONSCIONABLE. I'M SORRY YOU HAVE TO SPEND YOUR TIME LIKE THIS GOING TO LOOK AT WHAT THE MAYOR AND HIS ADMINISTRATION HAS DONE. AGAIN, THANK YOU FOR TAKING THE YEOMAN'S TASKS THAT YOU DO AS A COUNCIL. ONTO 22-76, RELATING THE STATE JUDICIARY JUSTICE CENTER FOR MAUI. WOW, THAT IS SO AMAZING.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU SO MUCH FOR DOING THAT THE TO PROVIDE SERVICES FOR CHILDREN -- THERE NOWHERE FOR THESE FOLKS TO GO AND THANK YOU SO MUCH FOR DOING THAT. THERE'S A

KINDNESS AND COMPASSION THAT IS PROFOUND WITH THAT. I THINK THAT'S ALL I HAD TO SPEAK ABOUT. SO AGAIN, THANK YOU FOR BEING THERE. THANK YOU FOR YOUR WORK. AND HUI HOU. >> MEMBERS, ANY QUESTIONS FOR MR. LESTER? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH, SEAN, AND GOOD TO SEE YOU. >> THANK YOU >> MR. CLERK. >> CHAIR, THE NEXT PERSON TO TESTIFY IS ANDREW COY, FOLLOWED BY [INAUDIBLE] >> I'M NOT SURE -- GOOD MORNING VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ AND MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL. MY NAME IS ANDREW COY AND TESTIFYING ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOMELANDS ON BILL NO. 121. THE DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOMELANDS IS IN STRONG SUPPORT OF THIS BILL. 80.455 PROVIDING FINANCIAL RELIEF TO BENEFICIARIES THAT HAVE A HOMESTEAD WITHIN THE COUNTY. OFTEN HOMESTEAD WHO ARE IN ARREARS OF PROPERTY TAX PAYMENT FIND THEMSELVES IN THAT SITUATION DUE TO UNFORTUNATE TRAUMATIC EVENTS. PREVENTING A HOMESTEAD LESSEE FROM CLAIMING A HOMESTEAD EXEMPTION AND CREATING A HIGHER TAX BURDEN WILL MAKE IT EVEN HAZARDER FOR THE LESSEE TO MAKE PAYMENTS ON BACK TAXES OWED TO COUNTY AND FURTHER PUT THE HOMESTEADER IN ARREARS. THIS BILL WILL HELP TO BREAK THE CYCLE AND INCREASE THE LIKELIHOOD THAT A LESSEE WILL COMPLY WITH A REPAYMENT PLAN TOT COUNTY. MAHALO NUI FOR YOUR CONSIDERATION THAT IS THE DEPARTMENT'S TESTIMONY. >> THANK YOU. MEMBERS ARE THERE ANY QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. MR. CLERK. >> CHAIR, THE NEXT PERSON WE HAVE SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY IS KAPONO, FOLLOWED BY TODD. >> THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR ALLOWING ME TO SPEAK. MY NAME IS KAPONO. PI'ILANI, ALOHA. MY NAME IS KAPONO, A KUMU OF PI'ILANI. MY MOTHER'S TONGUE IS MY LANGUAGE OF THAT. THE RICHNESS OF THIS LANGUAGE FROM BORDER TO BORDER IS IMPORTANT INDEED TO ALL, AND THE VAST ENLIGHTENMENT OF OUR ANCESTRAL WISDOM, AS AN EDUCATOR OVER 20 YEARS I HAVE SEEN THE AMAZING GROWTH OF OUR STUDENTS AND 'AINA-BASED EDUCATION AND HAVE BEEN GROUNDED IN ANCESTRAL WISDOM, HAWAI'I CULTURAL VALUES AND THE USE OF THE MOTHER TONGUE IN THEIR OWN HOMELAND. AS KUMU HULA, I HAVE WITNESSED THE GROWTH OF STUDENTS TO FURTHER THEIR EDUCATIONS TO COME BACK AND SERVE OUR COMMUNITIES OF 21ST CENTURY LEARNERS IN BOTH PUBLIC AND PRIVATE SCHOOLS ON MAUI. TODAY, THIS BILL NO. 123 HAS THE OPPORTUNITY TO CONTINUE TO HELP PROVIDE AN AMAZING 'AINA-BASED EDUCATIONAL SCHOOL, THAT CONTINUES TO EDUCATE THE FUTURE LEARNERS AND LEADERS. I HAVE BEEN INVOLVED WITH PI'ILANI SINCE INCEPTION AND SEEN FIRSTHAND THE AMAZING DETERMINATION AND ALOHA, THIS SCHOOL, STAFF AND LEADERSHIP HAS SHOWN TO ITS 'OHANA THAT IT SERVES. I STRONGLY ENCOURAGE ALL OF YOU TO SUPPORT THIS BILL AND THE STRONG STEWARDSHIP PRESENTATION IN THE VALLEY. IN A TIME OF CHANGE, AND EVER PRESENT INFLUX OF OVERWHELMING UNCERTAINTIES IN OUR WORLD, IT'S GOOD TO SEE HEALTHY STEWARDSHIP OF 'AINA, WHICH WE KNOW IS ALOHA 'AINA, MALAMA 'AINA AND OUR KEIKI THRIVING IN A SPACE THAT ALLOWS THEM TO SEE THE WORLD AND LEARN THROUGH THE LENS OF THEIR KUPUNA. MAHALO. THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR YOUR TIME. ANY QUESTIONS? >> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, ARE THERE ANY QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU. >> ALOHA. >> ALOHA. SEE YOU AT HOME. NEXT TESTIFIER. WE HAVE PRESENT WITH US MEMBER MIKE MOLINA. WELCOME. GOOD MORNING. >> GOOD MORNING, AND ALOHA, MADAM CHAIR. FOR THE RECORD, I'M TRANSMITTING OUT OF THE PA'IA DISTRICT OFFICE AND THERE'S NO TESTIFIERS. I'M ACCOMPANIED BY MY EXECUTIVE ASSISTANT. MAHALO. >> THANK YOU. MR. CLERK. >> CHAIR, THE NEXT PERSON WE HAVE SIGN UP TO TESTIFY IS ALLISON, FOLLOW BY MIKE MORAN. >> GOOD MORNING. >> ALL RIGHT, ALOHA CHAIR LEE AND MEMBERS OF THE COUNCIL. I'M THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE HAWAI'I NATURE CENTER AND MAHALO FOR ALLOWING THE HAWAIIAN CENTER TO PROVIDE TESTIMONY REGARDING AGENDA ITEM 22-86. SINCE 1981 ON O'AHU, AND IN THE 1990S ON MAUI, THE HAWAIIAN NATURE CENTER HAS

BEEN CONNECTING KIDS AND ADULTS TO NATURE IN THIS TIME 1 MILLION KEIKI IN PROVIDING SUPPORT, I WANT TO MAKE SURE OUR ELECTED OFFICIALS AND BROADER COMMUNITY UNDERSTAND THIS POTENTIAL -- RATHER WE SEE THIS AS AN OPPORTUNITY FOR US TO STRENGTHEN OUR PROGRAMMING CONNECT WITH MORE UNDERSERVED KIDS WITH THE ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION PROGRAM. HAWAIIAN NATURE CENTER IS EXCITED AND APPRECIATES THE OPPORTUNITY TO STAY CONNECTED TO MAUI AND DO WHAT WE DO BEST, CONNECTING KIDS WITH NATURE. I'M HAPPY TO ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS, IF THERE ARE ANY.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, ARE THERE ANY QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. >> MAHALO. >> I'M SORRY, WE HAVE A QUESTION. MEMBER SINENCI. [INAUDIBLE] JUST FOR CLARIFICATION, HAWAI'I NATURE CENTER [INAUDIBLE] >> I'M HAVING A HARD TIME HEARING YOU COUNCIL MEMBER, AS A WILLING?\r\n\r\n>> WILLING SELLER, ABSOLUTELY. >> GREAT. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. >> MEMBER SUGIMURA. >> AND CONNECTED TO THAT THEN, YOU WILL STILL BE ON MAUI, BUT NOT NECESSARILY AT THE LOCATION, SINCE YOU ARE SELLING IT OR ARE YOU GOING TO CONTINUE WORKING WITH THE CURRENT ORGANIZATION THERE? >> YES.\r\n\r\n\r\nTHAT IS NOT FULLY DETERMINED. WE WILL BE WORKING WITH THE KEIKI OPI TO SEE IF THERE'S AN OPPORTUNITY TO STAY ON-SITE FOR A DURATION, BUT DON'T PLAN ON LEAVING MAUI AT ALL. IT DEPENDS ON THE LOCATION AND THEIR NEEDS. >> THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. >> ANYONE ELSE? MEMBER PALTIN.\r\n\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU, MR. CULLISON FOR YOUR TESTIMONY. I JUST WANTED TO CLARIFY, ARE WE, THE COUNTY, LOCKED INTO THIS PURCHASE? OR IS THERE DANGER THAT SOMEBODY ELSE COULD PURCHASE? THE PROPERTY? >> IS THAT QUESTION TO ME, COUNCIL MEMBER?\r\n\r\n\r\n>> YES, TO YOU. >> WELL, I CERTAINLY CAN'T SPEAK FOR THE COUNCIL. WE HAVE LETTERS OF INTENT THAT HAVE SIGNED BY THE COUNTY OF MAUI AND MY UNDERSTANDING, I'M NOT A PROFESSIONAL -- THAT IS NOT A BINDING AGREEMENT. BUT THERE'S A LETTER OF INTENT, AND THEN IT HAS TO PASS WHATEVER COMMITTEES, AND VOTES HERE, AND THEN THE DUE DILIGENCE WOULD START. AGAIN, I'M NOT TRYING TO SPEAK FOR COUNTY, BUT JUST REPEATING WHAT I HAVE LEARNED THROUGH THE PROCESS. AND IT HAS TO MOVE THROUGH THE PROCESS LIKE ANY OTHER REAL ESTATE TRANSACTION. I HOPE I'M ACCURATE IN SAYING THAT, AND HOPEFULLY ANSWERS YOUR QUESTIONS.\r\n\r\n\r\n>> SO IT'S BENEFICIAL TO TAKE ACTION TODAY TO MOVE THAT PROCESS ALONG IS WHAT YOU ARE SAYING? >> I WOULD AGREE WITH THAT, YES. I'M NOT A REAL ESTATE EXPERT, BUT WE HAVE A SIGNED LETTER OF INTENT, I BELIEVE WHAT IT'S CALLED AND OTHER DOCUMENTS PASSING BACK AND FORTH, BUT NOTHING IS BINDING AT THIS POINT. >> THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. >> CHAIR? >> YES.\r\n\r\n\r\nVICE-CHAIR, IS THAT YOU? >> YES. MAHALO, CHAIR. ALOHA, MR. CULLISON. MAHALO FOR YOUR TESTIMONY THIS MORNING IN SUPPORTING THIS ACQUISITION. SO I WANTED TO FOLLOW-UP ON MEMBER PALTIN'S QUESTION.\r\n\r\n\r\nAS I UNDERSTAND THE QUESTION, WHICH WASN'T A QUESTION ABOUT OUR PROCESSES, WE AT THE COUNCIL UNDERSTAND HOW WE OPERATE AND HOW WE WOULD ENTER INTO AN ACQUISITION. I BELIEVE THE QUESTION WAS MORE ABOUT ON YOUR END ON WHETHER THE PROPERTY IS STILL ON THE MARKET? AND REGARDING THE URGENCY OF TAKING ACTION AS QUICKLY AS POSSIBLE, SINCE ANOTHER BUYER COULD POTENTIALLY SWEEP IN AND PURCHASE THIS PROPERTY BEFORE THE COUNTY HAS THE ABILITY TO DO SO. >> THANK YOU FOR CLARIFYING. SORRY IF I MISSPOKE, AND TRYING TO REVIEW WHAT YOU GUYS ALREADY KNOW. I GUESS THE SHORT ANSWER IS YES, IT'S ON THE MARKET. TO BE QUITE HONEST, IT'S NOT LIKE IT HAS BEEN HEAVILY MARKETED.\r\n\r\n\r\nWE WERE APPROACHED BY THE COUNTY AND IT SEEMS TO BE THE BEST FIT, QUITE HONESTLY, GIVEN THE OTHER PUBLIC PROPERTY UP THERE. I THINK THAT IF WE WANT A BETTER ANSWER I CAN GIVE YOU, I CAN DEFINITELY DEFER TO OUR BOARD MEMBERS, WHO HAVE MORE EXPERIENCE IN THIS. AT THIS POINT, WE DON'T HAVE ANY OTHER BUYERS TO BE HONEST WITH YOU, YOU KNOW? TO

SPEAK FRANKLY, WE HAVE NO OTHERS. SO WE'RE MOVING FORWARD WITH THE COUNTY OF MAUI. I SUPPOSE IF THIS BILL DIDN'T HAPPEN, I SUPPOSE IF WOULD GO BACK OUT TO MARKET. >> THANK YOU.\r\n\r\nMAHALO, CHAIR. >> MEMBER KAMA. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU, MR. CULLISON FOR BEING HERE. SO YOU KNOW, IN YOUR LETTER OF INTENT, IS THERE A DEADLINE THAT SAYS WE NEED TO GET BACK TO US BEFORE A CERTAIN DATE? BECAUSE I THINK WHAT, AT LEAST IN MY MIND AS A COUNCIL MEMBER, NORMALLY THIS WOULD GO TO COMMITTEE AND WE WOULD TALK ABOUT IT, BUT I'M ALSO HEARING THAT WE CAN ALSO BRING IT UP ON THE FLOOR TODAY.\r\n\r\nI JUST WANT TO MAKE SURE IF WE HAVE TIME TO TAKE IT TO COMMITTEE, AND TALK ABOUT IT, AND MAKE SURE WE GET ALL OF THE ANSWERS. BECAUSE THIS IS -- TO ME, THIS IS REALLY IMPORTANT. AND I WANT TO BE ABLE TO MAKE SURE IF WE'RE GOING TO DO THIS, LET'S DO IT RIGHT FIRST TIME AROUND. I REALLY WANT -- I WOULD WANT THE ADVANTAGES TO BELONG TO THE ORGANIZATION. SO THAT OUR KIDS WILL ALWAYS BE THERE IN PERPETUITY. THAT THEY WILL ALWAYS HAVE A PLACE THEY CAN CALL THEIR OWN; RIGHT? BECAUSE THIS IS THEIR PLACE OF LEARNING AND THAT IS WHERE WE ALL BEGIN.\r\n\r\nLIKE OUR SECOND HOME. SO WOULD YOU KNOW IF THERE IS A DEADLINE ON THAT LETTER OF INTENT? >> I DO NOT BELIEVE THAT THERE IS. I DO NOT BELIEVE THAT THERE IS. YES. >> THANK YOU, SIR. THANK YOU, CHAIR THANK YOU.\r\n\r\n>> ARE THERE ANY MORE QUESTIONS? MEMBER SUGIMURA. >> JUST POINT OF INFORMATION FOR THE BODY THAT WHEN ITEM COMES MICHELE YOSHIMURA WILL BE AVAILABLE TO ANSWER SOME OF THESE QUESTIONS. THANK YOU >> I WILL ADD I WILL DO MY BEST TO BE ONLINE WHEN THIS AGENDA ITEM HAPPENS IF THERE'S ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS THAT I WILL ANSWER TO THE BEST OF MY ABILITY. >> THANK YOU. MEMBER KAMA. >> IS IT OKAY TO MAKE MR.\r\n\r\nCULLISON A RESOURCE PERSON FOR WHEN THE ITEM COMES UP, CHAIR? >> ANY OBJECTIONS, MEMBERS? >> YES, I WILL BE YOUR RESOURCE PERSON. >> THANK YOU. THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> WE'LL TRY AND -- IF YOU PUT YOUR NUMBER IN THE CHAT, WE CAN CALL. >> OKAY.\r\n\r\nTHAT WOULD BE WONDERFUL. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. MR. CLERK. >> CHAIR, THE NEXT PERSON SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY IS MIKE MORAN, FOLLOWED BY JUNIOR NAKOA. >> GOOD MORNING, CHAIR LEE, AND THE BEST COUNCIL THAT I HAVE SEEN, AND THE NEXT GUYS OBVIOUSLY ARE GOING TO HAVE CHANGES, 2023 HAS A HIGH BAR TO ACHIEVE.\r\n\r\nSO WE WANT TO CONTINUE TO EXPRESS THAT. I'M FOR THE KIHEI COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION AND WE HAVE FOUR ITEMS THAT WE WANT TO SPEAK OF IN SUPPORT OF ALL OF THEM. AND MOST OF THEM HAVE BEEN SPOKEN ABOUT BEFORE. FIRST, IS 22-70. THE VEHICLES FOR PURPOSES OF HABITAT. I KNOW SHE IS NOT HERE YET AND >> COUNCIL MEMBER KING -- WE CONTINUE TO SUPPORT IT NOW. WE DEFINITELY HAVE PEOPLE IN OUR COMMUNITY, THE PEOPLE THAT WE WANT TO SERVE, THESE ARE FAMILIES THAT BOTH PARENTS WORK. SOMETIMES ONE OR EVEN TWO KIDS GOING TO SCHOOL.\r\n\r\nTHEY JUST CAN'T MAKE RENT. AND THEY JUST NEED SOMEPLACE WHERE AS AWKWARD AS IT IS TO HAVE THREE OR FOUR PEOPLE SLEEPING IN A CAR, IF THAT IS THE BEST THEY CAN DO, AT LEAST WE CAN DO IS PROVIDE A SAFE SPOT FOR THEM TO HAVE UNINTERRUPTED SLEEP. SO WE HOPE THIS CAN FINALLY MOVE FORWARD. MOVING ON TO 22-72. WE HAVE MENTIONED THIS BEFORE ON CESSPOOLS. WE HAVE THAT WHOLE NEIGHBORHOOD OF MAUI MEADOWS, WHICH IS UNSEWERED. SO OBVIOUSLY, THERE'S MANY CESSPOOLS AND MANY SEPTIC TANKS THERE, BUT OUR UNDERSTANDING IS SEPTIC TANK IS ONLY AS GOOD AS IT'S BEING MAINTAINED. OTHERWISE, IT ALSO REVERTS BACK TO IT PRETTY MUCH BEING A HOLE IN THE GROUND.\r\n\r\nSO ANY ACTION THAT CAN BE TAKEN TO MAKE THIS GET RID OF THESE CESSPOOLS. HOW FAR WILL A MILLION DOLLARS GO COUNTYWIDE? EVERY STEP FORWARD IS A GOOD STEP. SO WE'RE IN SUPPORT OF THAT. THE THIRD ITEM IS 22-174. AND THIS IS FOR THE MAUI PLANNING COMMISSION. WE HAVE ADDRESSED THIS NUMEROUS TIMES, AND NEED TO GET GOOD, QUALIFIED MIX OF

PEOPLE ON THAT MAUI PLANNING COMMISSION. IN COMMITTEE WE TALKED ABOUT DR. DEAKOS AND HOPE YOU GET HIM IN PLACE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE TO GIVE THAT STRONG VOICE FOR THE NATURAL ENVIRONMENT INTO THAT. SO IT'S NOT ONLY SUPPORT FOR THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT. AND LAST ONE IS 22-181. AGAIN, THIS IS A PRACTICAL MATTER. WE HAVE NOT SEEN TOO MUCH OF THIS YET, OR LEAST NOT GETTING TOO MANY REPORTS OF IT YET IN SOUTH MAUI, BUT WE NEED TO CONTROL THE NUMBER OF VISITORS. EVERY TIME WE GIVE THEM A NEW PLACE TO STAY, WE'RE INVITING MORE PEOPLE TO COME, AND PROBABLY FOR A LESS EXPENSIVE WAY TO COME. SO WE ARE IN SUPPORT OF GETTING THIS UNDER CONTROL, AND WE THANK OUR MEMBER FROM THE WEST SIDE, WHO TOLD US TO HAVE A PROLIFERATION OF THEM OVER THERE. WE DON'T WANT THEM OVER HERE, BUT YOU DON'T NEED THEM OVER THERE EITHER.

SO WE'RE IN SUPPORT OF THIS AS WELL. THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO TESTIFY ON THESE ITEMS THIS MORNING HUI HOU. >> MEMBERS, ANY QUESTIONS FOR MIKE? PRO TEM KAMA. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU FOR BEING HERE AGAIN, MR. MORAN. I LIKE HAVING YOU HANG AROUND WITH US. YOU ARE ALMOST LIKE THE 9TH BOARD MEMBER. SO MY QUESTION, IS IT ONLY HOMES IN MAUI MEADOWS THAT HAS THIS PROBLEM, OR ARE THERE OTHER SUBDIVISIONS IN THE KIHEI AREA? >> WE DON'T BELIEVE THERE'S ANY SUBDIVISIONS THAT ARE UNSEWERED. THERE ARE SPORADIC SPOTS WHERE THERE'S CESSPOOL HERE, CESSPOOL THERE. BUT THAT IS THE MAJOR ONE THAT IS UNSEWERED. SO WE LOOK AT THAT AS THE MAJOR PROBLEM. PICKING OUT THE BIG ONE FIRST AND FILLING THE LITTLE PUKAS LATER ON. >> DO YOU KNOW HOW MANY HOMES THERE ARE THERE? >> I SENT AN EMAIL TO THE COMMUNITY GROUP THIS MORNING, BUT I WASN'T GIVEN MUCH TIME. I WASN'T SURE HOW MANY HOMES THERE ARE UP THERE. SO I DON'T WANT TO TAKE A GUESS. >> OKAY. THANK YOU SO VERY MUCH.

THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> ANY MORE QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? IF NOT, THANK YOU, MIKE. HAVE A GREAT WEEKEND. >> YOU GUYS, TOO. SHORT MEETING, SHORT MEETING. >> ALL RIGHT. MR. CLERK. >> CHAIR, NEXT PERSON WE HAVE SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY IS JUNIOR NAKOA, FOLLOWED BY SAM SMALL. >> GOOD MORNING. >> GOOD MORNING. >> HOW'S IT? HOW'S IT? TALKING ABOUT THAT INVESTIGATION OF THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT, AND THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT. YOU GUYS KNOW HOW LONG I HAVE BEEN ASKING FOR SOMETHING, WHATEVER, BUT AT LEAST IT'S HAPPENING. BECAUSE WE DO WATCH THE NEWS AND SEE ALL THE CROOKED STUFF HAPPENING ON THE OTHER. IN FACT, O'AHU AND , HAWAI'I ISLAND, ALL THAT KIND OF STUFF. SO LET'S JUST MAKE SURE IT'S NOT HAPPENING IN OUR ISLAND, ON OUR ISLAND, AND IN THIS ADMINISTRATION. I TRIED CONTACTING ALL OF YOU GUYS YESTERDAY, AND THIS MORNING, LET YOU KNOW THAT MAYOR FINALLY WILL COMMIT TO A MEETING WITH THE LAHAINA PEOPLE AT THE LAHAINA CIVIC. I KNOW ALICE LEE WITH THE GREAT COMMITTEE WERE ASKING TO HEAR FROM THE COMMUNITY.

THANK YOU FOR THAT, BECAUSE YOU ARE LIGHTING THE FIRE TO GET THE BUGGER GOING. SO YOU HAVE TO LISTEN TO THE COMMUNITY, TO MOBILIZE AND ORGANIZE, AND GET EVERYBODY. IT'S GOING TO BE AUGUST 21ST. 10:30 IN THE MORNING. IT'S A SUNDAY. THAT IS WHEN IT IS. SO COME AND LISTEN TO US. WE'RE GOING TO SCREAM AND YELL -- I DON'T KNOW HOW -- YOU GUYS SHOULD PLEASE COME CHECK IT OUT, AND HEAR FROM THE PEOPLE. I MEAN, THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT, I KNOW YOU GUYS GET THEM FOR THE GREG BROWN HOUSE, BUT I HAVE BEEN TRYING TO GET LOCAL DEVELOPERS TO HELP THEM GET THEIR PERMITS FAST. BUT I TELL YOU RIGHT NOW, THREE MONTHS I WAS TRYING, ONE GUY LOST HIS HOUSE, LIKE THE ABILITY, BECAUSE THE LOAN, COULDN'T GET THE LOAN. SO SOMETHING HAS TO BE CHANGED. I KNOW YOU ARE GOING TO -- YOU GUYS HAVE THE AUDIT FROM THE OTHER GROUP, AND LET'S MAKE IT RIGHT. OUR LOCAL FAMILIES JUST LOST OUT ON GETTING A HOUSE. YOU GUYS HAVE HARD WORK TRYING TO GET LOCAL PEOPLE IN HOMES. YOU GUYS GET

CREDIT FOR ALL OF THE STUFF TO HELPING LOCALS GET INTO HOMES. AWESOME, AWESOME, AWESOME. SO LET'S MAKE SURE THAT THE PERMITTING PROCESS GETS CLEANED UP AND FIXED AND WHAT NOT. SO JUST LETTING YOU GUYS KNOW, I FULLY SUPPORT THIS INVESTIGATION. IT NEEDS TO BE DONE. I HOPE NOT ONLY -- I HOPE THAT THEY JUST START SOMETHING WHERE NOT ONLY THE GREG BROWN HOUSE, BUT EVERYTHING WITH PLANNING DEPARTMENT AND WITH PUBLIC WORKS AND WITH THE PERMITTING PROCESS. BECAUSE C'MON, MAN.\r\n\r\nI JUST THREE MONTHS DEALING WITH THEM AND I WAS SICK AND TIRED. CAN YOU IMAGINE THIS LOCAL DEVELOPERS THAT LIVE HERE ALL THEIR LIFE, JUST TRYING TO MAKE A LIVING FOR THE FELLOW CONTRACTORS AND ALL THAT KIND OF STUFF AND THEY CANNOT WORK BECAUSE OF THE PERMITTING PROCESS. MY BROTHER, THE ONE I'M TALKING ABOUT, HE JUST GOT ONE HOUSE APPROVED. HARD WORK, YOU KNOW? LET'S HELP MAKE THIS SYSTEM BETTER AS YOU GUYS ARE BETTER. THIS COUNCIL IS BETTER. I HAVE BEEN SAYING THAT HOW MANY TIMES?\r\n\r\nLET'S MAKE THIS PERMITTING PROCESS BETTER. OKAY, YOU GUYS HAVE A GOOD ONE. NAPILI, STATE CHAMPIONSHIP! >> ANY QUESTIONS, MEMBER SUGIMURA? >> HEY JUNIOR. NICE TO SEE YOU ALL HANDSOME WITH YOUR NEW LOOK. CLARIFYING QUESTION.\r\n\r\nWHERE IS THIS AUGUST 21ST MEETING AT 10:30? >> MY BAD. LAHAINA CIVIC CENTER, BUT IT'S NOT IN THE HALL. YOU GUYS -- IT'S INSIDE THE GYM, NOT IN THE HALL. NOT DOWNSTAIRS, IN THE UPSTAIRS IN THE GYM. >> OKAY. THANK YOU. >> YOU'RE WELCOME.\r\n\r\n>> MEMBER PALTIN. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU, MR. NAKOA FOR YOUR TESTIMONY. I JUST WAS WONDERING IN YOUR REFERENCE TO THE FEDS AND THE O'AHU PLANNING, AND HAWAI'I ISLAND PLANNING, HAVE YOU REACHED OUT TO THEM ABOUT MAUI COUNTY PLANNING? >> I FIGURED I WOULD TRY -- I FIGURED I WOULD GO THROUGH THE PROCESS AND TRY TO GO WITH RESPECT TO YOU GUYS. I DIDN'T CALL THEM UP, BUT I WOULDN'T GET TOO FAR WITH THEM.\r\n\r\nMAYBE WITH THIS HAPPENING, MAYBE WE'LL FINALLY GET IT -- YOU KNOW WHAT I MEAN? IT'S GOING TO BE VERY CRUCIAL TO HAVE THIS INVESTIGATION. >> AS YOU KNOW, WHATEVER HAPPENS, WE CANNOT TAKE ACTION. SOMEONE ELSE WOULD BE THE ONE TO TAKE ACTION. >> CORRECT. THAT IS WHY I WAS SAYING THAT MAYBE WITH ALL OF THIS STUFF, THEY CAN TAKE ACTION; SOMETIMES YOU HAVE TO LIGHT THE FIRE UNDER SOMEONE'S OKOLE TO MAKE THEM DO SOMETHING. WITH THIS START, I KNOW YOU CANNOT TAKE ACTION, BUT WHEN THIS STARTS MAYBE THE FEDS CAN TAKE ACTION.\r\n\r\nTHAT IS WHAT I LIKE, BECAUSE WHEN I TALKED TO THE MAYOR, HE TOLD ME TO SUE GREG BROWN. >> ONE OTHER CLARIFYING QUESTION. ARE YOU AWARE, SINCE YOU BROUGHT UP HAWAI'I COUNTY AND O'AHU ACTIONS, WAS THAT PRECEDED BY A COUNCIL INVESTIGATION, OR DID THEY JUST DO IT A DIFFERENT WAY? >> I THINK THEY DID IT A DIFFERENT WAY, ACCORDING TO THE GUYS I TALKED TO, WITH THE COVID THING, AND BROTHER WAS RUNNING FOR OFFICE RIGHT NOW. HE TOLD ME THAT IT WAS DONE BY PRIVATE -- SOMEONE, LIKE NOT YOU GUYS, NOT THE COUNCIL WHATEVER. SOMEBODY WOULD BRING IT UP AND DO THE DUE DILIGENCE TO GO PURSUE THE INVESTIGATION. >> THANK YOU.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU FOR THAT CLARIFICATION. >> ANY MORE QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? IF NOT, THANK YOU, JUNIOR. >> YOU GUYS HAVE A GOOD ONE YOU TOO. >> MR. CLERK. >> THE NEXT PERSON WE HAVE SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY IS SAM SMALL, FOLLOWED BY ROBIN KNOX.\r\n\r\n>> GOOD MORNING, SAM. >> GOOD MORNING, CHAIR LEE. THANK YOU AS ALWAYS. IT'S AN HONOR TO BE PARTICIPATING IN THIS PROCESS. I'M SO THRILLED ACTUALLY THAT YOU FOLKS ARE PURSUING THIS INVESTIGATION, REGARDLESS OF WHAT FEDERAL ACTIONS HAVE HAPPENED IN OTHER PLACES. I THINK IT'S INDICATIVE OF WHAT IS COMING HERE ON MAUI. IT'S OBVIOUS THAT THERE ARE DEEP-ROOTED PROBLEMS, AND THE COUNCIL DOES HAVE THE RESPONSIBILITY TO PURSUE ANY ISSUE THAT COMES BEFORE THE COUNCIL.\r\n\r\nTHAT IS WHAT THIS INVESTIGATION IS. IT'S HISTORIC. WE'RE THRILLED THAT THE COUNCIL RECOGNIZES ITS AUTHORITY TO BE

ABLE TO LAUNCH THIS KIND OF INVESTIGATION. IT'S NEVER HAPPENED BEFORE. IT REPRESENTS A LEVEL OF ACCOUNTABILITY THAT IS ABSOLUTELY SORELY NEEDED AT THIS TIME. THE AUDIT OF THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT WAS BRUTAL. IT'S OUT OF CONTROL.\r\n\r\nTHE STATEMENTS MADE BY THE DIRECTOR MCLEAN ARE COMPLETELY INAPPROPRIATE. THEY ARE TOTAL WITHOUT PRECEDENT. THEY ARE DOING THEIR PULLING STRINGS AND MAKING STUFF UP TO PROTECT GREG BROWN. YOU HAVE A DEVELOPMENT WITH -- YOU HAVE STACKING OF PERMITS ON TOP OF EACH OTHER THAT HAVE NEVER HAPPENED BEFORE. AND AFTER THE FACT SMA MINOR PERMIT HAS NEVER HAPPENED BEFORE. YOU HAVE -- I MEAN, HOW DO YOU REMOVE SQUARE FOOTAGE FROM A STRUCTURE THAT HAS ALREADY BEEN BUILT? JUST THE LOGIC OF IT.\r\n\r\nWE HAVE ACCUSATIONS, YOU KNOW, AFFIDAVITS OF AN UNDERSTANDING THAT BRIBES HAVE BEEN TAKEN. RESIGNATIONS BECAUSE OF THAT KIND OF STUFF. SO IT'S -- YOU KNOW, AND THE DEPARTMENT IS DESPERATE TO TRY AND STOP YOU FROM DOING THIS. DIRECTOR MCLEAN SUBMITTED TESTIMONY, WRITTEN TESTIMONY. IT'S A WHOLE POWERPOINT PRESENTATION THROUGH THE MAYOR'S OFFICE IN THE LAST COUNCIL SESSION. THEY WERE NOT INVITED. THE DIRECTOR WAS NOT INVITED TO PARTICIPATE IN THOSE SESSIONS, AND SHE SAYS, I'M SENDING THIS, BECAUSE YOU KNOW, YOU'RE NOT GIVING ME THE COURTESY.\r\n\r\nWELL, THEY DON'T DESERVE THE COURTESY AT THIS POINT. MICHELE MCLEAN IS NAMED A DEFENDANT IN THE CASE THAT WRAPS AROUND GREG BROWN AND SHE IS LIKELY TO BE INVESTIGATED IN YOUR INVESTIGATION. HOW IS THAT SHE CAN COMMENT EVEN? AND CORP. COUNSEL IS THE SAME WAY, JUST LIKE, YOU KNOW, WITH THE LIGHTING BILL. THAT CORP. COUNSEL WAS TOLD WE ONLY TO COMMENT ON LEGALITY AND FORM.\r\n\r\nAND YET, THEY HIRED A CONSULTANT, AND THEY REWROTE THE ENTIRE LEGISLATION. COMPLETELY INAPPROPRIATE, OVERSTEPPING THEIR BOUNDS. SO I URGE YOU TO USE THIS INVESTIGATION TO UNDERSTAND WHERE LEGISLATION NEEDS TO BE FIXED THAT IS YOUR JOB. WE THANK YOU FOR APPROACHING IT. USE THIS INVESTIGATION TO EXPOSE THE LOOPHOLES, FIX THE LOOPHOLES AND RESTORE THE CREDIBILITY OF OUR DEPARTMENTS. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU.\r\n\r\nMEMBERS, QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH. >> HUI HOU. >> GOOD TO SEE YOU. MR. CLERK. >> CHAIR, THE NEXT PERSON WE HAVE SIGNED UP IS ROBIN KNOX, FOLLOWED BY LISA DARCY.\r\n\r\n>> ALOHA, GOOD MORNING, COUNCIL MEMBERS. GOOD MORNING, CHAIR LEE. THANK YOU FOR ALLOWING US TO TESTIFY ON THIS AGENDA THAT IS JUST JAMMED PACKED WITH REALLY WONDERFUL THINGS. I JUST WISH I WAS FOCUSED ENOUGH TO COMMENT ON ALL OF THEM, BUT I'M JUST GOING TO LIMIT MYSELF TO FIVE OR SIX. 22-70, THE VEHICLE HABITATION. THIS IS SO IMPORTANT, AND URGENTLY NEEDED. I DO KNOW PEOPLE WHO ARE LIVING IN THEIR CARS, AND I DO KNOW THAT GETTING SLEEP IS A MAJOR COMPONENT OF HEALTH.\r\n\r\nAND THESE PEOPLE THAT I KNOW, SOME ARE FAMILIES WITH CHILDREN, SOME ARE COUPLES, WHO BOTH WORK. PEOPLE WHO OWN BUSINESSES AND THEY ARE LIVING IN THEIR CARS. IF WE COULD REMOVE THAT ANXIETY ASSOCIATED WITH NOT KNOWING IF THE POLICE ARE GOING TO WAKE YOU UP AND MAKE YOU MOVE, OR THE ANXIETY OF THINKING THAT YOU'RE IN DANGER FROM CRIMINALS FROM PREY ON PEOPLE LIKE THAT. YOU KNOW, IF WE CAN REMOVE THE LEVEL OF ANXIETY, , I THINK WE'LL SEE I'M IN SUPPORT OF THAT BILL. 22-72, THE STATE REVOLVING FUND FOR CESSPOOLS. I ATTENDED RECENTLY AT UH MAUI COLLEGE A SEMINAR GIVEN BY WASTEWATER ALTERNATIVE INNOVATIONS, THAT IS A NONPROFIT GROUP, ALONG WITH BRIDGE TO REEFS AND SUNSHINE SOLUTIONS, WHICH IS A LOCAL MAUI BUSINESS. AND THEY HAVE SOME REALLY INNOVATIVE IDEAS HOW TO REPLACE CESSPOOLS WITH SOMETHING BETTER THAN SEPTIC TANKS, WHICH ARE ESPECIALLY DIFFICULT TO INSTALL, IF YOUR LOT IS SMALL OR ON BLUE ROCK, WHERE THERE WOULD LITERALLY BE BLASTING TO PUT IN A SEPTIC TANK.\r\n\r\nIT WAS SAID IN THAT SEMINAR THAT THE LACK OF FUNDING FROM THE STATE REVOLVING FUND WAS A BIG OBSTACLE AND IF WE COULD GET THAT

FUNDING WE COULD HELP HOMEOWNERS. THERE COULD BE A GRANT TO A NONPROFIT AND THE NONPROFIT COULD HELP HOMEOWNERS CAN REPLACEMENT OF CESSPOOLS. AND TO ANSWER PRO TEM KAMA'S QUESTION ABOUT THE NUMBERS, THIS MAY NOT BE THE MOST ACCURATE NUMBER, BUT I DO RECALL IT'S IN EXCESS OF 600 CESSPOOLS IN MAUI MEADOWS. WHEN I WAS DOING RESEARCH WITH THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I, WE WERE LOOKING AT THE STABILIZING NITROGEN, THAT LED US TO BELIEVE THAT WE MIGHT BE SEEING THE EFFECTS OF CESSPOOLS THAT IS GOING INTO THE OCEAN. SO USING STATE FUNDS THAT ARE AT 1% INTEREST, I BELIEVE, FOR THOSE LOANS. SOME OF THOSE COULD BE GRANTS. THAT IS JUST A NO-BRAINER TO ME AND WE SHOULD DEFINITELY DO THAT AND I SUPPORT THAT NAPILI HOUSE, 22-73, I'M VERY MUCH IN SUPPORT OF CONTINUING INVESTIGATIONS AND FIND OUT WHAT IS GOING ON WITH PLANNING DEPARTMENT?\r\n\r\nI WILL JUST SAY IN MY OBSERVATION, IT'S NOT JUST THE GREG BROWN HOUSE IN NAPILI, BUT THERE SEEMS TO BE A PATTERN OF BEHAVIOR. SO THE MORE WE CAN FIND OUT ABOUT THAT, AND CORRECT THAT, THE BETTER OFF WE'LL BE COUNTYWIDE WITH ALL DEVELOPMENT. BILL 118, WITH THE U.S.G.S.. I WILL JUST SAY ARE THE BEST SCIENCE PEOPLE IN THE WORLD FOR WATER, AND WE DEFINITELY WANT TO SUPPORT HAVING ARRANGEMENTS WITH THEM WHERE WE CAN HAVE THEIR SUPPORT IN MANAGING OUR WATER. LASTLY 22-181, REGULATING THIS NEW PHENOMENON OF MOBILE VACATION RENTALS. THIS IS REALLY IMPORTANT TO NIP THIS IN THE BUD. THERE'S SO MANY IMPLICATIONS, AND I'M GLAD THAT YOU ARE SEEING THE DISTINCTION BETWEEN THE VACATION RENTALS, AND THE PEOPLE WHO ARE LIVING IN THEIR CARS. THE VACATION RENTALS IF THEY ARE NOT IN A COUNTY OR STATE PARK, THE CONCERN OF COURSE IS WHERE IS THEIR WASTE GOING?\r\n\r\nARE THEY ILLEGALLY PARKING AND AFFECTING NEIGHBORHOODS? AND IF THEY ARE PARKING, OR IF THEY ARE CAMPING IN AN LEGAL CAMPGROUND, THEN THEY ARE TAKING UP SPACE THAT LOCAL FAMILIES WOULD WANT TO CAMP, AND YOU KNOW, MY EXPERIENCE IS THAT IT'S HARD TO GO CAMPING, BECAUSE THERE'S NOT ENOUGH SPACES. SO I THINK WE DEFINITELY NEED TO REGULATE THAT ACTIVITY TO THE BENEFIT OF MAUI COUNTY RESIDENTS. AND THAT'S ALL OF HAD. THANK YOU FOR YOUR TIME. >> ANY QUESTIONS FOR MS. KNOX?\r\n\r\nPRO TEM KAMA. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU FOR BEING HERE THIS MORNING. SO YOU KNOW, EARLIER, THERE WAS SOMEONE WHO TESTIFIED -- OH, I THINK IT WAS MR. MORAN THAT TALKED ABOUT THE MILLION DOLLARS THAT WAS GOING TO BE PUT FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH THAT OUR MAYOR IS ENTERING INTO AN AGREEMENT TO GET THE MILLION DOLLARS TO HELP WITH WHAT YOU ARE TALKING ABOUT. ALSO THE HOMES IN MAUI MEADOWS AS ONE OF THOSE -- SO WHEN YOU'RE TALKING ABOUT THE MATCHING, WERE YOU REFERRING TO THAT MILLION DOLLARS, TOO, OR TALKING ABOUT SOMETHING ELSE? >> I WAS REFERRING TO THE STATE REVOLVING FUND IS MY UNDERSTANDING OF WHAT WE'RE TALKING ABOUT.\r\n\r\n>> YES. >> PRIOR TO THIS POINT, WHAT THE PEOPLE TOLD ME IS THAT THE MAYOR HADN'T AGREED TO AND WHY IT WASN'T GOING FORWARD. SO ANYTHING WE CAN DO TO MAKING THAT HAPPEN, A MILLION DOLLARS WILL GO A LONG WAY TO HELP THE HOMEOWNERS. BECAUSE REALLY, IF YOU THINK ABOUT IT, IT'S NOT FAIR. THEY BUILT LEGALLY. AND NOW THEY HAVE BEEN TOLD THIS IS NOT GOOD AND IT'S REALLY TOXIC. >> YES.\r\n\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU. >> THANK YOU CHAIR. >> ANY OTHER QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU, ROBIN. >> THANK YOU. >> MR. CLERK.\r\n\r\n>> CHAIR, THE NEXT PERSON WE HAVE SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY IS LISA DARCY, FOLLOWED BY FAITH CHASE. >> GOOD MORNING, COUNCIL. >> GOOD MORNING. >> NICE TO SEE EVERYONE. MY NAME IS LISA DARCY, AND I'M THE FOUNDER OF SHARE YOUR MANA AND COMMISSION ON HEALING SOLUTIONS FOR HOMELESSNESS. I HAVE LONG COVID. SO I DIDN'T GET A CHANCE TO LOOK AT THE ENTIRE AGENDA, LIKE ROBIN SAID.\r\n\r\n\r\nI WOULD LIKE TO TESTIFY ON 22-70. AND I WANT TO ACKNOWLEDGE THIS COUNCIL THROUGH A LOT OF DISCOMFORT HAS LISTENED TO PEOPLE WITH

LIVED EXPERIENCE. THERE WAS A LOT OF TIME DURING THE PANDEMIC, WHERE SHARE YOUR MANA BROUGHT FORWARD INFORMATION THAT WAS VERY UNCOMFORTABLE THIS GROUP EMBODIED IT, AND I JUST WANT TO PUBLICLY THANK ALL OF THE PEOPLE, WHO TRUSTED SHARE YOUR MANA IN THE VISION THAT WHEN THIS COUNCIL UNDERSTOOD WHAT THEY WERE GOING THROUGH, THEY WOULD ACT. THEY WOULD ACT. AND THIS BILL DEMONSTRATES THAT YOU LISTENED, AND YOU HEARD THEM, AND YOU'RE ACTING. SO ONE IS THAT I JUST WANT TO SAY, I WANT TO THANK ALL THE PEOPLE WITH LIVED EXPERIENCE WHO DID SHARE EVERYTHING. I ALSO WANT TO THANK THE COUNCIL FOR LISTENING, AND REALLY LISTENING THROUGH ALL OF THE HARSHNESS OF IT. AND LASTLY TO SAY THIS BRINGS HOPE.\r\n\r\nIT'S ONE OF THOSE INVISIBLE INGREDIENTS THAT WE DON'T CAPTURE DATA. HOPE DOESN'T GET A PIECE OF A REPORT. AND THIS IS ACTUALLY SOMETHING THAT DEMONSTRATES HOPE. AS WE KNOW HOPE CAN BE A LIFELINE FOR EVERY ONE OF US AS A HUMAN BEING. I'M FULLY SUPPORTING IT. I NEVER THOUGHT THIS DAY WOULD COME, AND HAS GOT SUPPORT. I'M SORRY, IT'S NOT THAT I DIDN'T TRUST EVERYBODY, BUT IT WAS IS HARD.\r\n\r\nYOU DIDN'T SEE WHAT I'M SEEING ALL THE TIME. PEOPLE WERE TERRIFIED TO SHARE THIS. AND NOW THAT SO MANY COMMUNITY MEMBERS ARE ALSO JUMPED IN AND SAID, HEY, I SEE THIS, TOO. THIS IS REALLY IMPORTANT. WE'RE JUST GOING TO HAVE TO WIN THE ADMINISTRATION OVER WITH -- WE'RE SO STOKED FOR SUCCESS. AND YOU KNOW, IF YOU DON'T -- IF YOU ARE CAUTIOUS, BE CAUTIOUS. BUT IT'S READY TO GO.\r\n\r\nIT'S MAKING REASONABLE STEPS, AND I AM SO GRATEFUL TO EVERY BEING, AND ALL OF THE PEOPLE THAT ARE TRUSTED THIS PROCESS. IT'S A DIFFICULT PROCESS. HURRAY. THANK YOU. THANK YOU FOR BEING THERE. REALLY APPRECIATE THIS COUNCIL. >> THANK YOU, LISA.\r\n\r\nWE HAVE A QUESTION FOR YOU FROM MEMBER JOHNSON. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. GOOD MORNING, COMMISSIONER DARCY, GOOD TO SEE YOU. I KNOW YOU DO A LOT OF OUTREACH. CAN YOU COME AND LET THE COMMUNITY KNOW, OR THE COUNCIL KNOW THE FEEDBACK THAT YOU HAVE GOTTEN FROM THIS? WHAT IS THE WORD ON THE STREET? ARE THEY REALLY HAPPY ABOUT THIS?\r\n\r\n>> I SHOULD ACTUALLY MAKE A VIDEO. BUT YOU KNOW, I DO EVERYTHING. SO IT'S HARD. THE WORD ON THE STREET, IF I WERE TO USE LOCAL IS NAH. NAH. THAT IS WHAT I GET, NAH, IT'S REALLY HAPPENING? I GO, I TOLD YOU, YOU HAVE TO JUMP IN ON THIS TRAIN FOR THE LONG HAUL.\r\n\r\nTHIS IS NOT SOMETHING THAT WE'LL TAKE ONE LITTLE PROTEST, YOU KNOW, OR ONE BEGGING. THIS IS THE LONG HAUL. YOU GOT TO JUMP ON THE TRAIN, AND I -- PEOPLE ARE IN SHOCK. THEY ARE IN SHOCK. >> GREAT. THAT IS WONDERFUL TO HEAR. >> THANK YOU.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU FOR HISTORICALLY BRINGING INDIVIDUALS, WHO HAD THE EXPERIENCE. THEY'RE THE EXPERTS. I LEARNED EVERYTHING FROM THEM. I MEAN, I HAVE -- I HAVE STUDIED A LOT, AND I HAVE READ A LOT -- AND MET A LOT OF PEOPLE INTERNATIONALLY -- ANYWAY YOU ARE THE ONES THAT BROUGHT THOSE INDIVIDUALS UP TO HEAR IT THROUGH THEIR EXPERIENCE, AND THAT IS WHERE WE LEARN AND WHERE THE RUBBER MEETS THE ROAD. >> THANK YOU. THERE'S A LOT OF MOMENTS THAT WE HAVE IN THIS COUNCIL THAT WE'LL NEVER FORGET AND THAT WAS ONE OF THEM, WHEN THOSE FOLKS CAME OUT TO TESTIFY. THANK YOU SO MUCH.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU, CHAIR. NO FURTHER QUESTIONS. >> ANY MORE QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH, LISA. GOOD TO SEE YOU. >> MAHALO. >> MR.\r\n\r\nCLERK. >> CHAIR, THE NEXT PERSON WE HAVE SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY IS FAITH CHASE -- FAITH CHASE IS ACTUALLY THE LAST PERSON WE HAVE SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY FOR THIS TIME PERIOD. SO IF ANYONE WOULD LIKE TO TESTIFY ON ALL REMAINING AGENDA ITEMS AT THIS TIME PLEASE IDENTIFY YOURSELF IN THE MEETING CHAT. THANK YOU. >> GOOD MORNING. >> GOOD MORNING. >> GOOD MORNING, CHAIR LEE.\r\n\r\nGOOD MORNING, COUNCIL. I AM IN VERY MUCH SUPPORT OF THIS CHANGING OF THE CHARTER, I GUESS -- WHAT IS IT? IT'S THE COUNTY CODE, I'M SORRY. RELATING TO THE USE OF VEHICLE

FOR PURPOSES OF HUMAN HABITATION. IT'S A LONG TIME -- I SPOKE ABOUT THIS IN COMMITTEE. I'M A LITTLE -- I'M A LITTLE CONCERNED ABOUT -- I WATCHED THE MAYORAL DEBATE ON PBS LAST TIME AND I'M A LITTLE CONCERNED ABOUT SOME OF THE COMMENTS MADE ABOUT THE PARKING LOTS BEING RESERVED FOR THE TOURISTS, AND I DON'T THINK THAT'S -- I DON'T THINK THAT IS A NECESSARY CONVERSATION RIGHT NOW, AS IT RELATES TO THE PARKING LOT. IT'S TAKEN US SO LONG TO GET WHERE WE ARE.\r\n\r\nI JUST WANT TO SAY, I APPRECIATE IT AND I HOPE IT'S A UNANIMOUS VOTE. BUT ALSO, KIND OF HIGHLIGHT THE INTERESTING -- YOU KNOW, THE MAYOR -- YOU KNOW, IN THE INTERIM OF THIS BEING SOLID AND PAU, I WOULD REALLY HOPE IF THERE'S ANY PRESENTATION FROM THE MAUI POLICE DEPARTMENT AND MAYOR'S OFFICE WE'RE CONSCIENTIOUS ABOUT ANY TICKETS THAT SHOULDN'T BE GIVEN, BECAUSE UNTIL A SAID PARKING LOT IS CHOSEN, AND THE BEAUTIFUL \$200,000 FOR A SAFE PARKING LOT IS COMPLETE. IN INTERIM, CAN WE BE REALLY, REALLY COMPASSIONATE AND UNDERSTANDING OF THOSE WHO ARE NEEDING THAT VEHICLE SPACE UNTIL THEN? I KNOW I HAVE SAID IT BEFORE IN COMMITTEE, BUT I SPENT 60 HOURS TALKING TO COMMUNITY POLICING AND WHOEVER WAS ON DUTY, TRYING TO MAKE SURE THAT PEOPLE DON'T GET ARRESTED FOR HUMAN HABITATION, EVEN \$30 IS A HARDSHIP FOR PEOPLE. SO IF EVERYBODY COULD KEEP THAT IN MIND. IF YOU THINK ABOUT IT THIS IS AN ACT OF OMISSION THAT WE HAVE A PROBLEM. MY OLDEST DAUGHTER AND LISA DARCY SPENT COUNTLESS HOURS IN COURT REPRESENTING THESE PEOPLE.\r\n\r\nI ECHO WHAT LISA DARCY SAID AND HAPPY HER WORK IS COMING TO FRUITION. I WOULD LIKE TO MAKE A COMMENT ON THE AXIS DEER. THE FENCING, I DIDN'T GET TO GO IT THAT COMMITTEE MEETING, BUT I WANTED TO SAY TO KEEP AN OPEN MIND ABOUT THAT GRANT THAT IS ALSO RELATED TO PAYING FOR FENCING TO HELP PROTECT FARMS AND RANCHES AND PEOPLE'S PROPERTIES. THE OVERALL FEEDBACK IS THAT 12 ACRES IS ACTUALLY A BIG STRETCH. SO IF THERE IS FEEDBACK THAT COMES BACK, OR IF NOT ALL APPLICANTS GO TO SEEK FUNDING, TO FIND FLEXIBILITY OR EXCEPTIONS. I PREDICT THAT WILL BE AROUND THE CORNER. NOT EVERYBODY IS LARGE LANDOWNERS.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU FOR YOUR TIME. >> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH, FAITH. >> ALOHA. >> ALOHA. MR.\r\n\r\nCLERK. >> CHAIR, THE NEXT PERSON WE HAVE SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY IS KANANA [INAUDIBLE]. >> YES, GOOD MORNING EVERYBODY. >> GOOD MORNING. >> CAN YOU HEAR ME? >> YES. >> THANK YOU VERY MUCH. FIRST I WOULD LIKE TO THANK YOU GUYS FOR HOLDING THIS MEETING TODAY AND ALLOWING ME TO TESTIFY.\r\n\r\nI'M TESTIFYING ON BEHALF OF THE NAPILI BAY COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION, AND THE PEOPLE THAT LIVE DIRECTLY ACROSS GREG BROWN'S HOUSE. (LISTING 'OHANAS) ACROSS THE STREET THAT ARE VERY UPSET ABOUT THIS BUILDING BEING ERECTED BY GREG BROWN. I'M TESTIFYING IN SUPPORT OF 22-73, AUDITING THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT AND PUBLIC WORKS. I WOULD LIKE TO THANK TAMARA PALTIN FOR ADDRESSING THIS ISSUE. YOU KNOW, I HAVE A COUPLE OF CONCERNS. I HAVE SEEN THE LETTER THAT MICHELE MCLEAN WROTE WITH THE MAYOR'S STAMP AND HAS SOME WHEREAS'S -- WHEREAS, THIS, WHEREAS, THAT AND THE ONE WHEREAS, THAT I REMEMBER, WHEN SHE CAME TO THE MEETING WITH US DOWN THERE, SHE FLAT-OUT SAID IF SHE WAS IN THE OFFICE AT THE TIME, SHE WOULD NOT HAVE APPROVED THIS PERMIT. YET, SHE IS STILL TRYING TO FIGHT THIS INVESTIGATION, AND PROVIDING TESTIMONY -- WRITING WRITTEN TESTIMONY DID YOU GO TO YOU GUYS OR EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE, BUT SOME SUNSHINE LAW I THINK WAS VIOLATED WITH THAT, IF SHE IS ALLOWED TO DO THAT -- HER AND CORP.\r\n\r\nCOUNSEL, SEEMS LIKE THEY ARE ALWAYS TRYING TO BLOCK THINGS THAT YOU ARE DOING FOR THE BETTERMENT OF THE COMMUNITY. I WOULD LIKE TO COMMEND YOU GUYS FOR GO WITH THIS. YOU KNOW, I WOULD ALSO LIKE -- I DON'T KNOW HOW YOU ARE GOING TO DO, BUT INDEPENDENT COUNSEL TO BE INVOLVED. I DON'T KNOW CORP. COUNSEL -- I HAD A BOARD OF ETHICS COMPLAINT WITH MOANA

LUTEY AND CORP. COUNSEL WITH THE BRIBERY I HAVE SEEN AND WITNESSED IN THE PLANNING DEPARTMENT. FIRST ONE HAPPENED WITH WAIKIKI -- THERE SHOULD BE DOCUMENTATION ON THAT.\r\n\r\n2012, AROUND THERE. IT WAS HARD BACK THEN. I WASN'T INTO THE POLITICAL SCENE AT THAT TIME, BUT WHEN WE BROUGHT IT UP TO OUR ADMINISTRATION, THERE WAS PUSH-BACK. HE KEPT SAYING YOU KNOW HOW HARD IT IS TO FIRE A PUBLIC EMPLOYEE AND WE REALLY WANT THIS TO MOVE FORWARD. WE COMMEND YOU, TAMARA, THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR INTRODUCING THIS. HOPEFULLY, MAYBE YOU, MIKE MOLINA YOU CAN DO AN INDEPENDENT INVESTIGATION. BECAUSE WHAT MOANA SAID IN THE GREAT MEETING WAS IN COUNCIL CHAMBERS.\r\n\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU FOR ALLOWING ME TO TESTIFY. YOU GUYS HAVE A GREAT DAY. >> QUESTIONS. MEMBER PALTIN. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU FOR YOUR TESTIMONY. MY CLARIFYING QUESTION, WHEN YOU SAID THAT YOU'RE TESTIFYING ON BEHALF OF THE NAPILI BAY COMMUNITY ASSOCIATION LAST TIME WHEN WE HAD THIS ITEM IN COMMITTEE, SOME OF YOUR MEMBERS WERE SAYING THAT THEY WERE GOING TO GET TO SOME AFFIDAVITS AND JUST CLARIFYING THAT WE NEVER DID RECEIVE ANY OF THOSE.\r\n\r\n\r\nMY RECOLLECTION ALSO WAS THAT IT WENT BEFORE THE BOARD. I'M NOT PLANNING ON SCHEDULING IT UNTIL WE RECEIVE THE DOCUMENTS, BECAUSE THAT IS THE NEW INFORMATION THAT YOU WERE SAYING IN COMMITTEE; RIGHT? >> RIGHT. THE AFFIDAVITS REGARDING CORP. COUNSEL? >> I DON'T KNOW. I DIDN'T RECEIVE THEM.\r\n\r\n\r\nYOU WERE GUYS WERE SAYING YOU HAD ALL OF THESE THINGS AND I DIDN'T RECEIVE THEM. >> I STILL HAVE AFFIDAVITS. YES, I WILL DEFINITELY -- I HAVE FORWARDED OVER TO ANOTHER BOARD MEMBER. SO WE NEED TO -- I WILL GET THAT TO YOU AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, TAMARA. THANK YOU FOR CLARIFYING AND BRINGING THAT TO MY ATTENTION. >> THANK YOU ANY OTHER QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? MEMBER PRO TEM KAMA.\r\n\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU FOR BEING HERE. SO YOU MENTIONED IN YOUR TESTIMONY THAT YOU WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE GREAT COMMITTEE DO A FURTHER INVESTIGATION. SO ARE YOU LOOKING -- SO THE PSLU IS GOING TO LOOK INTO A FORMAL INVESTIGATION. WHAT ARE YOU ASKING THE GREAT COMMITTEE TO DO? >> YOU KNOW, MOANA HAD MADE SOME STATEMENTS ABOUT HER DOING -- THAT IS WHAT MY BOARD OF ETHICS COMPLAINT WAS FILED ON. SHE HAD STATED DURING THE GREAT COMMITTEE THAT PLANNING HAD DONE AN INVESTIGATION, AND I HAD STATED THAT USUALLY WHEN -- SHE HAD TOLD ME HERSELF TO CALL CID TO GET INFORMATION ON THEIR INVESTIGATION.\r\n\r\n\r\nAND I DID, AND CID TOLD ME THEY DIDN'T HAVE ANYTHING. NO RECORD OF ANYTHING FROM CORP. COUNSEL OR PLANNING, OR ANY TYPE OF ALLEGED BRIBES. SO YOU KNOW, AS A PRIVATE CITIZEN, WHO HAS SOME LAWYERS IN THEIR FAMILY, LAWYERS USUALLY HAVE TO TELL THE TRUTH. SHE IS GOING SEND ME TO OTHER ENTITIES TO FIND DOCUMENTS, AND THEY ARE NOT THERE, THEN, YOU KNOW, WHY WOULD SHE DO THAT? THAT IS MY UNDERSTANDING OF THE MY BOARD OF ETHICS COMPLAINT WAS REFERRED TO THE ODC, REFERRED BY CORP. COUNSEL TO FORWARD TO ODC, BECAUSE OF CHARTER AMENDMENTS THEY'RE NOT -- IT'S NOT THEIR JURISDICTION TO SETTLE THESE COMPLAINTS.\r\n\r\n\r\nTHAT IS WHERE MY BOARD OF ETHICS COMPLAINT IS GOING NEXT TO ODC. I DON'T KNOW WHAT I CAN DO? FOR ME, AS A DAD, AND BUSINESS OWNER, AND SOMEBODY WHO IS REALLY BUSY, I DON'T HAVE TIME TO CHASE AROUND AT THE REQUEST FROM MOANA LUTEY TO ASK HER WHEN WAS IT DONE? AND SHE TOLD ME IT WAS INDEPENDENT IN-HOUSE INVESTIGATION, AND CID, BECAUSE BRIBERY WAS SAID, THAT CID WOULD HAVE TO HAVE CALLED CID, WHICH I DID. AND THEY DIDN'T HAVE A RECORD. SO IT'S -- I JUST KIND OF WANT ANSWERS, IF THEY REALLY DID AN INVESTIGATION? YOU KNOW?\r\n\r\n\r\nTHE THING THAT REALLY GETS ME, SHE USED TO LIVE RIGHT THERE, RIGHT IN THAT AREA OF GREG BROWN. SO WITH HER TELLING ME SOMETHING, I KIND OF FEEL AS A LAHAINALUNA GRADUATE, ONE YEAR OLDER THAN ME AND GOOD FRIEND WITH MY COUSIN, I PLAYED ON THE FOOTBALL TEAM, ALL OF THAT CAME INTO PLAY,

TELLING ME, WOW, THIS IS WHAT -- TO ME IT WAS FRUSTRATE BECAUSE SHE IS THE DIRECTOR OF CORPORATE COUNSEL AND SHE LED ME ON A WILD GOOSE CHASE OF SOMETHING THAT NEVER HAPPENED. SO I'M UPSET ABOUT THAT. IT TOOK ME -- WASTED AN HOUR OF TIME I COULD HAVE SPENT WITH MY KIDS SURFING OR COACHING KIDS IN FOOTBALL I WOULD DO RIGHT NOW, WITH FOOTBALL. JUST HANGING OUT WITH DOING THINGS OTHER THAN. >> KAMANU, I THINK YOU HAVE ANSWERED HER QUESTION. THERE WILL BE OPPORTUNITIES TO FURTHER DISCUSS THIS MATTER.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU VERY MUCH. SORRY FOR TAKING SO LONG. I'M PASSIONATE ABOUT IT. >> WE KNOW YOU ARE. ANY MORE QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? IF NOT, THANK YOU KAMANU. >> YOU HAVE A GOOD DAY.\r\n\r\nALOHA. >> ALOHA. >> CHAIR NEXT PERSON WE HAVE SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY IS KALUA PALEKA. >> MAHALO. ALOHA EVERYONE. ALOHA KAKOU TO ALL OF YOU. I'M VERY EXCITED ABOUT THIS COUNTY COUNCIL AND A LOT OF THINGS I HAVE BEEN PASSIONATE ABOUT HAVE REALLY BEEN MOVING FORWARD.\r\n\r\nI THINK THIS IS ONE OF THEM. THANK YOU FOR THE GOOD THAT YOU ARE DOING, AND YOU CONTINUE TO DO FOR BETTERMENT OF OUR COMMUNITY. ESPECIALLY IN SEEING THE VALUE OF WORKING TOWARDS PLACES THAT PROVIDE IMPACTFUL 'AINA-BASED EDUCATION AND THAT ARE OF EXTREME VALUE TO OUR CULTURE. THIS SCHOOL PROVIDES THIS EDUCATIONAL SETTING AND AS A SHORT BACKGROUND, I JUST GRADUATED FROM THIS AMAZING GRADUATE PROGRAM OFFERED THROUGH THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MANA'O. MY FOCUS WAS CURRICULUM STUDIES AND IMPORTANCE OF PLACE-BASED LEARNING, AS WELL AS BEING CRITICAL OF THE CURRICULUM THAT WE'RE TEACHING TO OUR STUDENTS. I KNOW THAT THE CHALLENGE IN THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION IN PUBLIC D.O.E.. SO SUCH EXTREME VALUE FOR SCHOOLS THAT HAVE MORE FREEDOM TO TEACH AND DO WHAT THEY WANT TO DO. I THINK KE KULA O PI'ILANI IS ONE OF THEM. SO I WANTED TO OFFER MY SUPPORT IN FAVOR OF BILL 123. AND I'M A PARENT OF A CHILD WHO ATTENDS THIS SCHOOL.\r\n\r\nHE IS CURRENTLY IN 5TH GRADE, BUT HE HAS BEEN ATTENDING THAT SCHOOL SINCE HE WAS IN KINDERGARTEN. SO HE HAS BEEN A STUDENT FOR THE PAST FIVE YEARS, WHICH MEANS HIS FAMILY, AS WELL AS BEEN A PART OF THIS SCHOOL FOR THE FIVE YEARS. I WANTED TO ADD THAT I HAVE WITNESSED JUST FIRSHTHAND HIS GROWTH AS A CHILD, AS A KEIKI AND STUDENT, AND INTERWEAVING DIVERSE SYSTEMS OF KNOWLEDGE. TALKING ABOUT HAWAIIAN KNOWLEDGE, HAWAIIAN WAYS OF KNOWING, AS WELL AS WESTERN WAYS OF KNOWING, TOO. HIS UNDERSTANDING OF PLACE, AND LEARNING FROM PLACE. AND IN TURN, THAT HAS FOSTERED A TRUE ALOHA FOR OUR PLACE, OUR HOME, MAUI, THIS 'AINA OF WAILUKU AND ESPECIALLY THE LOVE OF LEARNING. I THINK ALL CHILDREN NEED TO HAVE REALLY AND TRULY THAT FOUNDATION OF A LOVE FOR LEARNING THAT SETS THEM UP FOR THEIR FUTURE AS WELL, TOO.\r\n\r\nI HAVE SEEN HIM BEING GROUNDED IN HAWAIIAN PRACTICES AND AT THE SAME TIME, HE IS LEARNING SCIENCE AND MATH THAT OTHER PEERS ARE LEARNING. I ATTRIBUTE THIS TO KE KULA O PI'ILANI FOR GROUNDING HIM IN WHERE HE COMES FROM AND NURTURING HIM TO BE A LIFE-LONG LEARNER. SO THIS MORNING I ASKED HIM WHY HE LIKES IT SO MUCH? BECAUSE HE IS ONE OF THOSE KIDS SO EXCITED TO BE IN SCHOOL. HE SAID TO ME, WE DO A LOT OF FUN STUFF AND DO EXPERIMENTS AT THE STREAM. IF THERE'S LEAD IN THE STREAM, AND HE IS LIKE, I LIKE MY SCHOOL, BECAUSE WE DO A LOT OF EXPLORING. SO IF YOU THINK ABOUT IT, THIS IS WHAT MY HOPE AND DREAM IS FOR EVERY CHILD IN HAWAI'I. SO AGAIN, I JUST WANTED TO OFFER MY SUPPORT IN THAT BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE BILL NO.\r\n\r\n123. I REALLY HOPE YOU MOVE FORWARD FOR THIS, BECAUSE FOR ALL OF OUR KEIKI OF HAWAI'I AND ESPECIALLY THIS AMAZING PLACE OF LEARNING. MAHALO TO ALL OF YOU AND THANK YOU FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK. >> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, ANY QUESTIONS? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR YOUR TESTIMONY. SO MR. CLERK, DO WE HAVE ANY MORE TESTIFIERS?\r\n\r\n>> CHAIR, THERE ARE NO OTHERS THAT HAVE INDICATED THAT

THEY WOULD LIKE TO TESTIFY DURING THIS TIME WE'LL DO A LAST CALL IF THERE'S ANYBODY. >> THERE IS ONE. >> ONE MORE. >> HELLO? >> YEAH. SORRY. I JUST PUNCHED IN.\r\n\r\n>> AUNTIE MATZIE GOOD MORNING. >> GOOD MORNING. I'M SORRY TO JUST BARGE IN. >> NO, NO, FOR THE RECORD, CAN YOU STATE YOUR NAME, SO THAT WE GOT IT DOWN ON THE RECORD. >> YES. MY NAME IS -- ALSO KNOWN AS AUNTIE MATZIE AND MAHALO FOR ALL YOU DO FOR US FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI. I NORMALLY LISTEN, TRY TO LISTEN TO THE MEETINGS, AND BELIEVE IT OR NOT I'M WASHING CLOTHES OUT HERE, TRYING TO GET THINGS DONE.\r\n\r\nI'M CONCERNED ABOUT CR22-70, AND I JUST SPEAK FOR PA'IA ALONE. I AM ALL FOR CARING FOR THE HOMELESS AND CARING FOR A PLACE FOR THEM TO SLEEP. HOWEVER, I HAVE RESERVATIONS IN THE AREAS THAT YOU CHOOSE. ESPECIALLY THE PUBLIC AREAS IN PA'IA AND I KNOW YOU HEARD ABOUT THE FIRE THAT WE HAD LAST FRIDAY. THAT THE VACANT LOT ACROSS THE STREET WITH MILLIONS OF CARS AND SOME OF THOSE CARS ARE PEOPLE THAT THEY USE TO SLEEP IN. SO IN MOVING FORWARD WITH THIS BILL AND PROCESS, I BEG YOU TO TAKE EVERYTHING INTO CONSIDERATION, THE SAFETY OF THE PEOPLE, THE PUBLIC AREAS THAT YOU CHOOSE, THAT BELONG TO THE COUNTY OF MAUI. IF THERE'S VACANT PLACES THAT YOU CAN PURCHASE, THAT WOULD BE GREAT -- PARKING LOT FOR SAFETY FOR THEM PEOPLE TO PUT THEIR HEADS DOWN.\r\n\r\nI KNOW THERE'S MANY OF THEM. I CATEGORIZE THEM AS HOMELESS AND HELPLESS. WE NEED TO KEEP THE HELPLESS OUT THERE, TAKE CARE OF THEM, BUT WE ALSO NEED TO CARE FOR THE PEOPLE IN A HAVE TO REST THEIR HEADS AND CARE FOR THEIR CHILDREN, BATHROOM FACILITIES, SHOWERS, ALL OF THAT IS INVOLVED IN ALL OF THIS. SO I JUST AM IN FAVOR OF MOVING FORWARD WITH THIS, BUT WITH RESERVATIONS OF WHERE YOU HAVE IT, HOW YOU SET UP THE SECURITY, AND THE FENCING. IF YOU ARE GOING TO HAVE LOCKED GATES, YOU REALLY NEED 24/7 SECURITY THERE. SO IF ANYTHING HAPPENS, THEY'LL BE ABLE TO EXIT WITH CAUTION. MAHALO FOR ALL YOU DO AGAIN.\r\n\r\nMAHALO FOR ALLOWING ME TO BARGE IN AND SHARE MY MANA'O. YOU ALL HAVE A BLESSED DAY. >> THANK YOU. MEMBERS, DO WE HAVE ANY QUESTIONS FOR AUNTIE MATZIE? IF NOT, THANK YOU VERY MUCH FOR JOINING US TODAY. ALOHA. >> ALOHA. >> MR.\r\n\r\nCLERK. TO ADOPT THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN COMMITTEE REPORT 22-70. >> SECOND. >>
MOVED BY MEMBER JOHNSON AND SECONDED BY MEMBER KING TO APPROVE THE
RECOMMENDATIONS IN COMMITTEE REPORT 22-70. DISCUSSION, MR.
JOHNSON.\r\n\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU, CHAIR. YOUR COMMITTEE MET JULY 14THION TO
DISCUSS BILL 108 ENTITLED, "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING 10.76 AND
SECTION 13.04A.70 MAUI COUNTY CODE RELATING TO THE USE OF VEHICLES FOR
PURPOSES OF HUMAN HABITATION IN COUNTY PARKING LOTS." THE PURPOSE IS TO
LAY THE GROUND WORK FOR ESTABLISHING A PILOT PROJECT FOR HOUSELESS
PERSONS TO TEMPORARILY USE THEIR VEHICLES FOR PURPOSES OF HUMAN
HABITATION ON COUNTY PROPERTY. UNDER CURRENT STATE LAW IT'S PROHIBITED TO

USE ANY VEHICLE FROM THE HOURS OF 6:00 P.M. TO 6:00 A.M. WHILE PARKED ON ROADWAY, STREET HIGHWAY, OR OTHER PUBLIC-PRIVATE PROPERTY. STATE LAW ALLOWS EACH COUNTY TO ENACT THEIR OWN ORDINANCES REGULATING THE USES OF VEHICLES FOR PURPOSES OF HUMAN HABITATION. BILL 108 WOULD ENABLE THE COUNTY TO ESTABLISH A SAFE SLEEPING ZONE FOR OUR HOUSELESS FOLKS. A PICTURE PROJECT ALLOCATION OF \$200,000 IN FY'2023 BUDGET AND THE CHALLENGES THAT ARE FACED INCLUDING POLICE COMPLAINTS, NED TO RELOCATE FREQUENTLY, THEFT, ASSAULT AND LACK OF BASIS NECESSITIES, SUCH AS WATER AND RESTROOMS. SAFE SLEEPING SITE AS THE PARKING LOTS THAT ARE CONTROLLED, AND SUPERVISED BY THE COUNTY WOULD PROTECT OUR MOST VULNERABLE COMMUNITY MEMBERS, INCLUDING ONSITE WRAP AROUND SERVICES TO HELP TRANSITION INTO BETTER LIVING SITUATIONS.\r\n\r\nTHESE WOULD BE DISCUSSED ONCE THE PROJECT IS READY TO BE INTRODUCED. BEFORE US TODAY IS THE ENABLING LEGISLATION TO ESTABLISH THE PROJECT AS A TEMPORARY RESPONSE TO HOUSELESSNESS. YOUR COMMITTEE VOTED 7-0 TO RECOMMEND PASSAGE OF 108, CD 1 ON FIRST READING AND RESPECTFULLY REQUEST MEMBERS' SUPPORT OF MY MOTION. >> ANY FURTHER DISCUSSION? MEMBER KING. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. I JUST WANT TO THANK COUNCIL MEMBER GABE JOHNSON, WHO CHAIRS THE AFFORDABLE HOUSING COMMITTEE FOR EXPEDITING THIS ON YOUR AGENDA, MR.\r\n\r\nJOHNSON. IT'S VERY IMPORTANT TO MOVE THE GRANT PROJECT AS YOU KNOW, AND ALSO, FOR HAVING FORESIGHT TO BRING ON -- I WANT TO THANK THE TESTIFIERS, AND RESOURCE PEOPLE THAT WE HAD. BECAUSE WE HAD LISA DARCY, WHO PUSHED THROUGH HER COVID ILLNESS AND CAME ON VIRTUALLY TO BE A RESOURCE PERSON AND HAD THREE MOST EXPERT PEOPLE WHO ARE ACTUALLY LIVING THE EXPERIENCE, NOT EVER THINKING THAT THEY WOULD BE IN THIS SITUATION, THAT CAME IN AND ADVISED THE COMMITTEE THAT WAS VERY BRAVE AND THANK THE COUNCIL FOR THE LEVEL OF RESPECT AND REVERENCE THAT THEY GAVE TO THE PEOPLE FOR COMING FORWARD AND SHARING THEIR EXPERIENCES WITH US. SO I SPEAK IN STRONG SUPPORT OF THE MOTION AND REALLY LOOKING FORWARD TO MOVING AHEAD WITH THE GRANT PROJECT. >> THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. THANK YOU, MEMBERS. >> CHAIR, YOU HAVE BEFORE YOU BEFORE YOUR AGRICULTURE AND PUBLIC TRUST COMMITTEE, COMMITTEE REPORT 22-71, RECOMMENDING THAT BILL 101 CD 1 (2022) ENTITLED, "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 16.26B.105 MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO FENCE HEIGHTS FOR AIS DEER CONTROL," BE PASSED ON FIRST READING AND ORDERED TO PRINT.\r\n\r\n>> MEMBER SINENCI. >> MAHALO, CHAIR. I MOVE TO ADOPT THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN COMMITTEE REPORT 22-71. >> SECOND. >> MOVED BY MEMBER SINENCI. SECONDED BY MEMBER SUGIMURA TO APPROVE THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN COMMITTEE REPORT 22-71. DISCUSS, MR. SINENCI. >> MAHALO, CHAIR YOUR COMMITTEE MET JULY 12TH AND DISCUSSED BILL 102 ENTITLED, "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 16.26B.105 OF THE MAUI COUNTY CODE RELATING TO

FENCE HIGHLIGHTS FOR AXIS DEER CONTROL." BILL 101'S PURPOSE IS TO ALLOW THE CONSTRUCTION AND EXISTING USE OF FENCES OVER 7' IN HEIGHT WITHOUT A BUILDING PERMIT WHEN SUCH FENCES ARE USED FOR AXIS DEER MITIGATION.\r\n\r\nYOUR COMMITTEE NOTED AN ESTIMATED 60,000 AXIS DEER MANY MAUI COUNTY WITH AXIS DEER ON MOLOKA'I ON PACE TO OUTNUMBER RESIDENTS 10:1. YOUR COMMITTEE ALSO NOTED PREVIOUS AXIS DEER-RELATED EMERGENCY PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR, WHICH HAS ALREADY RESULTED IN FENCES OVER 7' HIGH. YOUR COMMITTEE DISCUSSED THE BENEFITS OF ALLOWING THESE FENCES TO PROTECT AGRICULTURAL OPERATIONS FROM THE EXTENSIVE AND COSTLY DAMAGE THAT AXIS DEER CAN CAUSE TO PASTURES, NATIVE VEGETATION, IRRIGATION, ANIMAL AND CROPS. CHAIR, YOUR COMMITTEE AMEND BILL 101 TO ALSO PROTECT CONSERVATION AREAS, CULTURAL SITES, AND PUBLIC ROADWAYS FROM AXIS DEER INCURSION AND USED THE DEFINITION OF "FENCES" PROVIDED IN TITLE 19. ALL FENCING WILL NOT SOLVE THE PROBLEM OF UNMANAGEABLE AXIS DEER POPULATIONS, BILL 101 AS AMENDED WILL ALLOW SOME MEASURE OF PROTECTIONS FOR OUR FARMERS, RANCHERS AND CONSERVATIONISTS. YOUR COMMITTEE VOTED IN FAVOR TO RECOMMEND THE PASSAGE OF BILL ON FIRST READING AND RESPECTFULLY REQUEST MEMBERS' SUPPORT OF MY MOTION. THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU. ANY MORE DISCUSSION?\r\n\r\nMEMBER PALTIN. >> I JUST WANTED TO ADD TO THE DISCUSSION THAT THE DEFINITION OF "FENCE" IS SEPARATE FROM THE DEFINITION OF "WALL." AS TESTIFIERS COMMENTED FOR THE RECORD. THANK YOU. >> MEMBER SUGIMURA. >> JUST SO THE COMMITTEE KNOWS, I CHECKED WITH LANCE DE SILVA WITH DLNR ON THIS BILL AND THEY SAID THEIR FENCES WITH DLNR REGARDING MITIGATION IS KIND OF STANDARD. HE ALSO SAID THAT THEY ALSO FOLLOW STATE LAW CHAPTER 343 ENVIRONMENTAL COMPLIANCE. SO THEIR HEIGHT IS SOMEWHAT REGULATED.\r\n\r\nHE SAID THIS BILL WILL BE GOOD FOR PRIVATE LANDOWNERS TO HELP WITH MITIGATION. WHENEVER WE HAVE A GOVERNOR'S PROCLAMATION, WHICH WE'RE NOW IN THE THIRD ONE, THAT PUTTING UP FENCES, AND IT ALLOWS ACTION TO BE TAKEN WITHOUT GOING THROUGH THE NORMAL PROCESS. ONE OF IT IS THE PERMITTING PROCESS. SO IF THERE ARE ORGANIZATIONS THAT ARE TRYING TO PUT UP FENCES NOW IN THE EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION, THEY CAN DO IT WITHOUT GOING THROUGH THE RIGOROUS PROCESS, AND THE EMERGENCY PROCLAMATION WILL HELP THEM THROUGH THE PROCESS IS PROBABLY A BETTER WAY OF SAYING IT. THANK YOU, MR. SINENCI FOR DOING THIS. THERE'S A LOT OF AXIS DEER AND WE'RE ALL TRYING TO DO OUR LITTLE PIECE TO CONQUER THESE CRITTERS.\r\n\r\nTHANKS. >> ANY MORE DISCUSSION? QUESTIONS? I MOVE TO ADOPT THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN COMMITTEE REPORT 22-72. >> SECOND.\r\n\r\n>> MOVED BY VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ, SECONDED BY MEMBER SUGIMURA TO APPROVE THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN COMMITTEE REPORT 22-72 DISCUSSION? VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> MAHALO, CHAIR. YOUR BUDGET, FINANCE, AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEE MET ON JULY 13TH, 2022 TO DISCUSS BILL 111 (2022) ENTITLED, "A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE THAT WITH AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR TO ENTER INTO A INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT WITH THE

STATE OF HAWAI'I DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH FOR A LOAN FROM THE CLEAN WATER STATE REVOLVING FUND FOR THE COUNTY RESIDENTIAL CESSPOOL CONVERSION PROGRAM IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$1 MILLION." YOUR COMMITTEE DISCUSSED THE PROPOSED PILOT PROJECT AND CONFIRMED THE FINAL AMOUNT ON HOW MANY OTHER COUNTIES -- MAUI COUNTY HAS APPLIED FOR \$500,000 IN FUNDING, BUT COULD RECEIVE UP TO \$1 MILLION. A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE MAYOR'S OFFICE OF CLIMATE CHANGE RESILIENCE AND SUSTAINABILITY SAID THAT THE COUNTY'S OWN PROGRAM IS STILL IN BEGINNING PHASES OF DEVELOPMENT. TO INCLUDE THE MANNER THE PROGRAM WOULD BE ROLLED OUT TO THE PUBLIC, AND IDENTIFICATION OF TARGETED AREAS. HOWEVER, THE COUNTY DOES ANTICIPATE STARTING THE PROGRAM IN UP COUNTRY MAUI AND YOUR VOTED VOTED 9-0 TO RECOMMEND PASSAGE ON FIRST READING OF THE I RESPECTFULLY ASK FOR THE COUNCIL'S SUPPORT OF MY MOTION.\r\n\r\nMAHALO, CHAIR. >> ANY OTHER DISCUSSION? CLERK. >> CHAIR, YOU BEFORE YOU FROM YOUR CLIMATE ACTION, RESILIENCE, AND ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE, COMMITTEE REPORT 22-73 RECOMMENDING THAT RESOLUTION 22-159, CD 1 ENTITLED, AUTHORIZING COUNCIL'S COMMITTEE TO CONDUCT A FORMAL INVESTIGATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING, AND THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS RELATED TO THE COUNCIL ISSUANCE OF DEVELOPMENT APPROVAL FOR REAL PROPERTY LOCATED AT 5385 LOWER HONOAPI'ILANI ROAD NAPILI, MAUI, HAWAI'I" BE ADOPTED.\r\n\r\n>> COUNCIL MEMBER KING. >> SORRY ABOUT THAT. HAD A HARD TIME WITH THAT BUTTON. THANK YOU, CHAIR. I MOVE TO ADOPT THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN QUOIT REPORT 22-73. >> SECOND. >> MOVED BY MEMBER KING, SECONDED BY MEMBER SINENCI TO APPROVE THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN COMMITTEE REPORT 22-73. DISCUSSION, MEMBER KING. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR.\r\n\r\nYOUR CLIMATE ACTION, RESILIENCE, AND ENVIRONMENT COMMITTEE MET ON JULY 13TH, 2022 TO DISCUSS RESOLUTION 22-159, TO AUTHORIZE YOUR PLANNING AND SUSTAINABLE LAND USE COMMITTEE PSLU TO CONDUCT A FORMAL INVESTIGATION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING AND DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS ON PERMITTING PROCESSES AND OPERATING PROCEDURES CONCERNING THE COUNTY'S ISSUANCE OF DEVELOPMENT APPROVAL FOR REAL ESTATE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 5385 LOWER HONOAPI'ILANI ROAD, NAPILI, MAUI, HAWAI'I. OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE GREG BROWN DEVELOPMENT. YOUR COMMITTEE NOTED THAT YOUR GOVERNMENT RELATIONS, ETHICS, AND TRANSPARENCY COMMITTEE MET JUNE 29, 2021, NOVEMBER 16, 2021, NOVEMBER 24, 2021, AS A RECONVENED MEETING MARCH 15TH, 2022, MARCH 22, 2022, A RECONVENING OF THAT MEETING AND MARCH 24TH, 2022, ANOTHER RECONVENING. AND MAY 24, 2022 TO DISCUSS COMMUNITY CONCERNS OVER CONSTRUCTION FOR THE GREG BROWN DEVELOPMENT. AS DISCUSSED BUT THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING GRANTED AN EXEMPTION FROM THE REQUIREMENT FOR SPECIAL MANAGEMENT AREA OR SMA USE PERMIT AS A SINGLE-FAMILY RESIDENCE. THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS LATER ISSUED AND RESCINDED A STOP-WORK ORDER FOR THE PROJECT. AFTER CONCERNS WERE RAISED BY THE COMMUNITY LAST YEAR, THE COUNCIL ENACTED ORDINANCE 5233 TO PROHIBIT NEW HOTEL USE AN LIMIT BUILDING HEIGHTS TO 35' IN THE NAPILI BAY CIVIC IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, WHICH IS WHERE THE GREG BROWN DEVELOPMENT IS LOCATED. IT WITH TRIGGER LIMITED POWERS TO SUBPOENA COUNTY OFFICERS AND EMPLOYEES FOR SUBPOENA POWER DID NOT EXTEND TO FORMER COUNTY EMPLOYEE OR MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC.\r\n\r\nYOUR COMMITTEE NOTES SECTION 3-6 (3) OF REVISE CHARTER OF THE COUNTY OF MAUI (1983) AS AMENDED AUTHORIZES THE COUNCIL TO CONDUCT INVESTIGATIONS OF THE OPERATION OF ANY DEPARTMENT OR FUNCTION OF THE COUNTY. YOUR COMMITTEE FURTHER NOTES THE COUNCIL OR DESIGNATED COUNCIL COMMITTEE IS AUTHORIZED BY SECTION 78-9 HAWAI'I REVISED STATUTES TO COMPEL PERSONS ELECTED, APPOINTED OR EMPLOYED BY THE

COUNTY "TO TESTIFY TO ANSWER ANY QUESTIONS REGARDING" THE GOVERNMENT PROPERTY OR AFFAIRS OF THE COUNTY UNDER OATH OR INVESTIGATION. IN ADDITION, YOUR COMMITTEE NOTES THE PURPOSE OF A LEGISLATIVE INVESTIGATION IS TO GATHER AND ANALYZE FACTS TO HELP THE LEGISLATIVE BODY MAKE WELL-INFORMED POLICY DECISIONS ON POTENTIAL FUTURE LEGISLATION. FOR THE COUNCIL, THE POTENTIAL FUTURE LEGISLATION COULD INCLUDE ANNUAL BUDGET ORDINANCES, AMENDMENTS TO THE COUNTY CODE AND PROPOSED CHARTER AMENDMENTS. LEGISLATIVE BODIES SUCH AS THE COUNCIL, AND ITS STANDING COMMITTEES ARE NOT ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES AND HAVE NO AUTHORITY TO ADJUDICATE PENALTIES BY DEFINITION IT'S NOT PUNITIVE. A FORMAL INVESTIGATION ALLOWS THE COUNCIL, AND COMMITTEE TO USE, IF NECESSARY, THE FULL RANGE OF POWERS AFFORDED TO A LEGISLATIVE BODY. YOUR COMMITTEE FURTHER NOTE YOUR GREAT COMMITTEE HAS SPENT EXPENSIVE RESOURCES DISCUSSING AND RECEIVING ORAL AND WRITTEN TESTIMONY ON THE GREG BROWN DEVELOPMENT THIS TEXEIRA.\r\n\r\nHOWEVER, THE TESTIMONY WAS NOT RECEIVED UNDER OATH OR AFFIRMATION. MEMBER PALTIN. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. I MOVE TO ADOPT THE RECOMMENDATION IN COMMITTEE REPORT 22-78. >> SECOND. >> MOVED BY MEMBER PALTIN, SECONDED BY MEMBER KING TO APPROVE THE RECOMMENDATIONS IN COMMITTEE REPORT 22-78. DISCUSSION, MEMBER PALTIN. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR.\r\n\r\nYOUR PLANNING AND SUSTAINABLE LAND USE COMMITTEE MET ON JUNE 16TH, 2022, AND DISCUSSED RESOLUTION 22-151. REFERRING TO THE MAUI PLANNING COMMISSIONS A PROPOSED BILL RELATED TO OFF-STREET PARKING. THE PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSED BILL IS TO REGULATE THE NUMBER OF CARS ALLOWED TO BE PARKED ON A RESIDENTIAL PROPERTY OPERATING AS AN AUTOMOBILE RENTAL OR CAR-SHARING SERVICE. YOUR COMMITTEE NOTED THE PROPOSED BILL AN INCREASED NUMBER OF CARS PARKED IN RESIDENTIAL AREAS. A REPRESENTATIVE FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF PLANNING SAID PARKING FOR RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES IS REGULATED FOR HOME BUSINESSES UNDER CHAPTER 19.67 MAUI COUNTY CODE. YOUR COMMITTEE NOTED SECTION 19-67.030E ALLOWED FOR A MAXIMUM OF FOUR PARKING SPACES FOR THE HOME BUSINESS ON LOTS OF LESS THAN ONE ACRE, AND RESTRICTS ON-STREET PARKING OF VEHICLES ASSOCIATED WITH THE HOME BUSINESS. YOUR COMMITTEE FURTHER NOTED THE OVERNIGHT PARKING OF ANY VEHICLE IS SUBJECT TO SECTION 10.483.110 MAUI COUNTY CODE, WHICH PROHIBITS PARKING ON ROADWAYS FOR A PERIOD OF TIME LONGER THAN 60 MINUTES BETWEEN THE HOURS OF 2:00 A.M. AND 6:00 A.M. OF ANY DAY. YOUR COMMITTEE DISCUSSED WHETHER AN AUTOMOBILE RENTAL OR CAR-SHARING SERVICE IS CONSIDERED A HOME BUSINESS?\r\n\r\nYOUR COMMITTEE ADVISED THE PROPOSED BILL TO MEET THE PARKING STANDARDS AND RESTRICTIONS SIMILAR TO THOSE FOR HOME BUSINESSES, UNDER SECTION 19.67.030E AND YOUR COMMITTEE VOTED 8-0 TO RECOMMEND ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION 22-151, CD 1. I RESPECTFULLY ASK FOR THE MEMBERS' SUPPORT OF MY MOTION. >> ANY FURTHER DISCUSSION, MEMBERS? THANK

YOU, MEMBER PALTIN FOR TAKING A VERY IMPORTANT MATTER, ESPECIALLY IT AFFECTS MANY PLACES IN THE CENTRAL AREA. ALL THOSE IN FAVOR OF THE MOTION, PLEASE RAISE YOUR HAND AND SAY AYE? >> AYE. >> OPPOSED? FUJIHARA RECEIVED HER BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE AT UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I MANOA AND CURRENTLY EMPLOYED AS A WRITER INSTITUTE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I MANOA AND PRIOR TO HER CURRENT EMPLOYEE MS. FUJIHARA WAS AT UNIVERSITY OF HAWAI'I AT MAUI. MS. FUJIHARA'S EDUCATION AND BACKGROUND IN HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE, VISUAL ARTS, DESIGN, TECHNOLOGY AND COMMUNICATION WILL MAKE HER A GREAT ASSET IN OCS. THIS FIRST OF ITS KIND POSITION IN THE COUNTY CALLS FOR HAWAIIAN VALUES LITERACY AND SPEAKING, AND PROFESSIONAL HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE TRANSLATION. IN MEETING WITH MS.\r\n\r\nFUJIHARA, I FUND HER TO BE VERY QUALIFIED, PLEASANT TO WORK WITH AND EAGER TO COLLABORATE WITH US, AS COUNCIL MEMBERS AND OUR OFFICES AND OTHERS TO ADVANCE THIS HISTORIC EFFORT TO BE PUT INTO PRACTICE THE CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISION, RECOGNIZING HAWAII'S TWO OFFICIAL LANGUAGES, SHE IS MAUI BORN AND RAISED AND WENT AWAY FOR SCHOOL AND RETURNED TO CONTRIBUTE TO OUR COMMUNITY. WE NEED TO REQUEST TESTIMONY ON BILLS. >> YES, CHAIR. PROCEEDING WITH TESTIMONY ON BILLS. CHAIR, THE FIRST PERSON SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY IS TAKAI ROBINSON, FOLLOWED BY KIMBERLY.\r\n\r\n>> MS. ROBINSON. >> ALOHA. >> HI. >> HI. MAHALO ALOHA KAKOU. WARMEST GREETINGS CHAIR LEE AND COUNCIL MEMBERS.\r\n\r\nTAKAI ROBINSON AND SERVE AS THE HEAD OF KE KULA O PI'ILANI AND TESTING IN SUPPORT OF BILL 123 THAT ALLOWS FOR THE COUNTY TO PARTNER WITH US AND SECURING A HOME KE KULA O PI'ILANI AND TO CULTIVATE EXTRA LEADER FOR TODAY. OUR COMMUNITY LEADERS FOR TOMORROW, WHO ARE GROUNDED AND HAVE DEEP-ROOTED CONNECTION TO EACH OTHER MAUI'S ENVIRONMENT AND ELEMENTS THAT -- STRIVE TO INTEGRATE WISDOM WITH ACADEMICS FOR DEVELOPMENT OF STRONG, HEALTHY TO GROW KANAKA HERE IN THE HEART OF THE VALLEY. SO EVERY MORNING OUR VOICES RING THROUGH THE VALLEY CHILDREN START THEIR DAY BY ASKING PERMISSION TO LEARN AND TO GAIN AND TO GROW IN THIS SPACE. RECOGNIZING THE RICHNESS OF OUR 'AINA AND EMANATING MANA OUT FROM OUR LITTLE SPACE IN THE VALLEY TO REST OF OUR ISLAND OF MAUI. OUR EXPERIENCE ALOHA THROUGH INTIMATE RELATIONSHIP WITH 'AINA AND KULEANA GUIDES THE WAYS THAT THEY MOVE THROUGH THE WORLD AND GROW OLDER THEY DEFEND THEIR SENSE OF COMMUNITY, OF SERVICE, OF SELF-CONFIDENCE AND IDENTITY AS KANAKA. CHILDREN OF THESE LANDS. THANK YOU VERY MUCH ESPECIALLY TO THIS PARTICULAR COUNCIL, THIS SPECIFIC COUNCIL FOR ALWAYS SUPPORTING NATIVE HAWAIIAN LANGUAGE AND CULTURE. THANK YOU.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU. I SEE WE HAVE A QUESTION. MEMBER KING. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. I WAS JUST GOING TO ASK IF WE'RE PLAN TO HAVE MS. ROBINSON AS A RESOURCE PERSON WHEN WE GET TO THAT ITEM? THAT ON BILL 121, I'M IN STRONG SUPPORT. I'M ALSO A DHHL HOMEOWNER, AND
HAVE EXPERIENCED TRAUMA THAT CAUSED US TO MISS OUR PAYMENT ON OUR REAL
ESTATE TAXES AND THEN CAUSED US TO LOSE OUR EXEMPTION. SO I WOULD
STRONGLY SUPPORT IF THE COUNTY WOULD BE SO KIND ENOUGH TO SUPPORT THE
BILL, WHERE FOR DEPARTMENT OF HAWAIIAN HOMELANDS LESSEES. WE WOULD HAVE
THAT RELIEF OF NOT BEING PENALIZED AND LOSING OUR EXEMPTIONS IF WE MISS

ON BILL 121? NO. NO QUESTIONS. SO NOW WE'RE GOING TO ASK FOR OTHER

ALOHA, I GUESS IT'S MY TIME.\r\n\r\nALOHA MY KAKOU KIMBERLY THAYER. SO MY
NAME IS KIMBERLY THAYER AND TESTIFYING IN STRONG SUPPORT OF BILL 123. I
SERVE AS THE BOARD TREASURER A 501(C)(3) WITH NINE-MEMBER BOARD OF
DIRECTORS AND ALSO A PROUD AND GRATEFUL MOTHER, AND OUR 'OHANA HAS BEEN
INTIMATELY INVOLVED IN THE SCHOOL SINCE THE VERY BEGINNING. ALMOST SIX
YEARS AGO EXACTLY WE OPENED OUR DOORS WITH JUST SIX KIDS AND ONE YOUNG

'OHANA TO CREATE A VILLAGE OF SPEAKERS AROUND OUR KIDS. A CAPSTONE
PROJECT WAS THE HANDCRAFTING OF TWO PA'U DRUMS THAT THE PARENTS DID ON
THEIR OWN. IT REALLY GELLED US TOGETHER OF THE WE LEARNED HOW TO HARVEST
HAU AND KOLA AND CARVED WOOD FOR THE DRUMS.\r\n\r\nIT WAS AN EXTREMELY
MEANINGFUL EXPERIENCE. IN THE FOURTH YEAR, WE RECEIVED FUNDING TO CREATE
STONE MADE BY EACH FAMILY AND TO THIS DAY, EVERY NEW FAMILY OF OUR
SCHOOL, WE TEACH THEM HOW TO DO THAT ON THEIR OWN. SO EVERY FAMILY AS A
POI BOARD IN THEIR HOMES NOW. IN OUR FIFTH YEAR WE WERE STRUCK WITH
COVID, BUT WE WERE ABLE TO MAINTAIN OUR ENROLLMENT, DESPITE THE
CHALLENGES. AND WE HAVE THE FINDING SUPPORT FROM OED TO CREATE DIGITAL
LEARNING RESOURCES THAT ARE STILL AVAILABLE ON OUR YOUTUBE CHANNEL TO
THIS DAY. THIS LAST YEAR, WE JUST COMPLETED OUR SIX-YEAR IN EXISTENCE. WE
GRADUATED OUR FIRST BATCH OF KINDERGARTNERS OUT OF 5TH GRADE.\r\n\r\nOUR
SON WAS ONE OF THOSE FIRST KINDERGARTNERS, AND IT'S BEEN AMAZING THAT WE
MADE IT THIS FAR. I KNOW THAT IS MY TIME. I JUST WANTED TO SAY ERICK
WE'RE ON THE VERGE OF OUR 7TH YEAR WITH OVER 40 STUDENTS ENROLLED. WE

HAVE A STAFF OF NINE, AND WE WORK WITH A WHOLE BUNCH OF PRACTITIONERS, WHO DIRECTLY PASS THEIR KNOWLEDGE ONTO OUR STUDENTS. I THINK IT'S BEEN LIFE CHANGING FOR EVERYBODY WHO HAS BEEN PART OF OUR SCHOOL. WE WOULD BE SO GRATEFUL FOR THE OPPORTUNITY TO SECURE OUR HOME, AND CONTINUE TO STEWARD THIS WAHI FOR THE COMMUNITY THAT WE'RE A PART OF.

MAHALO.\r\n\r\n>> GREAT. QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? I HAVE A QUESTION, MS. THAYER. CAN YOU TELL ME HOW MUCH YOU RECEIVE FROM OED? OED, MEANING THE COUNTY? >> YES.\r\n\r\n\r\nSO OED, BEFORE WE RECEIVED ABOUT \$65,000 AND THIS YEAR WE RECEIVED \$50,000, LIKE I SAID, LED TO THE CREATION OF DIGITAL RESOURCES TO SUPPORT PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FOR OUR KUMU. >> I GUESS THEY FORGET TO TELL YOU THAT A GOOD PORTION OF THAT CAME FROM THE COUNTY COUNCIL. >> YES. YES. YOU WERE INSTRUMENTAL IN THAT. THANK YOU. THANK YOU.\r\n\r\n\r\n>> MY DISTRICT FUNDS. >> YES. >> THAT IS OKAY. WE'RE ALL IN THIS TOGETHER. >> YES. >> ANY OTHER QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? YES, MEMBER KING.\r\n\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU, CHAIR. SO I GUESS I WILL ASK YOU THE QUESTION, MS. THAYER. THANK YOU FOR BEING HERE. I HAVE ACTUALLY VISITED YOUR SCHOOL BEFORE. I DON'T KNOW IF YOU REMEMBER WHEN I MADE THAT TREK OVER THERE AT LAWRENCE'S REQUEST. SO ARE YOU CURRENTLY PAYING RENT TO THE HAWAI'I NATURE CENTER?\r\n\r\n\r\n>> YES, WE ARE? >> AND SO YOU WOULD WANT TO CONTINUE THAT SAME MODEL, BUT WITH THE COUNTY HAVING OWNERSHIP OF THE PROPERTY? >> YES, WE WOULD BE OPEN TO THAT. SOLIDIFYING WE'RE ON A YEAR-TO-YEAR LEASE AT THIS POINT AND TO HAVE THE SECURITY OF KNOWING THAT WE HAVE A PERMANENT HOME. >> SO YOU WOULD BE LOOKING FOR A FIVE OR TEN-YEAR LEASE AT THAT POINT IN COUNTY PURCHASES? >> AT LEAST. WE WERE HOPING FOR MORE, IF POSSIBLE.\r\n\r\n\r\nBECAUSE WE NEED TO MAKE UPGRADES TO THE SCHOOL FOR LICENSING AND ACCREDITATION AND TO HAVE LONG-TERM CONTROL OF THE SPACE GIVES US MORE OF AN ABILITY TO SECURE FUNDING TO MAKE THE IMPROVEMENTS THAT WE NEED BE LICENSED AND ACCREDITED. >> IS YOUR LEASE JUST FOR THE SPACE FOR THE SCHOOL, OR IS IT EXPANDED SPACE BEYOND THE FACILITY THERE? >> >> IS IT THE ENTIRE SPACE OWNED BY THE NATURE CENTER? >> THE ENTIRE SPACE IS OWNED BY THE NATURE CENTER. AS WE HAVE GROWN, WE HAVE NEEDED TO UTILIZE MORE AND MORE SPACE, AND SO WITH OUR GROWTH, OUR COSTS HAVE GONE UP, WHICH WE'RE A NONPROFIT, LIKE I SAID. WE'RE TUITION-BASED, TUITION DOESN'T COVER ALL OF OUR COSTS. SO WHEREVER WE CAN MAKE THE MOST OF OUR LIMITED RESOURCES IS WHAT WE WOULD LIKE TO DO.\r\n\r\n\r\nSO IF WE CAN PUT OUR MONEY INTO IMPROVING THE SPACE VERSUS PAYING MORE AND MORE LEASE RENT, THAT WOULD VERY MUCH HELP US MAKE ENDS MEET AND PUTTING OUR MONEY TOWARDS OUR STUDENT AND OUR 'OHANA AND OUR KUMU AND OUR COMMUNITY. >> THANK YOU FOR THAT EXPLANATION. WHEN I WAS THERE, I DIDN'T -- I WASN'T -- I HAVE BEEN -- I HAVE SPENT A LOT OF TIME AT THE NATURE CENTER BEFORE YOU PUT YOUR SCHOOL THERE. SO I WASN'T SURE WHERE THE BOUNDARIES WERE FOR THE NATURE CENTER, BUT SOUNDS LIKE YOU RENT ALL OF THAT SPACE. >> NOT QUITE EVERYTHING. AS OF OUR NEW LEASE THIS YEAR, I KNOW YOU'RE FAMILIAR WITH THE MAIN BUILDING THAT USED TO HAVE THE MUSEUM WITH THE SOLARIUM. SO WE'RE UTILIZING ALL OF THAT AND ONE PART OF ONE OF THE BACK BUILDINGS.\r\n\r\n\r\nSO THE TWO BACK BUILDINGS AND WE HAVE PART OF ONE OF THEM. >> YOU WOULD LIKE TO HAVE ALL OF THE BUILDINGS THERE? >> YEAH. SO OUR PIE-IN-THE-SKY DREAM IS TO EXPAND BEYOND ELEMENTARY SCHOOL INTO MIDDLE SCHOOL AND ONE DAY, HIGH SCHOOL. SO AS OUR SCHOOL GROWS AND WE TRY AND EDUCATE MORE STUDENTS, WE WOULD NEED MORE AND MORE SPACE TO DO THAT. >> THAT WOULD BE -- THERE'S ENOUGH THERE FOR YOU TO EXPAND TO YOUR END-GOAL? >> NOT FOR THE HIGH SCHOOL.\r\n\r\n\r\nIT WOULD GIVE US FULL ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, AT LEAST, AND PROBABLY MAYBE THE START OF A MIDDLE SCHOOL. BUT IN TIME, WE WOULD PROBABLY NEED TO HAVE ANOTHER SPACE, WHICH

WE WOULD LIKE TO KEEP IN THAT AHUPUA'A OF WAILUKU AND HAVE ONE DAY HAVE A PRESCHOOL MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL DOWN THE AHUPUA'A AND OUR PROGRAM WOULD BUILD THE NEXT ALL THE WAY UP. REALLY THE FULL EDUCATION OF OUR STUDENTS FROM WHEN THEY ARE VERY YOUNG UNTIL THEY ARE ADULTS. >> GREAT. THAT IS A GREAT VISION. I LOVE THAT. >> THANK YOU.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU, CHAIR? >> I THINK PRO TEM KAMA HAS A QUESTION. >> YES, I DO, CHAIR. THANK YOU FOR BEING HERE, MS. THAYER AND HELPING US TO UNDERSTAND WHAT YOU ARE DOING THERE. I HAVE TWO QUESTIONS. ONE, WHAT IS THE TUITION?\r\n\r\nAND IF YOU HAVE MULTIPLE CHILDREN, DO YOU OFFER SCHOLARSHIPS FOR THAT? THAT IS ONE. AND THEN THE SECOND ONE IS ARE YOU AN NCY ACCREDITED? >> SO THE FIRST QUESTION WE ARE TUITION-BASED AND THE VAST MAJORITY OF OUR FAMILIES RECEIVE FINANCIAL AID. OUR TUITION IS \$8,000. WE HAVE NOT MADE ANY INCREASES IN TUITION OVER THE LAST FEW YEARS, BECAUSE A LOT OF THE FAMILIES AT OUR SCHOOL, EVEN WITH THE AID WE'RE ABLE TO GIVE, STILL HAVE A HARD TIME AFFORDING THE TUITION. SO WE ARE ALWAYS, ALWAYS HAVE REALLY HARD DECISIONS AT THIS TIME OF YEAR TO SAY HOW MUCH CAN WE GIVE TO ENABLE FAMILIES TO COME? WE HAVE HAD SEVERAL FAMILIES OVER THE PAST FEW YEARS EVEN WITH THE ASSISTANCE WE OFFER, THEY ARE STILL NOT ABLE TO AFFORD IT, EVEN THOUGH, LIKE, SOME PEOPLE TELL US NOWADAYS THIS IS THEIR DREAM FOR WHERE THEY WANT THEIR KIDS TO GO TO SCHOOL, BUT SOME OF THEM JUST CAN'T AFFORD IT.\r\n\r\nWE WORK WITH THEM, AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE TO FIND CREATIVE SOLUTIONS. BUT IT IS ALWAYS A CHALLENGE BEING TUITION-BASED. AS OUR HEAD OF SCHOOL, SHE IS THE ONE THAT IS REALLY KIND OF ON THE GROUND, WORKING TOWARDS OUR ACCREDITATION. SO I WOULD LIKE TO LET HER SPEAK TOWARDS THAT PROCESS, BECAUSE SHE IS MUCH MORE IN TOUCH WITH THAT THAN I AM. >> COULD YOU ANSWER THE SECOND QUESTION? >> OH, SORRY. YES WE'RE WORKING WITH THE HAWAI'I ASSOCIATION OF INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS FOR LICENSURE AND WE'RE ENTERING IN THE FIRST-YEAR OF OUR ACCREDITATION.\r\n\r\nTHE ORGANIZATION. >> CHAIR? >> YES. >> MAHALO. WE ASKED KA'AUHUUH ROBINSON TO SERVE AS A RESOURCE FOR US, SO WE'RE NOT DELIBERATING DURING PUBLIC TESTIMONY AND YET, WE HAVE GONE OVER AND ABOVE CLARIFYING QUESTIONS FOR OUR TESTIFIER, MS. THAYER. SO SHOULD WE ASK MS.\r\n\r\nTHAYER TO ALSO SERVE AS A RESOURCE PERSON WHEN THIS ITEM COMES INSTEAD OF CONTINUING DELIBERATION? >> I DON'T THINK WE WERE DELIBERATING. I THINK MEMBER KAMA JUST WANTED A LITTLE MORE INFORMATION. BUT WOULD YOU BE ABLE TO STAY AS A RESOURCE PERSON AS WELL? >> SURE. YES. I WOULD LOVE TO.\r\n\r\n>> IN THE MEANTIME, ARE THERE ANY OTHER QUESTIONS FOR MS. THAYER? IF NOT, BY THE WAY, PRO TEM KAMA, WERE YOUR QUESTIONS ANSWERED? >> YES, IT WAS, CHAIR. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. THANK YOU, MS. THAYER.\r\n\r\n>> OKAY. DO WE HAVE ANY MORE TESTIFIERS, MR. CLERK? >> YES, CHAIR. THE LAST PERSON SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY IS BRYCE THAYER FOLLOWED BY THE INDIVIDUAL CALLING IN WITH THE LAST FOUR DIGITS 0041. >> DID YOU CALL THAT PERSON UP AGAIN, PLEASE? >> YES, RIGHT NOW BRYCE THAYER, IT'S YOUR TIME TO TESTIFY. >> OKAY.\r\n\r\nHELLO KAKOU. YOU JUST SPOKE TO MY WIFE WHO IS MUCH ELOQUENT THAN I. I AM THE CURRENT PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD OF KE KULA O PI'ILANI AND I'M TESTIFYING IN SUPPORT OF BILL 123. I CURRENTLY HAVE -- SO MY WIFE KIMBERLY AND I ARE NOT HAWAIIAN. SO WHEN WE EMBARKED UPON THIS JOURNEY TO CREATE A HAWAIIAN SCHOOL SEVEN YEARS AGO, I THINK SOME PEOPLE WERE CONFUSED AS TO WHY WE WOULD DO SUCH A THING. THE REASON IS THAT WE WERE BOTH EXPOSED IN COLLEGE TO STUDY ABROAD. SO WE HAD THE BENEFIT OF SEEING THE VALUE OF LEARNING THROUGH AN ENTIRELY DIFFERENT LENS OF ANOTHER LANGUAGE AND CULTURE. WE DECIDED THAT WE WANTED THE EXPERIENCE FOR OUR CHILDREN TO LAYER AND ENRICH THAT EXPERIENCE. THANKS TO THE WORK OF GIANTS WHO CAME BEFORE US ON MAUI, THAT OPPORTUNITY WAS AVAILABLE TO US

AND OUR CHILDREN AT A VERY YOUNG AGE ON MAUI.\r\n\r\nSO THIS EXPERIENCE HAS ENDEARED MY FAMILY TO HAWAIIAN CULTURE, AND THIS 'AINA. MY WIFE AND I WERE BORN AND RAISED HERE, BUT UNTIL WE STARTED TO SCRATCH THE SURFACE OF HAWAIIAN CULTURE, ONLY THEN DID WE REALLY BEGIN NOT ONLY THIS DIRECTION WOULD GROUND OUR CHILDREN AND CREATE A SPRINGBOARD TO THRIVE IN THIS WORLD, BUT ALSO MADE US REALIZE THAT OUR CULTURE, THE HAWAIIAN CULTURE IS CRITICAL TO OUR SURVIVAL AS A PEOPLE AND AS ALAND. IF WE DON'T HAVE CULTURE, WHAT DO WE HAVE HERE? WE HAVE NICE BEACHES AND NICE PEOPLE, BUT OUR CULTURE WILL KEEP US RELEVANT AND THRIVING IN THIS WORLD. THIS PURCHASE WILL HELP KE KULA O PI'ILANI TO PRESERVE OUR CULTURE THROUGH THE EDUCATION OF MAUI KEIKI AND THIS PURCHASE WILL ALSO STRENGTHEN THE HAWAI'I NATURE CENTER AND THEIR ABILITY TO PROVIDE PROGRAMS ON MAUI. TO TEACH OUR CHILDREN THE IMPORTANCE OF 'AINA. THAT IT PROVIDES FOR US ONLY IF WE CARE FOR IT, AND NOW MORE THAN EVER; RIGHT?\r\n\r\nIT BLOWS MY MIND AS I TALK TO YOUNG KIDS, SEE THAT LOST THIS CONNECTION TO AINA. THEY ARE ON THEIR CELL PHONES AND IN THE METAVERSE AND WE TALK ABOUT THE BRAIN DRAIN AND HOW IT'S DETRIMENTAL TO PROGRESS ON THE ISLANDS AND ESPECIALLY NEIGHBOR ISLANDS. THESE ARE THE KIDS THAT ARE PRONE TO LEAVE AND NOT RETURN. WE'LL BE FORCED TO CONTINUE TO IMPORT TALENT WHEN IT WAS HERE ALL ALONG AND WE JUST LET IT GO. SO THE PURCHASE WILL ALSO STRENGTHEN THE COUNTY BY PRESERVING THIS CULTURALLY SIGNIFICANT 'EHA AS A PLACE OF LEARNING AND PLACE FOR THE COMMUNITY AND KE KULA O PI'ILANI IS READY TO CARRY THE TORCH INTO THE FUTURE FOR MAUI COUNTY FOR THAT PURPOSE. I FEEL IT'S A WIN-WIN-WIN FOR THE COUNTY, THE NATURE CENTER AND KE KULA O PI'ILANI. I FEEL THERE'S A LITTLE BIT OF URGENCY HERE.\r\n\r\nLIKE WAS SAID EARLIER, TODD CULLISON, WE DO NOT HAVE A BINDING AGREEMENT AND IT'S NOT SOMETHING THAT IS SET IN STONE. THANK YOU VERY MUCH. >> MEMBERS, DO YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS? MEMBER KING. >> THANK YOU. I DO HAVE A CLARIFYING QUESTION. THANK YOU FOR BEING HERE, MR.\r\n\r\nTHAYER. WHEN YOU MENTIONED THAT -- ARE YOU STILL HERE? >> YES. >> HE IS ON. >> SO YOU MENTIONED THAT IT WOULD MAKE THE HAWAIIAN NATURE CENTER STRONGER, TOO. SO YOUR VISION IS THAT THE HAWAI'I NATURE CENTER WOULD STILL BE THERE, BUT THE COUNTY WOULD OWN THE PROPERTY AND NOT THE NATURE CENTER? >> IN TALKING TO THE NATURE CENTER, [INAUDIBLE] TO CONTINUE THE PROGRAM -- THEIR ABILITY TO DELIVER PROGRAMS THERE, BECAUSE OF THE WEATHER IS A BIT PROBLEMATIC.\r\n\r\nAND THEY ARE FINDING -- SORRY, I DON'T MEAN TO SPEAK FOR TODD, BUT MY UNDERSTANDING IS THAT THEIR ABILITY TO DELIVER PROGRAMS ON THE ISLAND IS GREATER AND GET MORE PARTICIPATION. MY UNDERSTANDING IS ONE THING THAT THEY WILL DO WITH THE FUNDS IS CREATE SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID, SO MORE FOLKS CAN PARTICIPATE IN THE PROGRAM AT A REASONABLE COST. >> BUT THEIR PROGRAM WOULD BE SOMEWHERE ELSE? >> THAT REMAINS TO BE SEEN. >> I WAS JUST CLARIFYING WHAT YOU MEANT THAT WOULD MAKE THEM STRONGER, BECAUSE WE WOULD BE BUYING IT FROM THEM AND VACATING THE SPACE. >> IT SOUNDS LIKE THEY HAVE A PLAN TO BE BETTER AND STRONGER ON MAUI. >> THANK YOU.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU, CHAIR. YOU'RE MUTED. >> I THOUGHT I WAS CAUSING AN ECHO BEFORE. THANK YOU, MR. THAYER. CAN WE HAVE THE NEXT TESTIFIER, MR. CLERK.\r\n\r\n>> THERE ARE NO OTHER INDIVIDUALS SIGNED UP TO TESTIFY ON THIS ITEM, BUT IF THERE IS ANYONE ELSE THAT WOULD LIKE TO TESTIFY, WE'LL DO A LAST CALL NOW. IF ANYONE WOULD LIKE TO TESTIFY ON BILLS, PLEASE IDENTIFY YOURSELF NOW. AGAIN, LAST CALL. >> THIS WILL BE THE LAST CATEGORY; RIGHT? >> NO, CHAIR. AT THIS TIME, IF THERE'S NO OBJECTIONS I WOULD ALSO LIKE TO CALL UP RESOLUTION 22-186. >> ANY OBJECTIONS, MEMBERS? >> NO OBJECTIONS. >> IF NOT, MR.\r\n\r\nCLERK. IT'S ALREADY BEEN CALLED UP; RIGHT? WE DEFERRED IT EARLIER. >> OKAY. >> WE'LL RE-OPEN >> CAN YOU RE-OPEN. PROCEED. >> THAT IS RESOLUTION 22-186 AUTHORIZING THE ACQUISITION OF APPROXIMATELY .93 ACRES IDENTIFIED AS TAX MAP KEY THAT WAS READ EARLIER, SITUATED AT WAILUKU, MAUI, HAWAI'I FOR AN AMOUNT NOT-TO-EXCEED \$1.5 MILLION.\r\n\r\nI MOVE TO WAIVE THE REQUIREMENT FOR COMMITTEE REFERRAL AND REPORT IN ACCORDANCE WITH RULE 7G OF THE RULES OF THE COUNCIL. >> SECOND. >> MOVED BY VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. SECONDED BY PRO TEM KAMA TO WAIVE THE RULES OF THE COUNCIL WITH REGARD TO RESOLUTION 22-186 AND BILL 123. ANY MORE DISCUSSION ON THAT? ALL THOSE IN FAVOR OF THE WAIVER, RAISE YOUR HAND AND SAY AYE? >> AYE. >> NINE AYES, ZERO NOS.\r\n\r\nMOTION CARRIES. VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> MAHALO, CHAIR. I MOVE TO ADOPT RESOLUTION 22-186 AND PASS BILL 123 ON FIRST READING. >> SECOND. >> MOVED BY VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. SECONDED BY PRO TEM KAMA TO ADOPT RESOLUTION 22-186 AND PASS BILL 123. DISCUSSION, VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ.\r\n\r\n>> MAHALO, CHAIR. MEMBERS, RESOLUTION 22-186 WOULD AUTHORIZE THE MAYOR OR HIS REPRESENTATIVE TO EXECUTE ALL NECESSARY DOCUMENTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE ACQUISITION OF TAX MAP KEYS LISTED IN WAILUKU, MAUI, HAWAI'I FOR AN AMOUNT NOT-TO-EXCEED \$1.5 MILLION. BILL 123 (2022) ADDS AN APPROPRIATION FROM THE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND CULTURAL PROGRAMS REVOLVING FUND FOR ACQUISITION OF PROPERTY ON VALLEY ROAD FOR \$1.5 MILLION. THESE PROPERTIES ARE CURRENTLY OWNED BY HAWAI'I NATURE CONSERVANCY , INC.. THE VOTE WILL PROPOSE A LONG-TERM LEASE OF THE PROPERTIES TO KE KULA O PI'ILANI AND INDEPENDENT APPRAISAL WAS CONDUCTED AND CONCLUDED IT WAS VALUED AT \$1.5 MILLION. WE HAVE THE BUDGET DIRECTOR, MICHELE YOSHIMURA, FINANCE DIRECTOR SCOTT TERUYA, AS WELL AS THE THREE TESTIFIERS WE INVITED TO SERVE AS RESOURCE

PERSONS. MR. SINENCI.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU, CHAIR. I WOULD LIKE TO SPEAK IN SUPPORT OF THE MOTION ON THE FLOOR. I THINK WE ALL REALIZE THAT WHEN IT COMES TO IMMERSION, AS WELL AS CHARTER SCHOOLS, THESE SCHOOLS DON'T ALWAYS GET THE FULL FUNDING FROM THE STATE, LIKE OTHER DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SCHOOLS. OFTEN TIMES THESE ALTERNATIVE CULTURAL SCHOOLS HAVE TO PAY THEIR OWN RENT, PAY THEIR OWN ELECTRICITY BILLS. THEY NEED TO ALSO PAY FOR THEIR OWN TRANSPORTATION. SO I THINK THIS WILL DEFINITELY HELP THE SMALL SCHOOLS LIKE KE KULA O PI'ILANI TO THRIVE. MAHALO.\r\n\r\n>> ANY MORE QUESTIONS? MEMBER KING. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. I SUPPORT THIS MOTION. THE ONLY THING I WAS WONDERING, I KNOW VICE-CHAIR MENTIONED THAT UPON ACQUISITION OF THE PROPERTY, THAT THERE WOULD BE A LEASE EXECUTED. I WAS JUST TRYING TO SEE IF THAT WAS MENTIONED IN THE RESOLUTION OR THE BILL? >> VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ.\r\n\r\n>> MAHALO, CHAIR. WE DO HAVE THE ADMINISTRATION ON. SO IF THEY WOULD LIKE TO INVITE SOMEONE FROM THE ADMINISTRATION TO SPEAK TO MEMBER KING'S QUESTION. >> BUDGET DIRECTOR, OR FINANCE DIRECTOR, ARE YOU ON THE CALL? >> CHAIR. HI. SO I'M NOT SURE IF IT'S MENTIONED IN THE LEASE.\r\n\r\nI KNOW IT'S NOT MENTIONED IN THE BUDGET AMENDMENT THAT THERE WAS GOING TO BE A LONG-TERM LEASE, BUT THE INTENT TO GIVE THEM 50-YEAR LEASE. SO 17:28:36 THAT THEY CAN SECURE FUNDING TO MAKE IMPROVEMENTS AT SCHOOL FOR EXPANSION. SO IN ORDER FOR THEM TO GET OTHER FINANCING RESOURCES, WE WERE LOOKING AT A 50 LEASE. RIGHT NOW THEY ARE ON YEAR-TO-YEAR, I BELIEVE, WITH THE HAWAI'I NATURE CENTER. >> IS THAT SOMETHING THAT SHOULD BE PUT IN THE RESOLUTION? THERE'S NO MENTION OF US DOING THAT. THERE'S NO COMMITMENT TO EITHER THE BILL OR THE RESOLUTION.\r\n\r\nMAYBE MS. THOMPSON CAN SPEAK TO THAT. >> MS. THOMPSON? >> THANK YOU. THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU, COUNCIL MEMBER KING.\r\n\r\nSO THE FIRST STEP OF COURSE IS THE COUNTY'S ACQUISITION OF THE PROPERTY. AND THEN ONCE THAT IS COMPLETED, THEN WE'LL COME BACK BEFORE YOU, FOR APPROVAL OF THE LEASE. >> OKAY. JUST WANT TO MAKE SURE THAT THE INTENT IS IN THERE SOMEWHERE. SO THAT SOMETHING DIFFERENT CAN'T HAPPEN AFTER THE ACQUISITION. YOU DON'T SEE A PROBLEM WITH THAT? >> NO, I DON'T. IT IS IN YOUR RECORD THE INTENT OF THIS PURCHASE.\r\n\r\n>> OKAY. THANK YOU. THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> I HAVE A QUESTION, DIRECTOR YOSHIMURA. THIS THERE'S A 31-ACRE CONSERVATION EASEMENT PORTION WHAT IS THAT? >> CHAIR, WILL DEFER THAT WHO WORKED ON THE RESOLUTION, AND METES AND BOUNDS, AND INFORMATION FOR THAT. IF YOU DON'T MIND, I WILL DEFER TO GUY HIRONAKA.\r\n\r\n>> GUY, ARE YOU ON THE LINE? GUY? I GUESS NOT. >> THIS IS TODD CULLISON. I CAN SPEAK TO THAT, IF IT'S APPROPRIATE? >> OKAY. >> SO THE HAWAI'I NATURE CENTER, TODD CULLISON, HAWAI'I NATURE CENTER.\r\n\r\nWE HAD THAT CONSERVATION EASEMENT FOR PROBABLY ALMOST THE ENTIRE TIME THAT WE HAVE OWNED THE CURRENT PROPERTY WE'RE IN DISCUSSIONS WITH. AND THAT CONSERVATION EASEMENT WAS EFFECTIVELY CANCELED AND GIVEN BACK TO WAILUKU WATER. PROBABLY RIGHT AROUND THE TURN OF THE CALENDAR YEAR. SO BY JANUARY OF 2022. SO IT DOES NOT CARRY FORWARD WITH THIS PURCHASE. IT'S BEEN GIVEN BACK TO WAILUKU WATER. IT'S NOT PART OF THIS ACQUISITION, OR SALE. >> SO YOU'RE NOT PLANNING TO RETAIN ANYTHING?\r\n\r\n>> CORRECT. >> WE PAY YOU \$1.5 MILLION, AND THEN WE EXECUTE A LONG-TERM LEASE WITH IMMERSION SCHOOL; RIGHT? >> YES. >> YOU DON'T PLAN TO RETAIN ANY PART OF THE PROPERTY? >> CORRECT, NOT AS OWNERS. >> ANY PART OF THE PREMISES? >> NOT AS OWNERS, AND THEN WE'LL CONTINUE TO WORK WITH THE CHARTER SCHOOL ABOUT LEASING BACKSPACE, OR UTILIZING SPACE FOR SOME OF OUR PROGRAMS.\r\n\r\n>> BECAUSE I NOTICED BECAUSE ORIGINALLY THERE WAS A LODGE. SO IT WAS LIKE A LITTLE HOTEL. SO IS THAT -- WILL ONE OF THE BUILDINGS THAT WAS CONDEMNED WAS THAT THE LODGE PORTION? >> IT WAS

MORE WHAT WE REFER TO AS THE DORMITORIES. SO THAT ONE THAT YOU'RE REFERRING TO, CHAIR, IS THE MORE MAUKA ONE, CLOSEST TO THE ROAD. AND KE KULA O PI'ILANI IS RENTING SPACE FROM THE MORE MAKAI PORTION OF THE FORMER DORMITORIES. >> I THOUGHT THAT WOULD BE INCOME-PRODUCING FOR THE SCHOOL?\r\n\r\nYOU KNOW, IF IT WERE RENOVATED OR IS IT POSSIBLE TO RENOVATE SOME OF THOSE OLD BUILDINGS? >> I THINK IT'S POSSIBLE. THAT IS WHEN A STRUCTURAL ENGINEER OR SOMEONE ELSE WOULD HAVE TO COME IN AND SEE WHAT THE INTEGRITY OF THE BUILDING IS? WE HAVEN'T UTILIZED IT SINCE THE FLOOD OF 2018. >> BECAUSE OBVIOUSLY, THE INCOME FROM THE TUITION IS NOT ENOUGH. IT'S WAY INSUFFICIENT. SO THEY NEED ADDITIONAL INCOME-PRODUCING ACTIVITIES WHETHER IT'S A LODGE OR WHATEVER LEASING TO YOU GUYS. >> PERHAPS.\r\n\r\n>> ARE YOU GOING TO BE LEASING A LOT OF SPACE TO BE DETERMINED. I THINK ONE OF THE REASONS THAT WE'RE INTERESTED IN SELLING IS THAT WE JUST DON'T NEED THAT FOOTPRINT, YOU KNOW? OUR PROGRAMS, EVEN THOUGH MAYBE OUR VOLUME IS LARGER PER ANNUM. HOW MANY KIDS WE CONNECT WITH, OUR PROGRAM, IF IT'S A SCHOOL PROGRAM IS 3.5 HOURS A DAY OR SUMMER PROGRAM THAT IS A WEEKLONG PROGRAM. SO WE DON'T NEED THAT TYPE OF FOOTPRINT. WE HAVE A SMALLER NEED. >> OKAY.\r\n\r\nLOTS MORE QUESTIONS. YES, VICE-CHAIR. RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> MAHALO, CHAIR. I JUST WANTED TO HELP REFOCUS US. MR. GUY HIRONAKA IS ON.\r\n\r\n>> CAN YOU TELL US EXACTLY WHAT WE'RE BUYING IN TERMS OF EASEMENTS, ET CETERA? >> SO BASICALLY WHAT WE ARE BUYING WE'RE BUYING THE TWO PORTIONS, THE PORTION THAT THE SCHOOL IS ON, IS LOT NO. 6. AND THAT LOT IS .93 ACRES LOT 8 IS A LITTLE UNDER HALF AN ACRE AND THAT HAS NO IMPROVEMENTS ON IT. THERE'S TWO SEPARATE PARCELS AND IN THE MIDDLE IS THE EASEMENT, WAILUKU WATER LAND. >> CAN I ASK INITIATED THIS PURCHASE? >> I'M NOT SURE, BECAUSE I GUESS, THE MAYOR'S OFFICE HAD A CONVERSATION WITH THEM AND THEY OFFERED US THE PROPERTY. WE REVIEWED IT AND WE SUBMITTED A LETTER OF INTENT AFTER REVIEWING THE APPRAISAL.\r\n\r\n>> CHAIR LEE, I'M NOT SURE YOU CAN HEAR ME. THIS IS SCOTT TERUYA. >> YES, MR. TERUYA. >> I CAN GIVE YOU A LITTLE BIT OF BACKGROUND. IN JULY OF 2022, IT WAS PRESENTED THE INQUIRY OF THE COUNTY'S INTEREST THAT IS OWNED BY THE HAWAI'I NATURE CENTER. SO WE HAD FILED A LETTER OF INTENT TO PURCHASE, IT WAS DONE VERY QUICKLY AND BEFORE YOU FOLKS.\r\n\r\nMAYOR VICTORINO IS SUPPORTIVE OF THE ACQUISITION TO KEEP IT PERPETUITY OF EDUCATION. >> MEMBERS QUESTIONS? MEMBER PALTIN. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. I SPEAK IN FULL SUPPORT. I HAD THE OPPORTUNITY TO SPEAK WITH KA'AUHUUH ROBINSON AND GIVEN THE CREATION OF THE HOW IT WOULD FEED INTO THE BIGGER PICTURE. I HAD A QUESTION FOR EITHER MR.\r\n\r\nTERUYA OR MS. YOSHIMURA ON WHAT PORTION OF THE BUDGET THAT WOULD BE COMING FROM? >> DIRECTOR YOSHIMURA. >> CHAIR, JUST A LITTLE BIT OF BACKGROUND ON THIS. LAST YEAR WHEN WE RECOGNIZED \$15 MILLION OF REVENUE FROM THE TAT, WE PUT A LITTLE OVER \$2 MILLION IN REVOLVING FUND FOR ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND CULTURAL PROGRAMS AND DIDN'T DESIGNATE ANY EXPENDITURE FOR THAT, ANTICIPATING LOOKING FOR PROJECTS THAT WE COULD FUND THAT WOULD FIT THE CATEGORY OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT OR CULTURAL. WHEN THIS CAME UP, WE THOUGHT THIS IS A PERFECT PROJECT TO PUT UNDER THE REVOLVING FUND. AND SO WE'RE NOT ASKING TO INCREASE THE REVENUES IN ANY WAY.\r\n\r\nWE'RE JUST ASKING TO PUT IN AN APPROPRIATION UNDER FUNDS THAT ARE REVOLVING FUNDS. THANK YOU, CHAIR. >> THANK YOU. SO JUST MY FOLLOW-UP DISCUSSION TO THAT IS WHEN THINGS SEEM TO ALIGN SO WELL, LIKE THIS, I FEEL LIKE IT'S MEANT TO BE. AND WHO AM I TO SAY NO? THANK YOU. >> THANK YOU.\r\n\r\n>> WE HAVE TO ASK THE HARD QUESTIONS. MEMBER SUGIMURA. >> THANK YOU. I LOVE THIS DISCUSSION BECAUSE IF KEANI WASN'T GOING TO DO THIS, I WAS GOING TO DO THIS. THANK YOU FOR MOVING THIS FORWARD. I WILL TELL YOU LISTENING TO

ALICE AND I, I CAN TELL YOU STORIES WHEN IT WAS A HOTEL, WHEN IT WAS A RESTAURANT AND BAR THERE. MOVING FORWARD, MY SON, NOW 30, WE HAD BIRTHDAY PARTIES THERE.\r\n\r\nWHEN I SAW WHAT KIM THAYER WAS DOING, I THOUGHT RIGHT ON EDUCATION AND THE ARTS. EVERYTHING IS FITTING TOGETHER. AND YOU KNOW, MY BIG THING IS I WOULD LOVE TO SEE WAILUKU BE DESIGNATED AS AN ART DISTRICT AND THIS FITS IN WITH EVERYTHING GOING ON WITH THE LOWER SIDE OF TOWN AND THE CULTURAL/HISTORIC AND USE OF THESE FUNDS ARE PERFECT. SO I STAND IN FULL SUPPORT OF THIS. I WANT TO THANK ALL OF THE PEOPLE WHO SENT US MANY, MANY TESTIMONIES TO SUPPORT THIS. IT KIND OF GAVE ME A HISTORY OF THE PEOPLE INVOLVED. SO REALLY APPRECIATE THIS.\r\n\r\nMEMBERS WHEN YOU'RE READY, LET'S VOTE. THIS IS LIKE A PERFECT, PERFECT MOMENT. >> ANYONE ELSE? MY LAST THOUGHT WOULD BE OF COURSE, I'M IN SUPPORT OF THIS. I THINK THAT THEY'RE TAKING ON A HUGE LIABILITY AND EXPENSE -- IN THE SENSE THAT A LOT OF STRUCTURES ARE OUTDATED AND PROBABLY IN NEED OF MAJOR REPAIR. SO THEY ARE GOING TO NEED A LOT MORE THAN THE \$1.5 MILLION. SO WE NEED TO HELP THEM COME UP WITH A REVITALIZATION PLAN.\r\n\r\nSO THAT THIS PROPERTY WILL PRODUCE MONEY TO PAY FOR THEM TO BE THERE, AND TO GROW. OTHERWISE, THEY ARE ALWAYS GOING TO BE BEHIND THE 8-BALL TRYING TO KEEP UP WITH EXPENSES, AND SO FORTH. BECAUSE THAT PLACE IS OLD. IT IS REALLY OLD. VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ, AND THEN PRO TEM KAMA. >> I'LL YIELD TO PRO TEM KAMA. >> PRO TEM KAMA.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU, VICE-CHAIR FOR ALLOWING ME TO SPEAK BEFORE YOU. I'M SPEAKING IN TOTAL SUPPORT OF THIS PROJECT. I WANT TO SAY, IT DOES SEEM IT'S A LOT OF STUFF. NOT JUST THIS GROUP, BUT SIMILAR GROUPS WHAT THEY HAVE DONE AND OVERCOME AND WHERE THEY KNOW THEY WANT TO BE. THAT IS JUST OUR HISTORY. WE'RE RESILIENT PEOPLE.\r\n\r\nLOOK AT US. WE'RE STILL HERE. AND WE'RE STILL FIGHTING THE GOOD FIGHT; AND WE'RE STILL HAVING HOPE. WE'RE STILL BELIEVING THAT ALOHA IS THE WAY TO DO THINGS. AND I THINK JUST THE TRADITIONAL VALUES THAT WE ARE -- I LIKE TO SAY THAT WE'RE BORN WITH, BUT I KNOW IT'S WITHIN US. BUT THAT IS WHAT GIVES US THE FORTITUDE TO JUST CONTINUE TO CONTINUE ON. SO I HAVE GREAT HOPES FOR THEM, BUT YOU'RE RIGHT.\r\n\r\nWE'RE IN A POSITION TO BE ABLE TO ASSIST THEM. SO THAT THEY CAN BECOME MORE SUSTAINABLE UNTO THEMSELVES. SO OUR JOB IS TO EMPOWER THEM. SO I AM IN TOTAL SUPPORT, AND I'M READY TO VOTE. THANK YOU, CHAIR. THANK YOU, VICE-CHAIR. >> VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ.\r\n\r\n>> MAHALO, CHAIR. I JUST WANTED TO QUICKLY CHECK WITH KAHU ROBINSON AND WE ASKED A BUNCH OF QUESTIONS OF MS. THAYER EARLIER ON. AND AS THE KAHU, I WANTED TO MAKE SURE THAT IN THOSE RESPONSES IF THERE WAS ANYTHING THAT NEEDED TO BE ADDED ON, I WANTED TO GIVE HER THAT OPPORTUNITY, SINCE WE ASKED HER TO STAY ON AND SHE HAS BEEN WITH US ALL DAY. MAHALO, CHAIR. >> MAHALO. >> DO YOU WANT TO ADD ANYTHING?\r\n\r\nWOULD YOU LIKE TO ADD ANYTHING? >> JUST MY MAHALO. I'M TRYING TO KEEP IT TOGETHER, BECAUSE I'M SO HAPPY ABOUT WHAT EACH OF YOU HAVE SAID THIS AFTERNOON. YOU KNOW, I HAVE BEEN TRYING TO KEEP IT TOGETHER FOR THE LAST TWO DAYS. SOME FOLKS HAVE FELT THE NEED TO SHARE WITH ME WHAT THEY SENT INTO YOU FOLKS. IT'S BEAUTIFUL TO HAVE THAT KIND OF SUPPORT. IT'S LIKE COUNCIL MEMBER KAMA HAS SHARED, THAT IS SOMETHING THAT WE TYPICALLY EXPERIENCE IS THIS KIND OF SUPPORT, AND BACKING.\r\n\r\nIT IS HARD. IT'S HARD TO DO, BUT WE ARE READY TO TAKE IT UP. WE HAVE BEEN WILLING TO FOR OVER THE LAST SEVEN YEARS, AND WORKING HARDER AND HARDER EVERY YEAR. WE'LL CONTINUE THAT. WE'RE DEFINITELY -- DEFINITELY REALIZE THAT WE HAVE COME THROUGH MANY, MANY IMPOSSIBILITIES, AND IMPOSSIBLE SITUATIONS. BUT AT THIS MOMENT, I MEAN, ALL WE COULD DO IS PUT OURSELVES OUT THERE AND ASK. SO THANK YOU FOLKS SINCERELY.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU. >> MEMBER KING. >> THANK YOU, CHAIR. DID YOU

HAVE ANY MORE QUESTIONS, KEANI? I DIDN'T WANT -- I DIDN'T KNOW IF YOU HAD ANY ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS? >> IF YOU HAVE QUESTIONS, I JUST HAD ONE LAST COMMENT BEFORE WE VOTE. >> OKAY.\r\n\r\nI HAVE A QUESTION, AND I HAVE A COMMENT. WELL, I WILL MAKE MY COMMENT FIRST. BECAUSE I HAVE COMPLETE FAITH IN YOU FOLKS THAT YOU WILL REACH YOUR GOAL. I THINK THERE'S A LOT OF PEOPLE IN THIS COMMUNITY WHO WILL BACK YOU. SO I KNOW HOW OLD THAT FACILITY IS, BECAUSE I HAD BIRTHDAY PARTIS FOR MY CHILDREN THERE WHEN IT WAS THE HAWAI'I NATURE CENTER. MY COMPANY RENTED THOSE SPACES FOR STRATEGIC PLANNING A COUPLE OF TIMES. THAT WAS BEFORE THE BIG FLOOD HAPPENED.\r\n\r\nBUT IT WAS OLD THEN. SO I HAVE COMPLETE FAITH THAT YOU ARE GOING TO FIND THE SUPPORT THAT YOU NEED IN THE COMMUNITY, BECAUSE WHAT YOU ARE DOING IS SO IMPORTANT. MY ONLY QUESTION, WHEN THIS WAS INTRODUCED THERE WAS AN URGENCY TO THIS, BECAUSE I THINK IT WAS SOMETHING ABOUT POTENTIAL OTHER -- SOME OTHER BUYER OR SOMETHING? CAN YOU SPEAK TO THE URGENCY TO GET THIS PURCHASE DONE? THIS QUESTION IS FOR MS. ROBINSON? >> YES.\r\n\r\n>> MS. ROBINSON. >> SO WE'RE MOVING INTO YOUR NEXT SCHOOL-YEAR. WE START ON MONDAY. THIS HAS BEEN, I GUESS, ON OUR PLATE AND WE HAVE BEEN LOOKING AT REALLY FINDING A HOME HERE FOR QUITE A NUMBER OF YEARS. BUT WE'RE SO GRATEFUL THAT THE HAWAI'I NATURE CENTER IS GIVING US THE OPPORTUNITY TO DO SO THROUGH PURCHASE OF THIS LAND. AS THE YEARS HAVE COME ON, WE HAVE A NEED FOR INCREASED SPACE.\r\n\r\nOUR PROGRAM IS GROWING. WE'RE GROWING SLOW AND STEADY, BUT WE'RE GROWING. WE WOULD LIKE TO GROW IN EVEN MORE WAYS, MORE OUTREACH TO COMMUNITY, MORE WAYS THAT WE CAN SERVE OUR MAUI COMMUNITY OF LEARNERS 17:46:04 THE FEAR IF IT WAS MADE PUBLIC IT WOULD GET SCOOPED OUT FROM UNDER US -- I DON'T KNOW HOW TO EXPRESS THAT, BUT IT'S SOMETHING THAT WE REALIZED WE WERE NOT QUITE IN THE POSITION, KE KULA O PI'ILANI TO DO A MILLION DOLLAR PURCHASE, BUT WE WANTED TO BE THAT WE WOULD ASK AROUND IF WE COULD OBTAIN THIS 'AINA. FINALLY THE POINT IN GROWTH LICENSED BY THE HAWAI'I ASSOCIATION OF INDEPENDENT SCHOOL AND MOVING TO BEING ACCREDITED. SO WORKING IN WESTERN ACADEMIC CIRCLES WE WOULD HAVE A BETTER CHANCE AND MORE CLEAR PATHWAY IF WE HAD CONTROL OVER 'AINA AND SPACE TO SOLIDIFY AND MAKE SAFE, AND APPLY AND QUALIFY FOR THOSE KINDS OF DESIGNATIONS. SO IT WOULD DEFINITELY EASE OUR WAY INTO BECOMING ACCREDITED AS WE MOVE IN THAT DIRECTION. >> GREAT.\r\n\r\nTHAT WAS A GREAT EXPLANATION. I DO UNDERSTAND THE FEAR OF HAVING THE PROPERTY SCOOPED OUT FROM UNDER YOU, BECAUSE IT HAPPENED TO US RECENTLY. I'M IN FULL SUPPORT AND READY TO VOTE AFTER OUR VICE-CHAIR GIVES HER FINAL COMMENTS. >> THANK YOU, VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> I THINK I SAW MEMBER JOHNSON WITH HIS HAND UP. >> I'M SORRY, I MISSED YOU. MEMBER JOHNSON.\r\n\r\n>> THANK YOU, CHAIR. I ALSO RISE IN FULL SUPPORT AND I REALLY WANT TO TAKE A STEP BACK AND LOOK AT THE PROCESS THAT HAPPENED TODAY. WE HAD OUR INBOX FLOODED WITH EMAILS. CLERK, DID YOU HEAR? >> YES, CHAIR. YOU ALSO HAVE BEFORE YOU BILL 110, CD 1347 AMENDING CHAPTER 3.48 MAUI COUNTY CODE RELATING TO HOMES OF UNMARRIED SURVIVING SPOUSES OF VETERANS AND SEVERELY DISABLED VETERANS." 113, 114, 115, AND 116 ON SECOND AND FINAL READING. >> SECOND. >> I SAW
YOUR HAND UP MEMBER SUGIMURA, WAS THAT TO SECOND THE MOTION?
NO?\r\n\r\nNO, BECAUSE -- HUH? YES. >> I WANTED THE TO ASK IF 110 COULD
BE SEPARATED OUT? >> LET'S DO THIS FIRST. SECONDED BY PRO TEM KAMA TO
PASS ALL OF THOSE BILLS ON SECOND AND FINAL READING. NOW IS THERE ANY
OBJECTION TO TAKING WHICH ONE OUT? >> 110, CD 1. THE VETERANS
BILL.\r\n\r\nI HAVE AN AMENDMENT FOR THAT, AMENDMENT SUMMARY FORM. >> ANY
OBJECTION TO SEPARATING 110? >> CHAIR? >> YES. >> MAHALO, CHAIR. CAN WE

MOTION IS TO AMEND BILL 110, CD 1 TO DELETE THE THREE INSTANCES OF 50% OF
THE MINIMUM REAL PROPERTY TAX AND DELETE THE BRACKETS AROUND THE THREE
INSTANCES OF \$150. >> CORRECT.\r\n\r\n>> SECOND. >> THANK YOU. >> MOVED
BY MEMBER SUGIMURA. THAT WAS HER MOTION. >> THANK YOU. >> DID EVERYBODY
HEAR THE MOTION? >> IT'S IN THE ASF.\r\n\r\n>> I HAVE MY COPY NOW. DID
EVERYBODY GET A COPY OF MEMBER SUGIMURA'S ASF AND YOU ALSO HEARD WHAT
VICE-CHAIR HAD SAID? >> THANKS, KEANI. >> THE MOTION IS ON THE FLOOR AS
JUST MENTIONED. SO WHO IS GOING TO SECOND THAT MOTION? >> I DID, CHAIR.
>> NO, YOU DIDN'T, BECAUSE IT WAS JUST READ.\r\n\r\nSO MOVED BY MEMBER
SUGIMURA, BUT SPOKEN BY VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. [LAUGHTER] AND

OKAY.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU. >> MEMBER SUGIMURA. >> I STARTED DISCUSSING IT.
WHEN THIS BILL BY MEMBER MOLINA CAME UP, IT WENT TO THE ATTENTION OF
THOSE PEOPLE THAT I MENTIONED, AND THEY -- THE NET EFFECT OF WHAT WE DID
IS REALLY PROBABLY UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCES BY PUTTING THE 50% IN, VERSUS
TAKING OUT THE 150, AND \$150, AND SO WHAT HAPPENED WAS THE TOTAL
DISABLED, WHICH IS 100%, VERSUS 70% -- TOTAL DISABLED HAD THEIR TAXES
INCREASED BECAUSE MINIMUM TAX IS \$350, DIVIDED BY TWO AND THEY WOULD END
UP ACTUALLY PAYING MORE IN THE NEXT FISCAL YEAR FOR REAL PROPERTY TAXES
BY THE MOTION WE DID ON THE FLOOR. SO THEREFORE, I KNOW IT WAS DONE WITH
GOOD INTENTIONS, BUT IN FIGHTING FOR THE VETERANS IN FAIRNESS, WHAT LLOYD
SAID, WE WANT WHAT IS FAIR AND BEST FOR ALL VETERANS. I THINK THE MOTION
THAT WE DID, WE ENDED UP INCREASING THOSE WITH 100 DISABILITY, BUT YET,

MAKING A BENEFIT FOR THOSE 70, UP TO THAT POINT; RIGHT? THE OTHER THING THAT I LEARNED IS THAT I DIDN'T EVEN KNOW THIS, BECAUSE I HAD A BROTHER WHO WAS 100% DISABLED AND LLOYD SAID A PERSON THAT HAS A PERCENTAGE AS A DISABILITIES IS NOT FIXED FOR LIFE.\r\n\r\nIT COULD CHANGE. IT COULD GET BETTER; RIGHT? SO THAT IS WHAT HE SAID. THE NET EFFECT IS WE ENDED UP IMPACTING THE 100% DISABLED, BECAUSE OF THE 50%. SO MY MOTION IS TO BRING IT BACK TO THE 150, WHICH WAS IN THE BILL FROM THE BEGINNING. SO THE TOTAL DISABLED WILL NOT GET THEIR TAXES INCREASED BY THE MOTION THAT WE MADE ON THE FLOOR THE DAY THAT THIS PASSED ON FIRST READING. THAT IS MY LONG VERSION OF WHAT THIS MOTION WOULD DO. BUT ANYBODY HAVE QUESTIONS?\r\n\r\n>> MR. MOLINA. DO YOU HAVE ANY COMMENTS, MR. MOLINA? >> I JUST -- I GUESS, IF IT WAS AN UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCE. BASICALLY I'M UNDERSTANDING WHAT THE PROPOSAL IS EVERYBODY GETS \$150 FROM 100% TO 70%, AND WHAT WE HAD DONE BEFORE, NET EFFECT OF THAT CAUSED THE PEOPLE WHO ARE 100% TO PAY NOW A HIGHER MINIMUM TAX, IS THAT THE UNDERSTANDING MEMBER SUGIMURA. >> YES, THAT IS WHAT HAPPENED.\r\n\r\nIT CAUGHT THE ATTENTION OF THESE PEOPLE AND I THINK WE DID THIS UNINTENDED CONSEQUENCE. BUT IT REALLY RAISED THE TAXES FOR THOSE THAT ARE 100% DISABLED. IT'S NOT A LARGE AMOUNT, BUT IT'S SIGNIFICANT ENOUGH THAT THEY THOUGHT IT WOULDN'T BE FAIR FOR THEM AT THE 100% LEVEL TO NOW PAY A PENALTY BECAUSE WE'RE TRYING TO HELP SOMEONE ELSE. THAT IS KIND OF THE SUMMARY OF IT. >> THANK YOU. >> SO WE'RE DELETING THE THREE INSTANCES OF 50% OF THE MINIMUM REAL PROPERTY TAX. >> YES.\r\n\r\nAND SUBSTITUTING BACK. >> AND REMOVING BRACKETS. >> YES. >> MORE QUESTIONS? COMMENTS? VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. >> MAHALO, CHAIR.\r\n\r\nSO I HAVE ONE COMMENT AND ONE QUESTION. THE FIRST IS THE COMMENT ABOUT THE 150. SO BY TETHERING IT TO THE MINIMUM TAX, AT THAT TIME, IT WASN'T NECESSARILY UNINTENDED. SO WHEN MINIMUM TAX IS -- SO MINIMUM TAX ISN'T FIXED. IT CHANGES DURING BUDGET SESSION. WE SET MINIMUM TAX. SO IF MINIMUM TAX GOES DOWN, THEN THE 50% WOULD ALSO BE REDUCED. ON THE OTHER SIDE, IF MINIMUM TAX GOES UP, THEN THE 50% WOULD BE HIGHER.\r\n\r\nSO IF IT'S AT \$150 IT DOESN'T CHANGE DURING BUDGET SESSION, UNLESS WE INTRODUCE A BILL TO CHANGE IT, IF MINIMUM TAX WERE TO DROP TO, SAY, TO \$200. IS IF MINIMUM TAX WAS SET AT \$200 AND IT WAS 50%, THEN FOR THE VETERANS THAT WOULD QUALIFY, IT WOULD BE \$100, INSTEAD OF \$150. AND SO IF WE WANT TO SET IT AT A FIXED RATE OF \$150, I'M SUPPORTIVE OF THAT. THAT WASN'T A DEAL-BREAKER IN ANY WAY. I JUST WANTED IT MAKE SURE WHEN THERE'S A REDUCTION IN THE MINIMUM TAX THAT THE VETERANS THAT QUALIFY WOULD ALSO RECEIVE THAT REDUCTION. BUT AT THE SAME TIME, IF THE TAX IS INCREASED, THEN THE VETERANS THAT WOULD QUALIFY WOULD THEN PAY MORE THAN \$150. SO IS -- I CAN BE SUPPORTIVE OF THAT AMENDMENT, IF THAT POLICY DECISION FOR THIS BODY. THE SECOND PART, THE QUESTION STRIKING 50% OF THE -- OH, I SEE. OKAY. NEVER MIND.\r\n\r\nI REREAD IT AGAIN. I UNDERSTAND. OKAY. MAHALO, CHAIR. >> ANY OTHER QUESTIONS, MEMBERS? YOU READY TO VOTE ON THE AMENDMENT? >> ARE YOU OKAY, MR.\r\n\r\nMOLINA? OKAY. THAT WAS MY BIG CONCERN. >> ALL THOSE IN FAVOR OF THE AMENDMENT, RAISE YOUR HAND AND SAY AYE? >> AYE. >> NINE AYES, ZERO NOS, MOTION CARRIES. >> THANK YOU, MEMBERS.\r\n\r\nTHANK YOU, MR. MOLINA. >> MAIN MOTION WHICH WAS TO PASS ALL OF THESE BILLS ON SECOND AND FINAL READING INCLUDING THIS ONE. RAISE YOUR HAND AND SAY AYE? >> AYE. >> OH, I MOVE TO WAIVE RULE 19C OF THE RULES OF THE COUNCIL TO ENABLE US TO TAKE ACTION ON THE LEGISLATION AFTER AMENDING IT. >> SECOND.\r\n\r\n>> OKAY. MOVED BY VICE-CHAIR RAWLINS-FERNANDEZ. SECONDED BY MEMBER MOLINA TO WAIVE THE RULES OF THE COUNCIL IN ORDER FOR US TO BE ABLE TO TAKE ACTION. CAN YOU EXPLAIN THAT, VICE-CHAIR, FOR THE PUBLIC? >> SURE, MAHALO, CHAIR. SO

RULE 19C OF THE RULES OF THE COUNCIL REQUIRES US TO -- NO AMENDMENTS ON THE FINAL READING AND WE MADE AN AMENDMENT, AND SO THIS WOULD ALLOW US TO TAKE THIS ACTION ON FINAL PASSAGE, WHERE WE HAVE AMENDED THE LEGISLATION. >> SO WHO DID YOUR NOTES, MEMBER SUGIMURA?\r\n\r\nHER NOTES HAS IT. I READ IT FROM HER NOTES. >> YOU READ IT FROM HER NOTES, OKAY. I DON'T SEE IT ON MINE. >> IT'S IN THE SECOND PART OF THE MOTION. IF THE MOTION IS SUCCESSFUL, MOVE TO WAIVE RULE 19C OF THE RULES OF THE COUNCIL. >> I SEE.\r\n\r\nOKAY. SECOND PART OF THE MOTION. >> SORRY, I JUST MISPLACED MY PAPERS. THANK YOU, KEANI. >> YOU'RE WELCOME. >> SO WE JUST NEED TO VOTE ON THAT THEN, TO WAIVE THE RULES. ALL THOSE IN FAVOR, RAISE YOUR HAND, AND SAY AYE?\r\n\r\n>> AYE. >> MOTION CARRIES ON THE WAIVER. NOW THE MAIN MOTION AS AMENDED. ANY DISCUSSION ON THAT? IF NOT, ALL THOSE IN FAVOR, SAY AYE, AND RAISE YOUR HAND. >> AYE. >> MEMBER PALTIN?\r\n\r\nMEMBER KAMA? OKAY. NINE AYES, ZERO NOS, MOTION CARRIES. ALL RIGHT, I THINK THAT IS THE END. MR. CLERK? >> CHAIR, THERE IS NO FURTHER BUSINESS BEFORE THE COUNCIL.\r\n\r\n>> WOW. VERY GOOD. VERY GOOD, MEMBERS.
