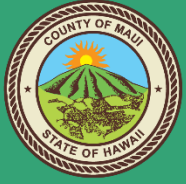

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# County of Maui Partnership with YMCA

- **Spots are still open at the Maui Family YMCA summer youth program on Maui and Molokai.**

# Swimming Pool Permits to be reinstated

- **County pool permit holders can now reinstate their permits for swimming activities starting Monday, July 6.**
- To reinstate your permit, please submit the following items to the County Department of Parks and Recreation for review and approval:
  - **Proof of insurance** – notice from your insurance provider that your league coverage is still in place as of July 2020.

# Swimming Pool Permits to be reinstated

- **Return to Swim Plan** - a proposed plan to meet the national, state, and county requirements in place for public health and safety.
- **Participant/Parent Notification**
- **Modified Schedules** – Modified pool hours for permit holders will be from 7 a.m. to 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. to 7 p.m.
- **Sample Attendance Sheet for Each Practice** – For contact tracing purposes attendance sheets must be kept for 30 days.
- **Master List of all participants**

# Outdoor Organized Team Sports – Phase 2

- **Starting today (July 1), Outdoor organized team sports may now participate in competitive play against other teams.**
- This includes sports such as baseball, soccer, outdoor volleyball, outdoor basketball and similar outdoor team sports.
- Outdoor sports and similar activities that require sustained close contact, such as **outdoor wrestling, boxing and mixed martial arts are excluded**, however, they may continue practicing and training under Phase 1.



# Outdoor Organized Team Sports – Phase 2

- Teams are limited to a maximum of 30 participants, including players and coaches.
- Teams should reduce or eliminate close contact with others outside of competition.
- NO huddles, high fives and handshakes.
- Spectators must maintain at least 6 feet of physical distance between members of different households as much as possible.

# Outdoor Organized Team Sports – Phase 2

- **Face coverings should be worn at all times unless engaged in active play.**
- **Attendees should limit socializing in groups before and after games.**
- **Staff and athletes are to be screened regularly for illness or exposure to COVID-19.**

# **Outdoor Organized Team Sports – Phase 2**

- **Staff or athletes who are sick should immediately be sent home.**
- **Sports Program operators and participants shall follow guidance from the CDC and DOH, and their Return to Play Plans with special considerations for entrances, exits, bottlenecks and safe capacity limits.**

# Reminders for Fourth of July Weekend

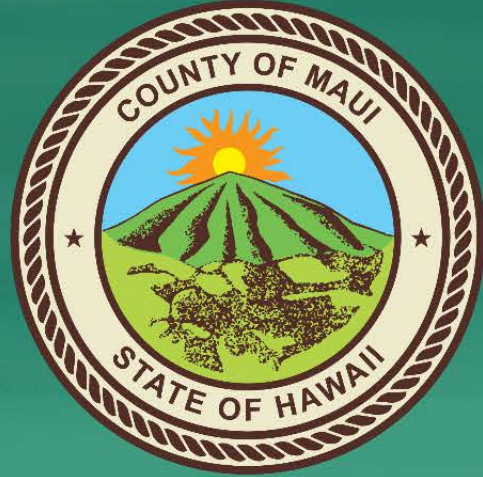
- **Fourth of July Weekend is coming up and we want to remind everyone to keep gatherings small and avoid close contact as much as possible.**
- We also urge everyone to refrain from drinking and driving, and think twice about setting off fireworks this holiday weekend.
- Fireworks can be dangerous and cause serious burns and eye injuries.

# Reminders for Fourth of July Weekend

- **NEVER give fireworks – even sparklers – to young children.**
- Older children should only use fireworks under direct supervision of an adult.
- **DO NOT use fireworks near structures, dry grass or brush, or other flammable materials.**

# Final Reminders

- Have a water hose or bucket of water readily available in case of a fire.
- **Reminder that camping at County parks is still not allowed and parks are only open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.**
- There will be no press conference tomorrow or Friday, but we'll be back starting next week on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.



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
