AUTHORIZING MAUI ELECTRIC COMPANY, LIMITED, TO INSTALL A UTILITY POLE ON KOKOMO ROAD (HAIKU)

DESCRIPTION:

The Committee is in receipt of County Communication No. 07-303, from the Director of Public Works, transmitting a proposed resolution entitled "AUTHORIZING MAUI ELECTRIC COMPANY, LIMITED, TO INSTALL ONE UTILITY POLE ON KOKOMO ROAD, HAIKU, MAUI, HAWAII". The purpose of the proposed resolution is to approve the installation of one 60-foot utility pole within the County right-of-way along Kokomo Road, Haiku, Maui, Hawaii, and adjacent to land identified as TMK: (2) 2-7-02:004.

**PWF-26 AMENDING CHAPTER 18.20, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO
SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENTS**

DESCRIPTION: The Committee is in receipt of County Communication No. 07-95, from the Director of Public Works and Environmental Management, transmitting a proposed bill entitled “A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 18.20, MAUI COUNTY CODE, PERTAINING TO SUBDIVISION IMPROVEMENTS”. The primary purposes of the proposed bill are to: (1) delete an allowance for deferral of frontage improvements for subdivisions of three lots or less; and (2) require certain minimum pavement specifications for required improvements to existing streets resulting from such subdivisions.

STATUS: The Committee may consider whether to recommend passage of the proposed bill on first reading, with or without revisions. The Committee may also consider the filing of County Communication No. 07-95 and other related action.

**PWF-56 AMENDING SECTION 6.04.040, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING
TO ANIMAL REGULATIONS; AND CHAPTER 13.04, MAUI COUNTY
CODE, RELATING TO RECREATIONAL AREA REGULATIONS**

DESCRIPTION: The Committee is in receipt of County Communication No. 07-302, from the Director of Parks and Recreation, transmitting a proposed bill entitled “A BILL FOR AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 6.04.040, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO ANIMAL REGULATIONS, AND AMENDING CHAPTER 13.04, MAUI COUNTY CODE, RELATING TO RECREATIONAL AREA REGULATIONS”. The primary purposes of the proposed bill are to: (1) establish designated dog parks; (2) establish acceptable leash lengths outside of designated dog parks; and (3) require dog owners to dispose of their dog’s waste.
