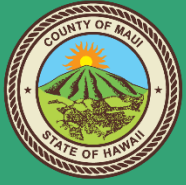

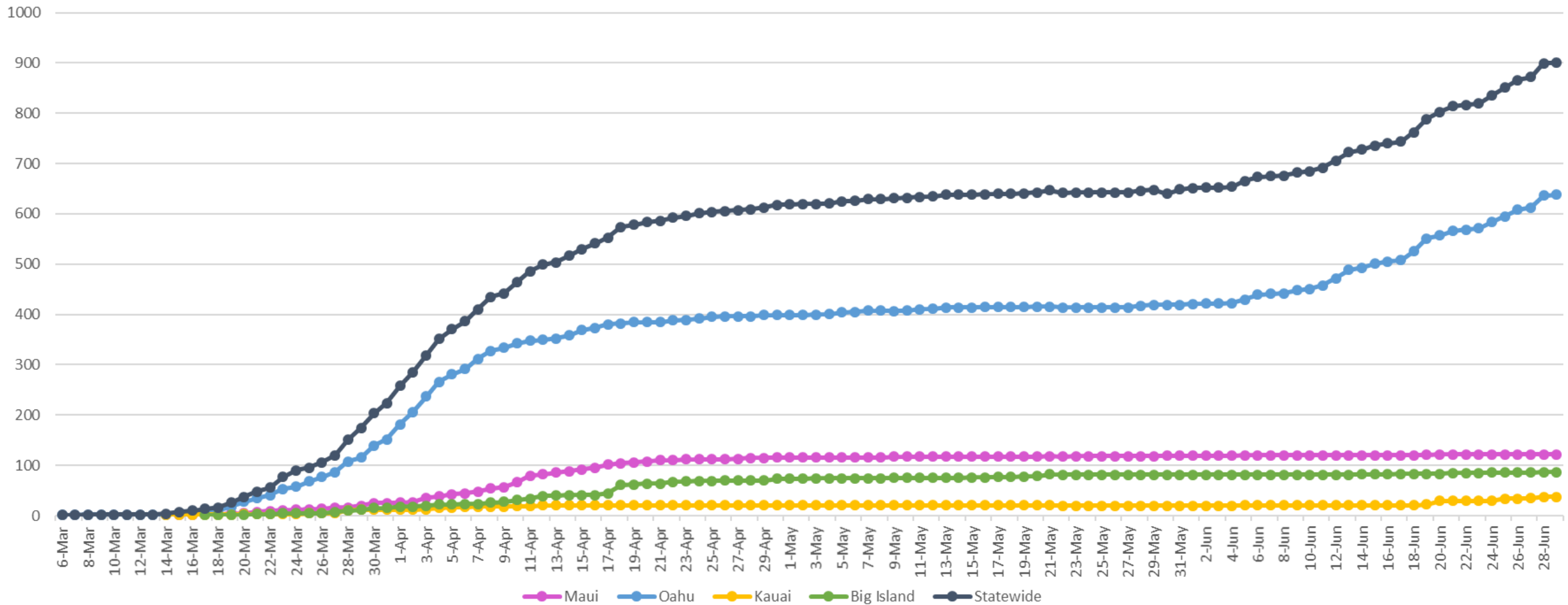

Cumulative Total COVID-19 Cases Showing Statewide Total and by County (6/29/20)

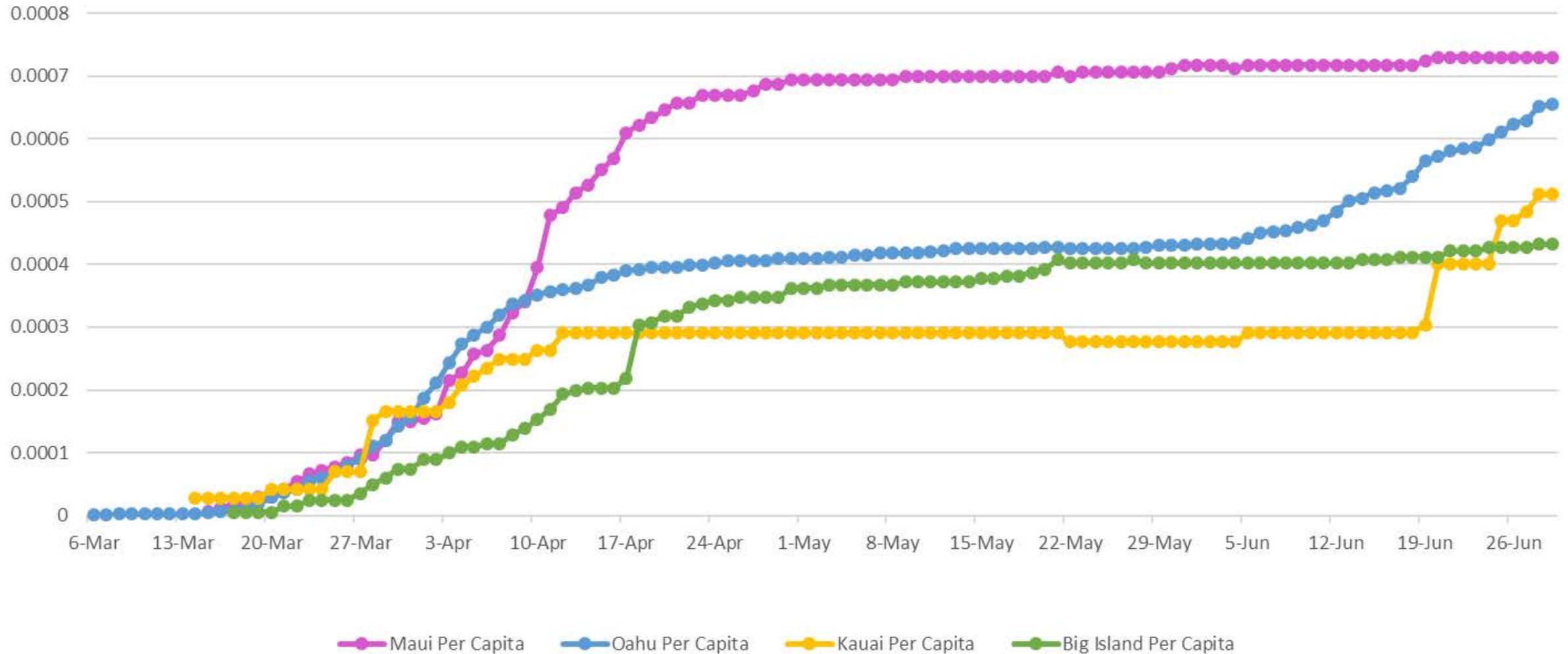

Positive COVID-19 Cases Per Capita by County, June 29, 2020

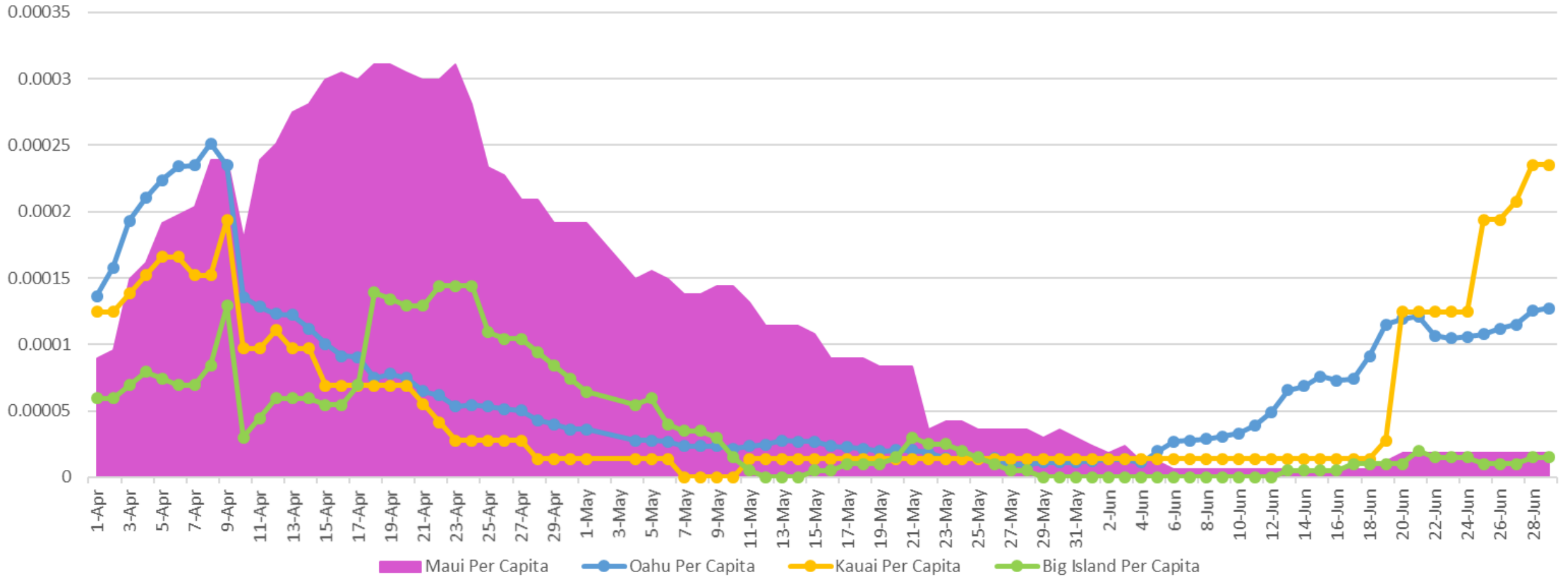

Active Cases in Isolation per Capita by County (June 29, 2020)

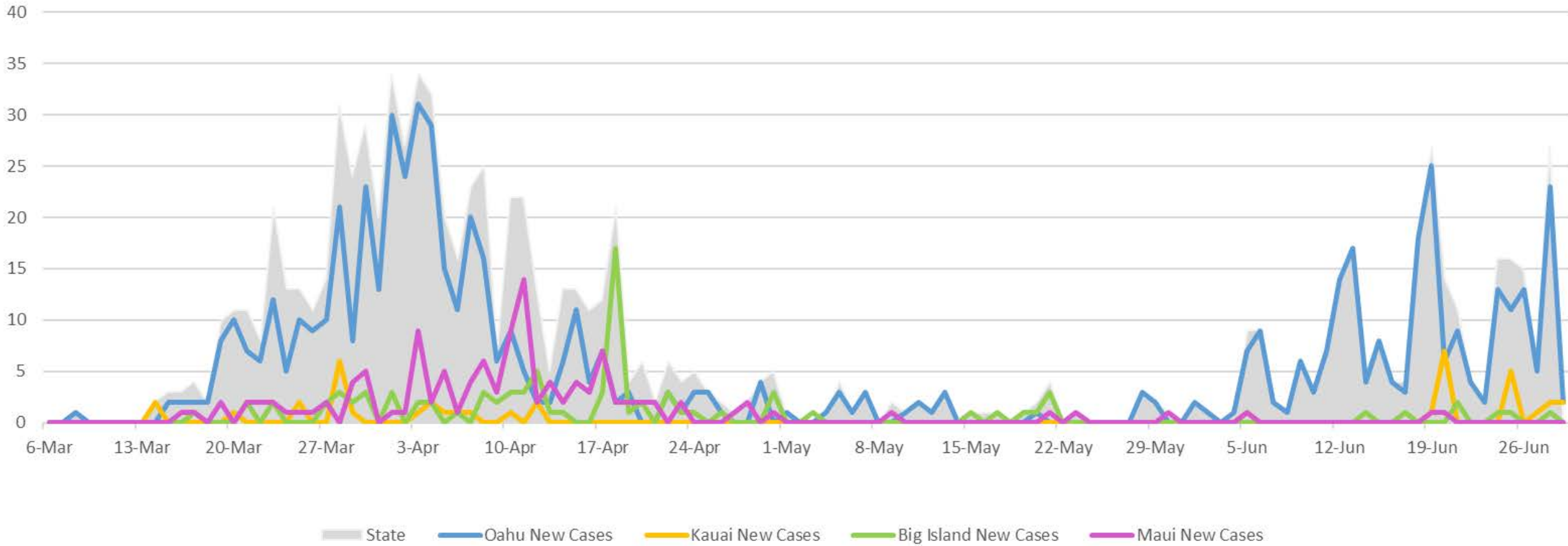

Hawaii COVID-19 New Daily Cases by County Over Time as of 6/29/20

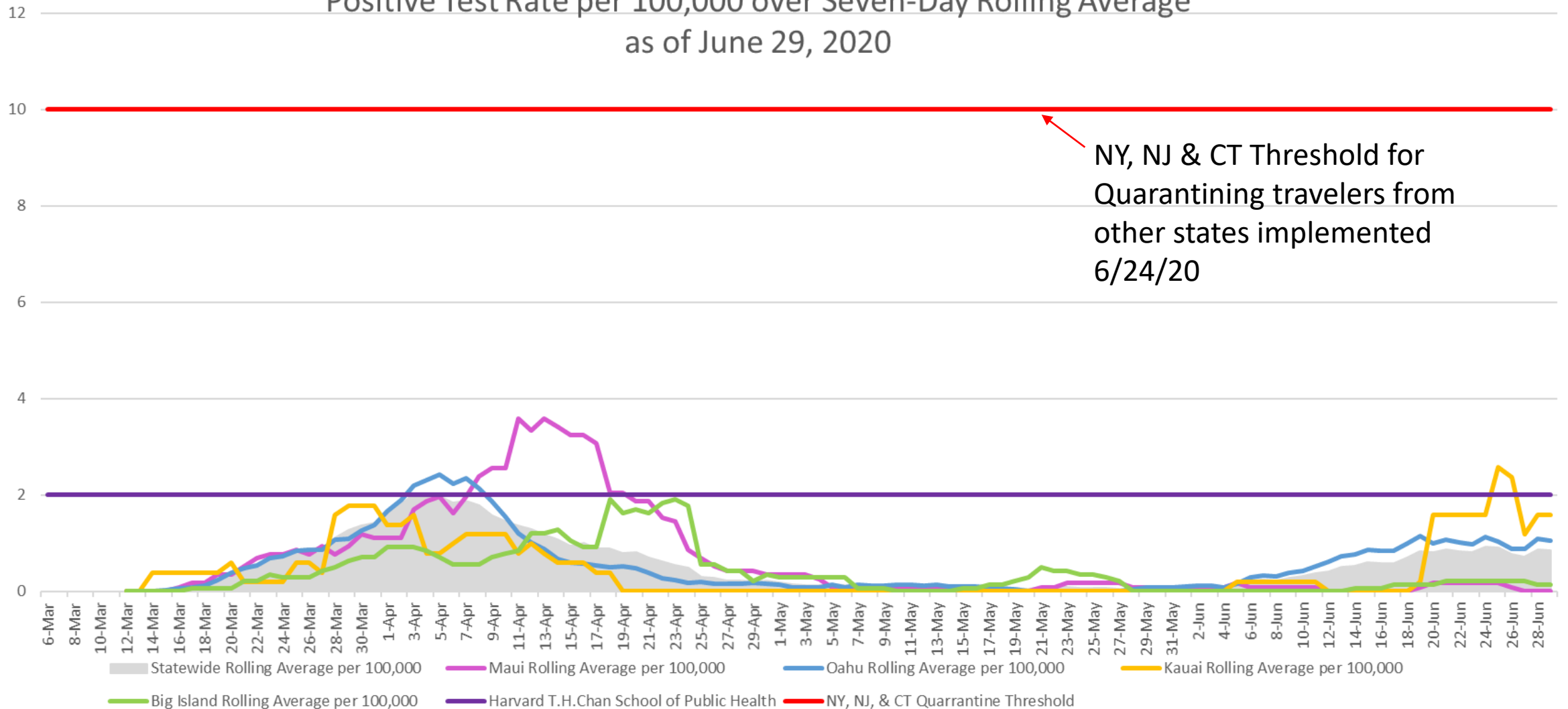

Waiver of County Convenience Fees Extended

- **The County of Maui is extending its waiver of credit card convenience fees and transaction fees for all County bills – except Real Property Tax.**
- **The fees will be waived through September 30, 2020.**
- **This includes payments for Solid Waste residential trash accounts, Water and Motor Vehicle Registration Renewals.**

Waiver of County Convenience Fees Extended

- **The waiver of fees continues to make County services safer and easier for the public by encouraging cashless transactions and payment of bills online and at Self-Service Terminals for Motor Vehicle Registration Renewals, rather than in-person.**

Request to Governor on extending limited traffic to East Maui

- We have sent a letter to the Governor requesting the extension of traffic limitations through East Maui until July 15.
- East Maui residents have expressed their deep concerns regarding the limited medical and public safety resources available to their isolated community.
- There is no 24-hour medical facility and residents have limited access to emergency services.

Request to Governor on extending limited traffic to East Maui

- **Increasing public access to this remote area may strain critical resources.**
- **Sen. J. Kalani English, Rep Lynn DeCoite, State agencies and members of the East Maui community will be using the added time to formulate a reservation and management system.**

Maui County Status Update

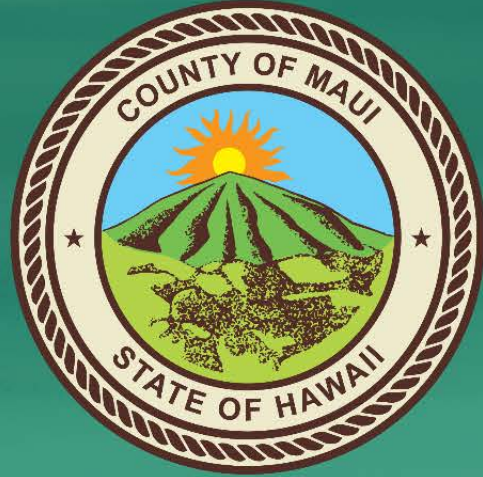
- Maui County has crossed over 10,000 tests with nearly 99% returning negative.
- Less than half of our ICU beds remain in use and none are for COVID-19.
- Just 11% of ventilators are in use and none are for COVID-19.
- Statewide emergency management agencies, health officials and County leaders continue to review and increase surge capacity in preparation for future outbreaks.

County Pools & Reservation Modifications for July 4 Holiday

- All County pools will be closed in observance of the July 4 Holiday on Saturday.
- Pool reservations also will not be taken on Friday, July 3, in observance of the Holiday.
- To make pool reservations for July 5 – 7, swimmers must call by Thursday, July 2.
- The reservation phone line is available from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. and can be reached at (808) 270-6116.

Closing Remarks

- With statewide total cases reaching 900 and Oahu reporting double digit new positives regularly, it is important that we in Maui County do not become complacent.
- As we've said many times before, we have reached this point because of your efforts and precautions.
- July 4 weekend is coming up and we must not forget all of the health and safety guidelines in order to protect ourselves and our loved ones.
- Limit gatherings, wash your hands regularly, wear your face coverings and maintain physical distancing.
