

Each page has a different activity and picture to color. You can draw pictures of the community, your home, and your neighborhood. You can also use your imagination to color and draw new things.




Your Community

You live in a community! A community is a group of people living or working together in the same area. When people work together to keep the land and water clean, they help make a great neighborhood for you to live in.




Draw what you will do as a Clean Water Warrior!

Water Flow


Water flows across the ground. Water can come from rain, garden hoses, or sprinklers. Some of the water may be absorbed into the ground. When water falls on hard surfaces, like driveways or sidewalks, it moves into the street. Water moves along the street in a gutter and then into a catch basin on the street. Water that enters the catch basin may go into our streams and the ocean.



Locate all the sources of outside water and draw where it flows.



Land Pollution

Land pollution is all the trash left on the ground. Litter, pet waste, cigarette butts, aluminum cans, plastic bags, and fast-food trash are types of land pollution.




CATCH BASIN

Look carefully, and circle the land pollution you can find around this neighborhood.




Draw fish under the ocean living in clean, healthy water.

As a Clean Water Warrior, it is your job to help pick up land pollution so it will not get into the storm drains and into the ocean.




**Draw a picture of yourself picking up land pollution
and putting it into the bin.**




In our community, land pollution that does not get picked up and thrown away, is carried by water and rain into a catch basin. The catch basin leads to storm drains under the street.

Storm drains take the water and land pollution to the ocean. Land pollution that goes to the ocean can harm people, coral, and animal life.
