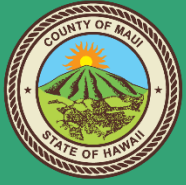

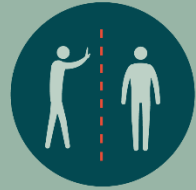

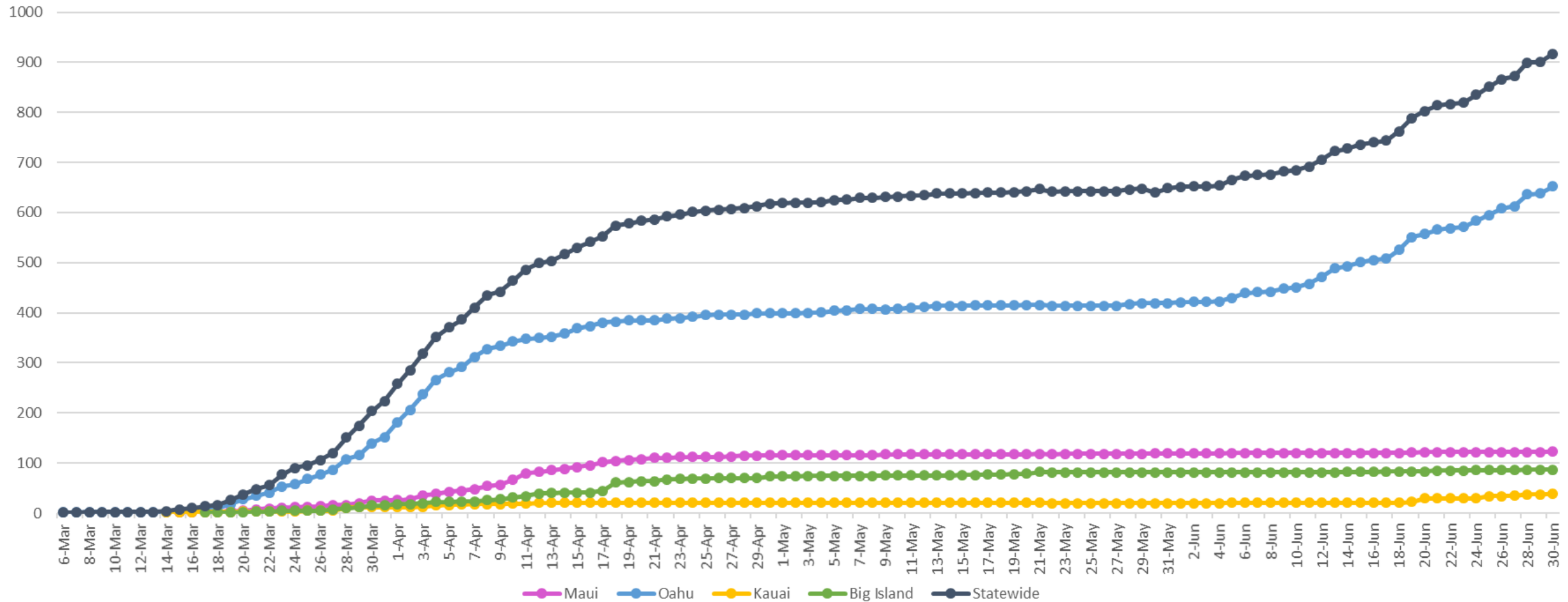

Cumulative Total COVID-19 Cases Showing Statewide Total and by County (6/30/20)

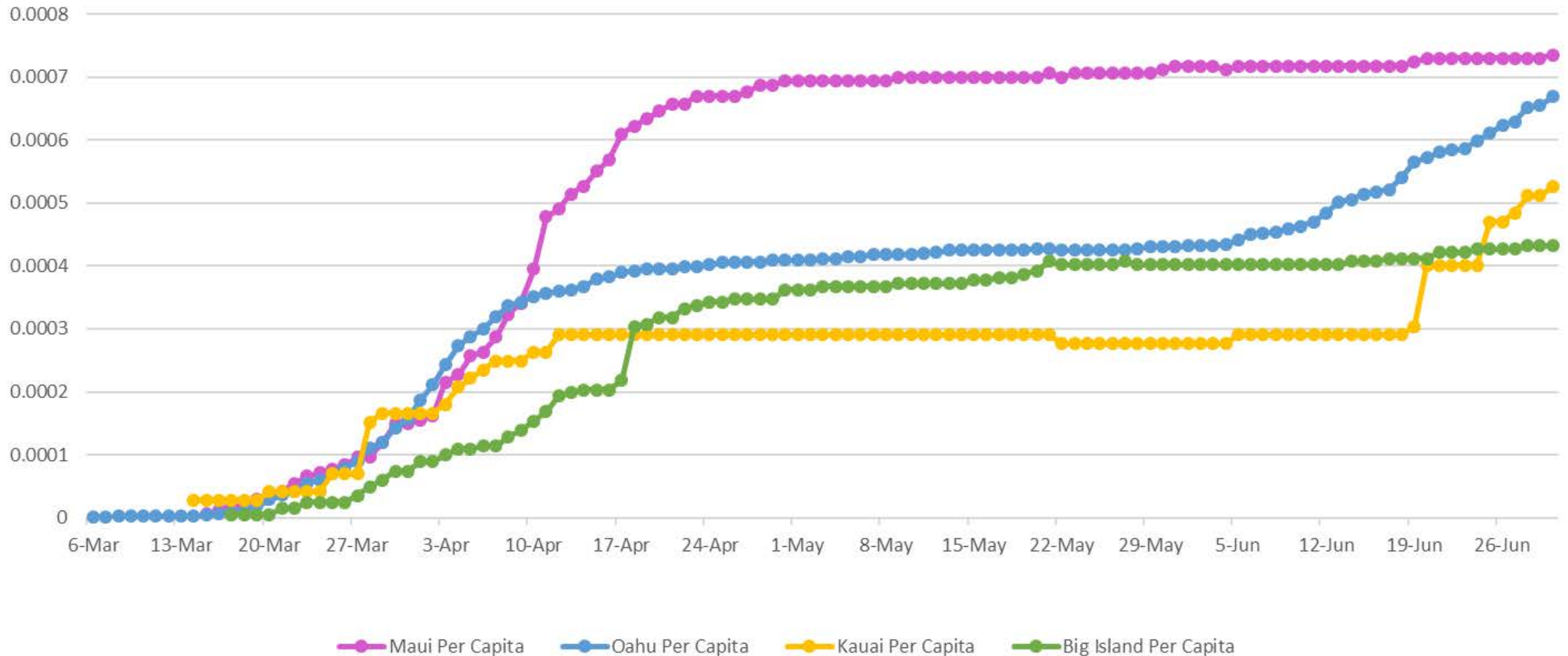

Positive COVID-19 Cases Per Capita by County, June 30, 2020

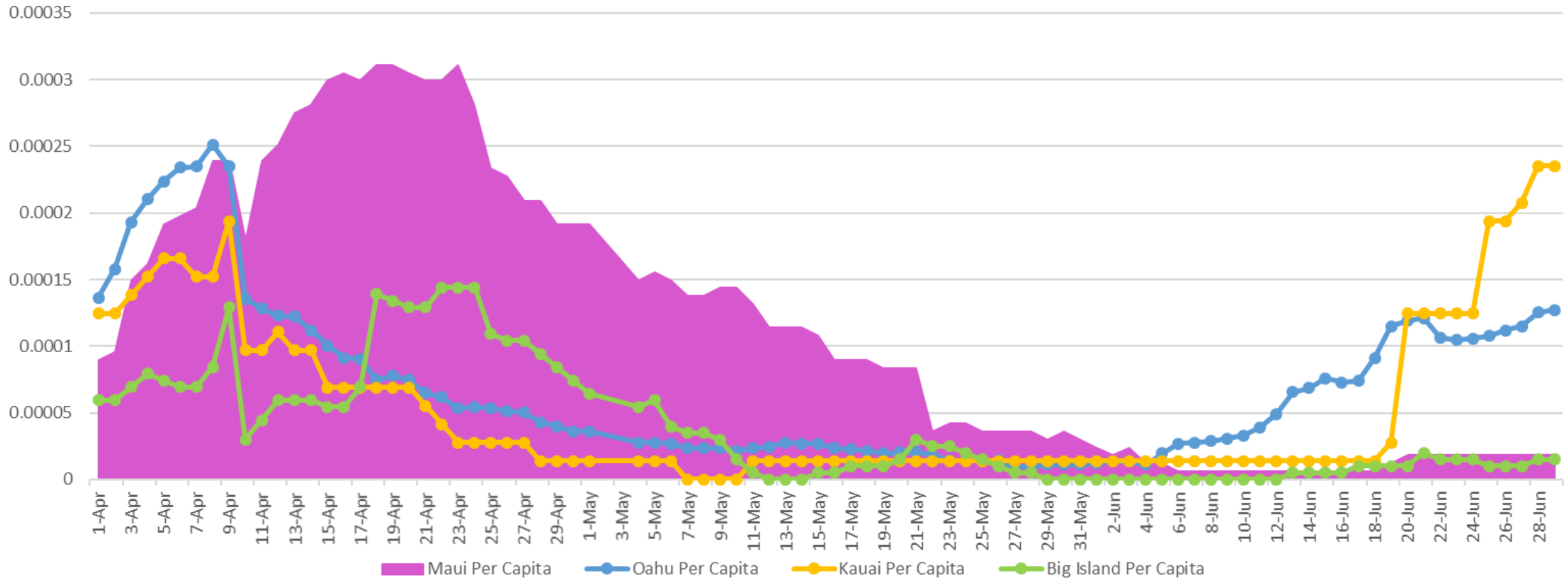

Active Cases in Isolation per Capita by County (June 30, 2020)

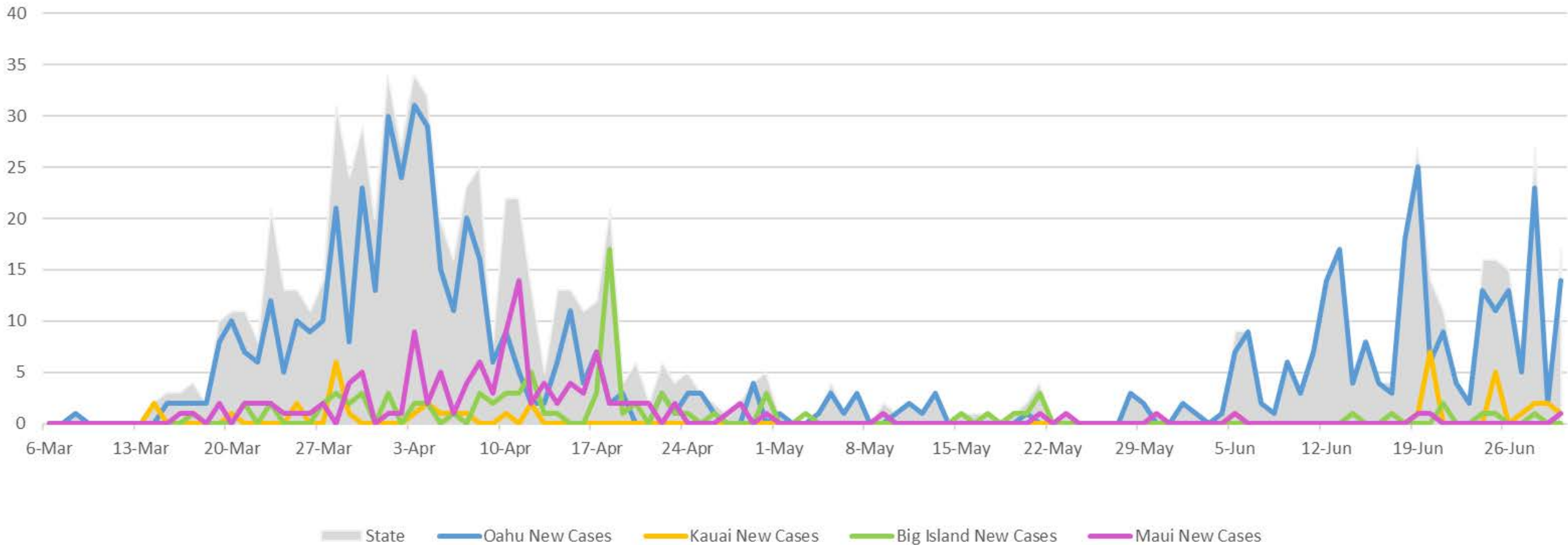

Hawaii COVID-19 New Daily Cases by County Over Time as of 6/30/20

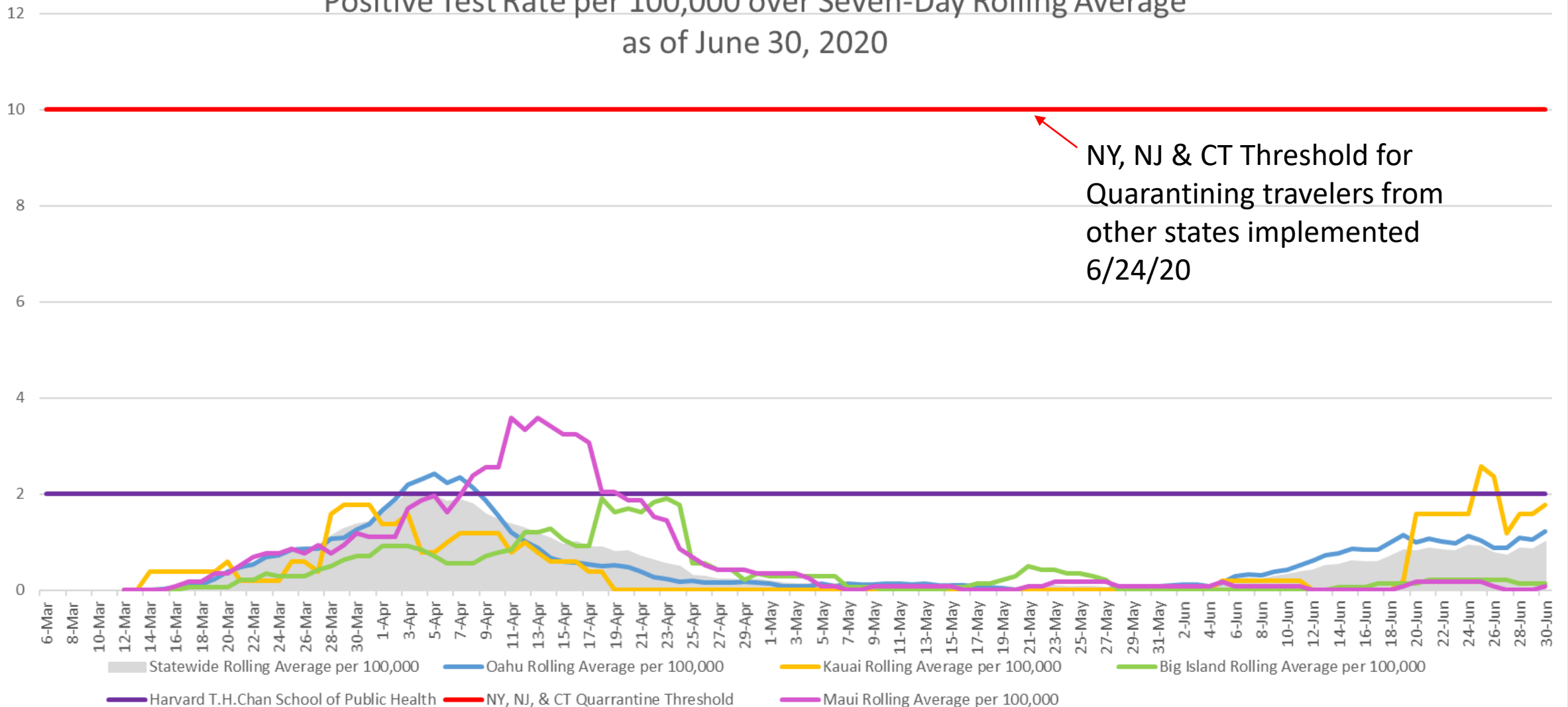

Update on New Case in Maui County

- **Returning resident from Mainland, who tested positive after coming home.**
- **This individual did a good job isolating themselves when they returned home and choosing to get tested when they started exhibiting symptoms.**
- **This is a great example of why we need to remain vigilant as visitors and residents travel into Hawaii from out-of-state.**
- **We must take personal responsibility for the protection of others by isolating ourselves when sick and calling our doctor to get tested.**

County of Maui Partnership with YMCA

- Many openings are still available at the Maui Family YMCA summer youth program on Maui and Molokai.
- Families will pay no more than \$40 TOTAL for their children to participate in the County subsidized program, which starts Monday, July 6.
 - Families can also pay \$10 per week.

County of Maui Partnership with YMCA

- The program is open to children ages 4 – 12 years old.
- Parents can register their children at www.mauiyymca.org/day-camps/.
- **A YMCA Membership is NOT required.**

County of Maui Partnership with YMCA

County of Maui Partnership with YMCA

- The County will be using CARES Act funding to help subsidize the public-private partnership.

County of Maui Partnership with YMCA

- **YMCA is a national organization with experience in childcare as well as specialized training in COVID-19 health and safety precautions.**
- **YMCA will be following sanitation, temperature checks, physical distancing and other requirements provided by the DOH and CDC.**

COVID-19 Call Center Modified Hours

- Mayor Victorino announced modified hours for the COVID-19 Call Center in the Office of the Mayor.
- The call center phone number is (808) 270-7855 and will operate during normal business hours:
 - Monday through Friday – 7:45 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
 - Saturday – 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.

COVID-19 Call Center Modified Hours

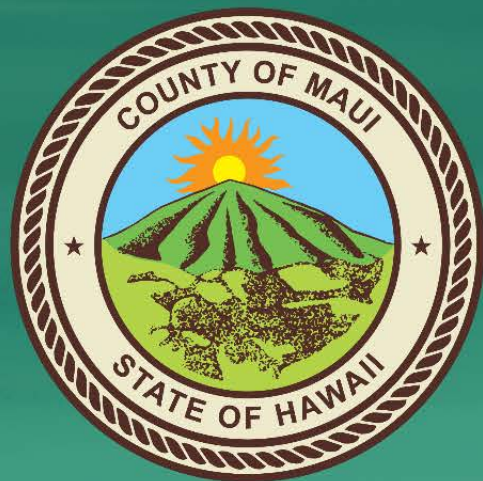
- **The call center will be CLOSED on Friday, July 3, and Saturday, July 4, in observance of the Fourth of July Holiday.**
- The call center is available to answer questions relating to COVID-19 in Maui County.
- Individuals willing to offer supplies, help and resources are also encouraged to call.

State Rules for Commercial and Recreational Boats Relaxed

- The State Department of Land and Natural Resources, Division of Boating and Ocean Recreation has lifted certain COVID-19 emergency restrictions imposed on larger commercial and recreational boating.
- The rule change allows commercial and recreational boats, with a rated U.S. Coast Guard capacity of more than ten, to **NOT exceed their rated capacity by more than 50 percent.**
- Operators must still follow all Boating and Ocean Recreation COVID-19 guidelines, which are available at:
