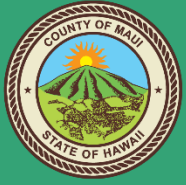

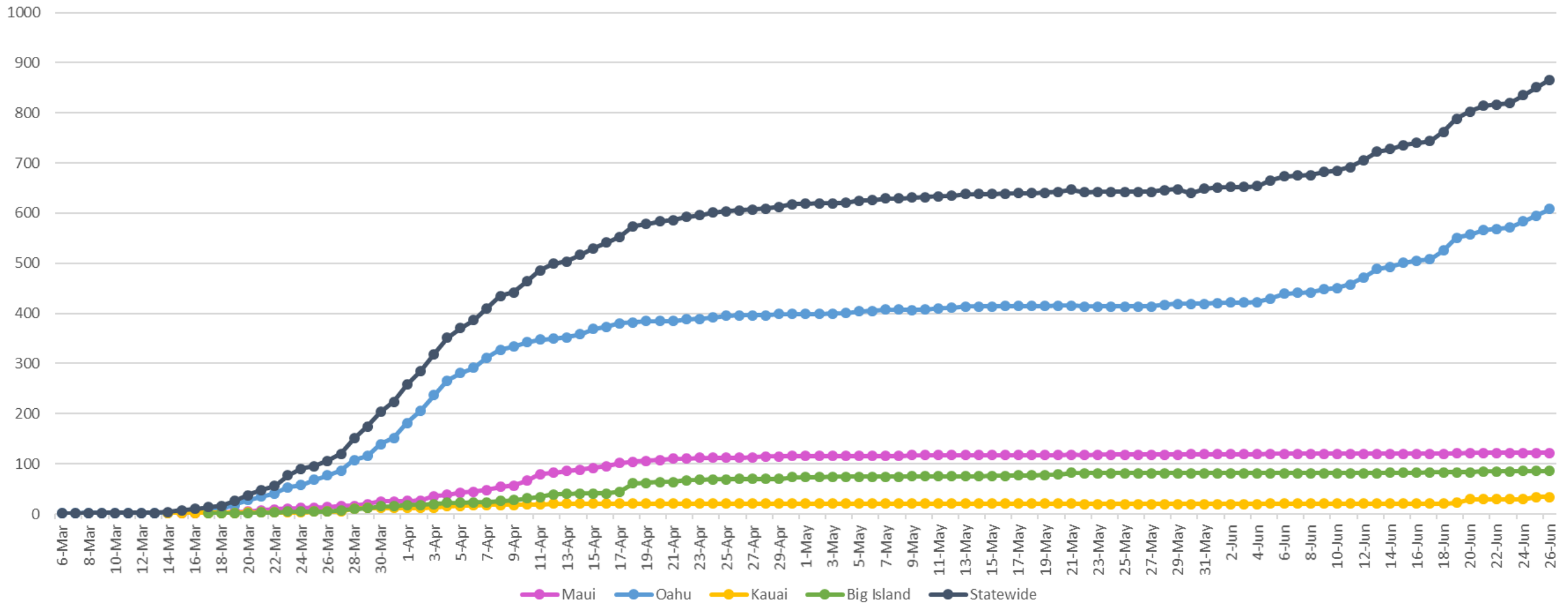

Cumulative Total COVID-19 Cases Showing Statewide Total and by County (6/26/20)

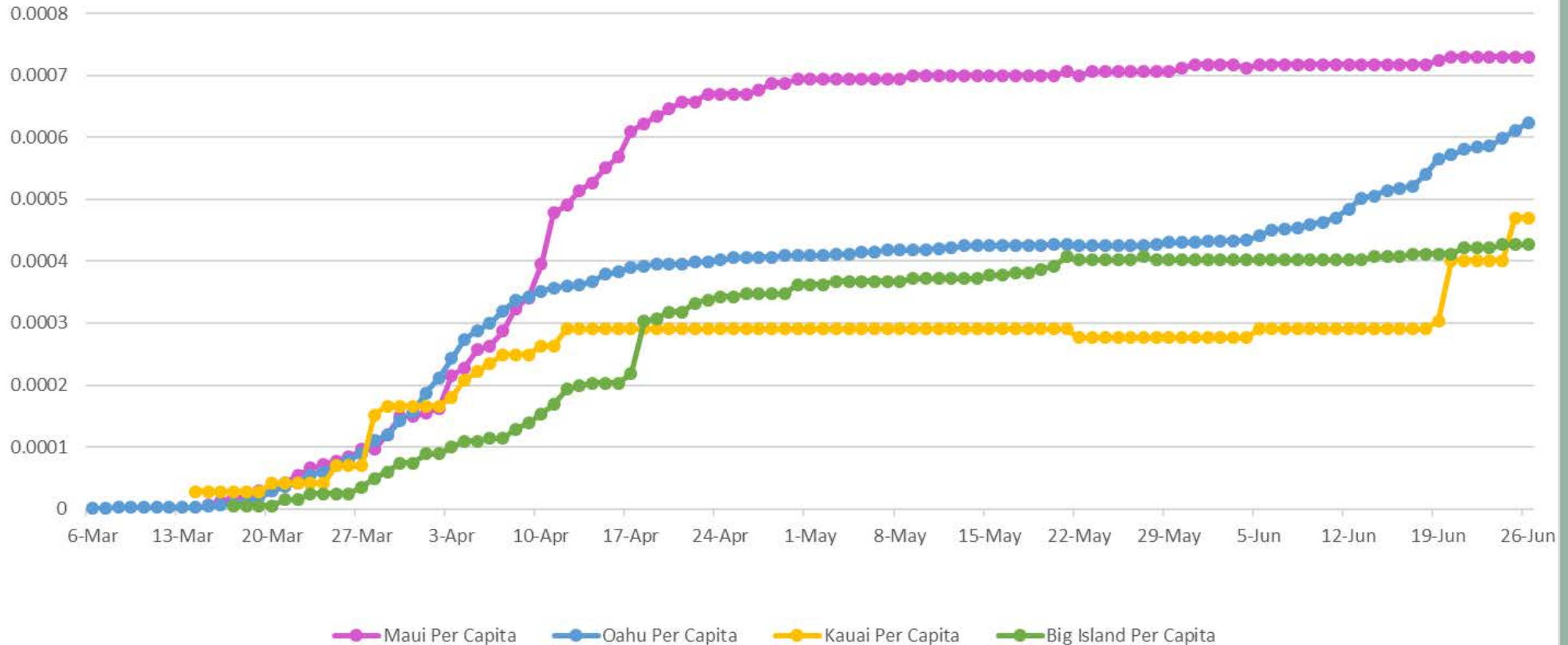

## Positive COVID-19 Cases Per Capita by County, June 26, 2020

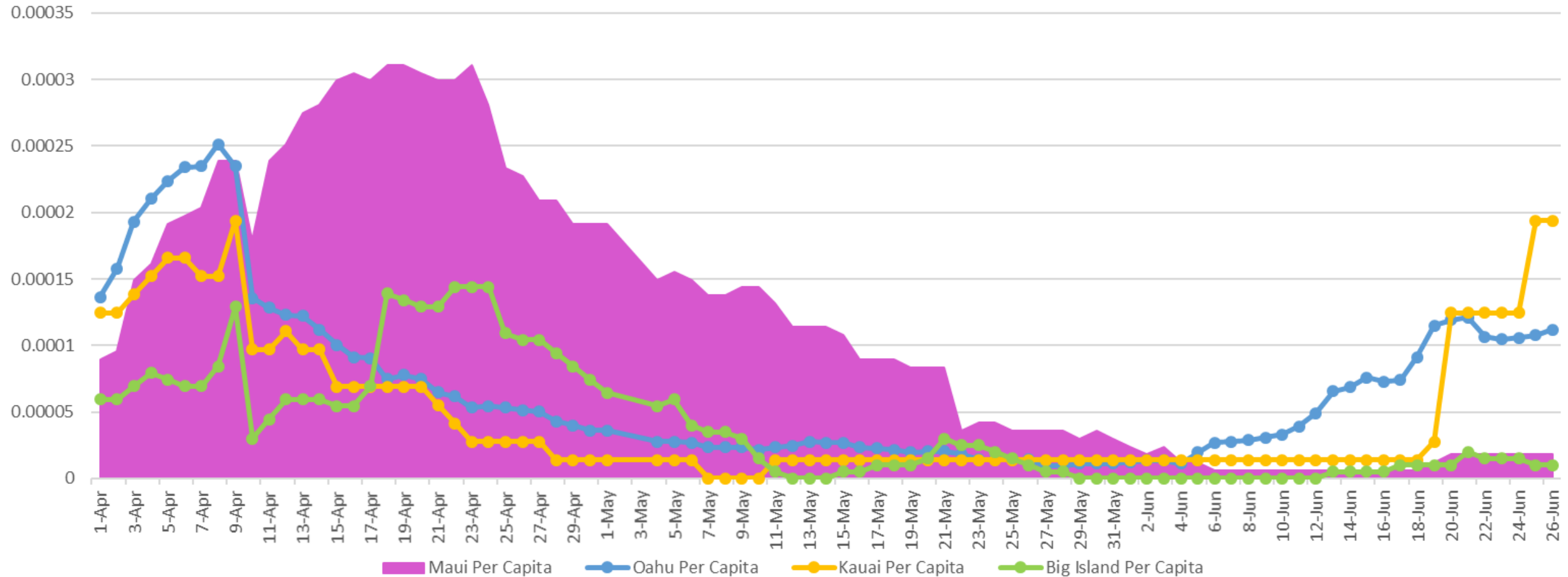

Active Cases in Isolation per Capita by County (June 26, 2020)

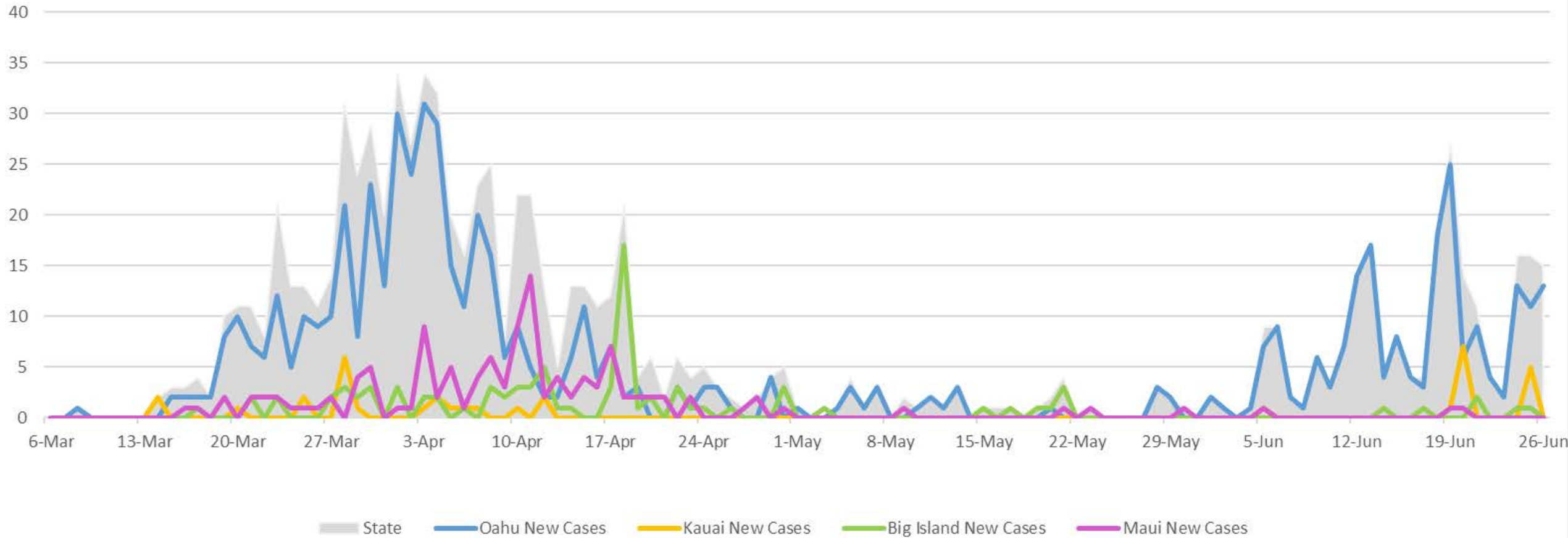

Hawaii COVID-19 New Daily Cases by County Over Time as of 6/26/20

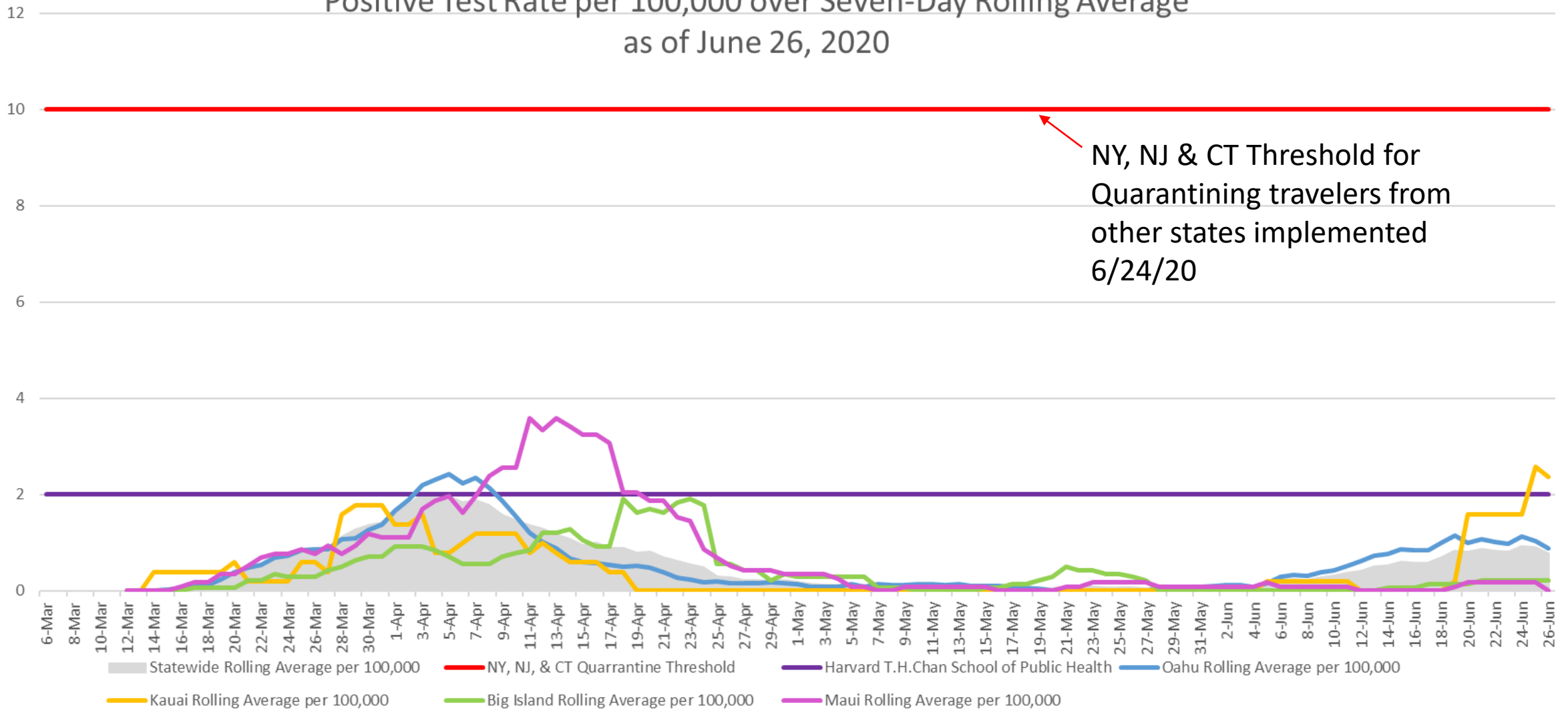

# Real Property Tax Waiver of Penalties

- The County of Maui will be deferring the 10% penalty fee for Real Property Taxes due on Aug. 20 for 60 days.
- We want to make sure our residents and businesses aren't penalized for not being able to pay the full amount immediately due to financial impacts from COVID-19
- Tax payments can be spread out over the period of Aug. 20 through Oct. 20, 2020.
  - Unpaid balances after Oct. 20 will be assessed the penalty fee.



# Real Property Tax Waiver of Penalties

- While this deferral gives people more time, we still encourage those who are able to pay their bill as normal to avoid the standard 1% monthly interest for unpaid balances after Aug. 20.

# Drive-Through Testing by Minit Medical

# Drive-Through Testing in Central Maui

- **Drive-through testing today at Keopuolani Regional Park:**
  - 75 antibody blood tests
  - 37 PCR diagnostic tests
- **Drive-through testing yesterday at the South Maui Community Park:**
  - 56 antibody blood tests
  - 35 PCR diagnostic tests
- **Drive-through testing Wednesday at Lahaina Aquatic Center:**
  - 48 antibody blood tests
  - 34 PCR diagnostic tests

# Drive-Through Testing in Central Maui

- Minit Medical will be calling all drive-through participants with results in the next 1 – 3 days.
- Minit Medical, Maui Medical Group, Malama I Ke Ola Health Center and many other local providers continue to provide testing.
- People can also call their primary care physician to get tested.

# State Releases Updated Employment Insurance Information

- The State Department of Labor and Industrial Relations has paid over **\$1.7 billion** in unemployment insurance claims since the onset of the **COVID-19** pandemic on **March 1**.
- **93%** of the valid unemployment insurance claims have been processed and paid out by the **DLIR**.
- **DLIR** still has over **11,000** clean claims ready for payment of benefits by filing weekly claim certifications.

# State Releases Updated Employment Insurance Information

- DLIR has worked to refine unemployment insurance data to more strategically target those with pending claims as well as to evolve processing operations.
- One challenge DLIR is having are employers and claimants not answer its phone calls.
  - If you are involved in the unemployment insurance program, please note that both (808) 762-5751 and (808) 762-5752 is the DLIR trying to reach you to process claims.

# **Clinical Healthcare Professionals Needed for Contact Tracing**

- **The University of Hawaii and Hawaii Department of Health Contact Tracing Training Program is looking for more applicants with a clinical healthcare background and an undergraduate degree who are available to be full time contact tracers for up to three months in the near future.**
- **A smaller number of applicants who are able to serve part-time (at least 20 hours per week) will also be considered.**
- **These contact tracers will provide the supplemental workforce capacity to identify and facilitate isolating individuals who are sick or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19.**



# Clinical Healthcare Professionals Needed for Contact Tracing

- The UH-DOH program has reopened registration for Track 1: Contact Tracing Training for Clinical Healthcare Professional
- The free, accelerated online training course takes a day and a half to complete and is open to registered nurses, nurse practitioners, social workers, pharmacists, physicians, physician assistances, EMTs, and paramedics.

# Warning of Scams

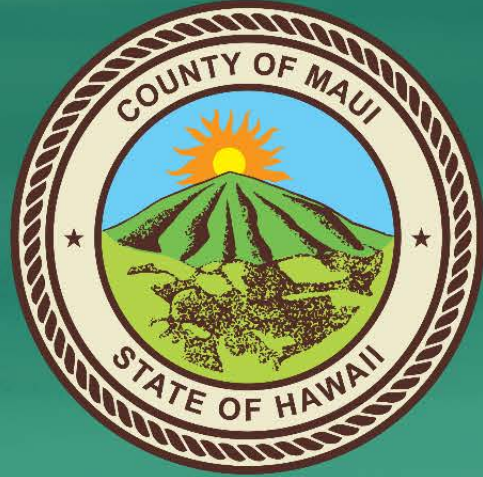
- **The County of Maui and State of Hawaii continues to warn the public of a variety of scams associated with COVID-19 – the latest involving scammers impersonating contact tracers trying to acquire personal information.**
- **Red flags to be aware of when called by fake contact tracers:**
  - **Requesting Social Security Number**
  - **Requesting bank information**
  - **Requesting form of payment**

# Warning of Scams

- An authorized contact tracer will not disclose the identity of the person who tested positive but may ask you for names and contact information for everyone you came in close contact with while possibly infectious so that they can contact those individuals as well.
