BF-1 PROPOSED BUDGET FOR FISCAL YEAR 2005 FOR THE COUNTY OF MAUI

DESCRIPTION: The Committee is in receipt of County Communication No. 03-265, from the Chair of the Budget and Finance Committee, requesting the establishment of an item to consider the proposed budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2005. In anticipation of receiving the Mayor's proposed budget for the Fiscal Year (FY) 2005 on or before March 15, 2004 (as required by the Charter of the County of Maui, Section 9-2.1), the Committee is scheduling meetings to review the proposed FY 2005 Budget. The Committee may receive a general overview of the proposed FY 2005 Budget from representatives of the Administration. The Committee may also begin the review of individual departments' operations and proposed appropriations.

STATUS: The Committee will discuss and consider revisions to the Mayor's proposed budget. The Committee may also consider other related action.

NOTE: With reference to this agenda item, one or more executive meetings pursuant to Section 92-5(a), Hawaii Revised Statutes, may be held:

- (1) to consider and evaluate personal information relating to individuals applying for professional or vocational licenses cited in Section 26-9 or both;
- (2) to consider the hire, evaluation, dismissal, or discipline of an officer or employee or of charges brought against the officer or employee, where consideration of matters affecting privacy will be involved; provided that if the individual concerned requests an open meeting, an open meeting shall be held;
- (3) to deliberate concerning the authority of persons designated by the County, the Council, or the Committee to conduct labor negotiations or to negotiate the acquisition of public property, or during the conduct of such negotiations;
- (4) to consult with legal counsel on questions and issues pertaining to the powers, duties, privileges, immunities, and liabilities of the County, the Council, and the Committee;
- (5) to investigate proceedings regarding criminal misconduct;
- (6) to consider sensitive matters related to public safety or security;
- (7) to consider matters relating to the solicitation and acceptance of private donations; and
- (8) to deliberate or make a decision upon a matter that requires the consideration of information that must be kept confidential pursuant to a State or Federal law, or a court order.
