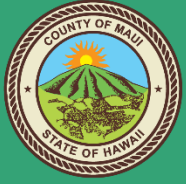

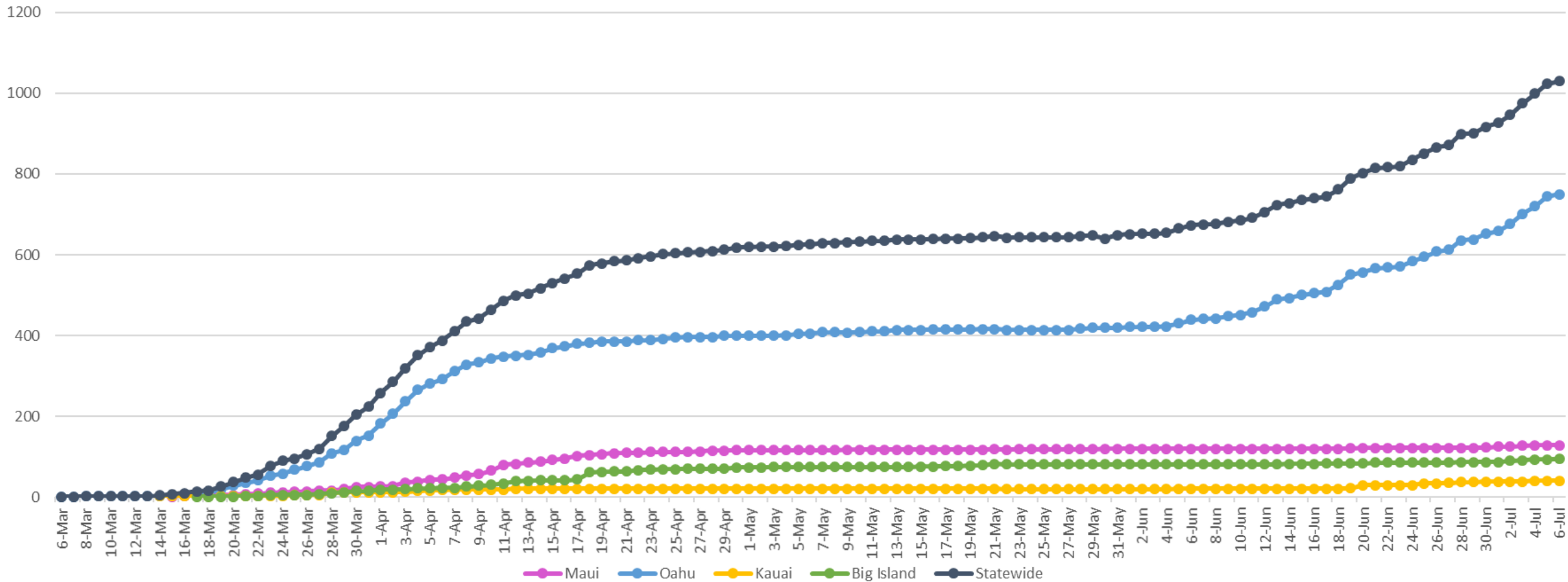

Cumulative Total COVID-19 Cases Showing Statewide Total and by County (7/06/20)

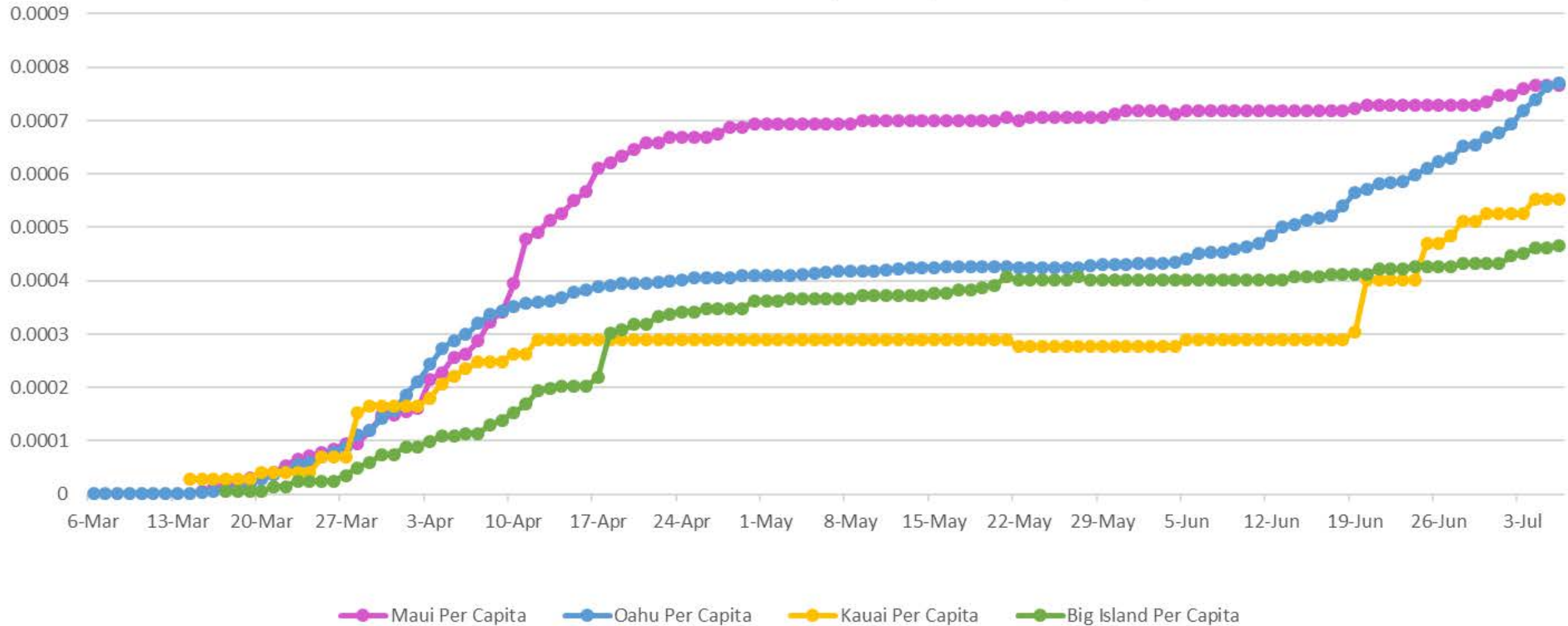

Positive COVID-19 Cases Per Capita by County, July 6, 2020

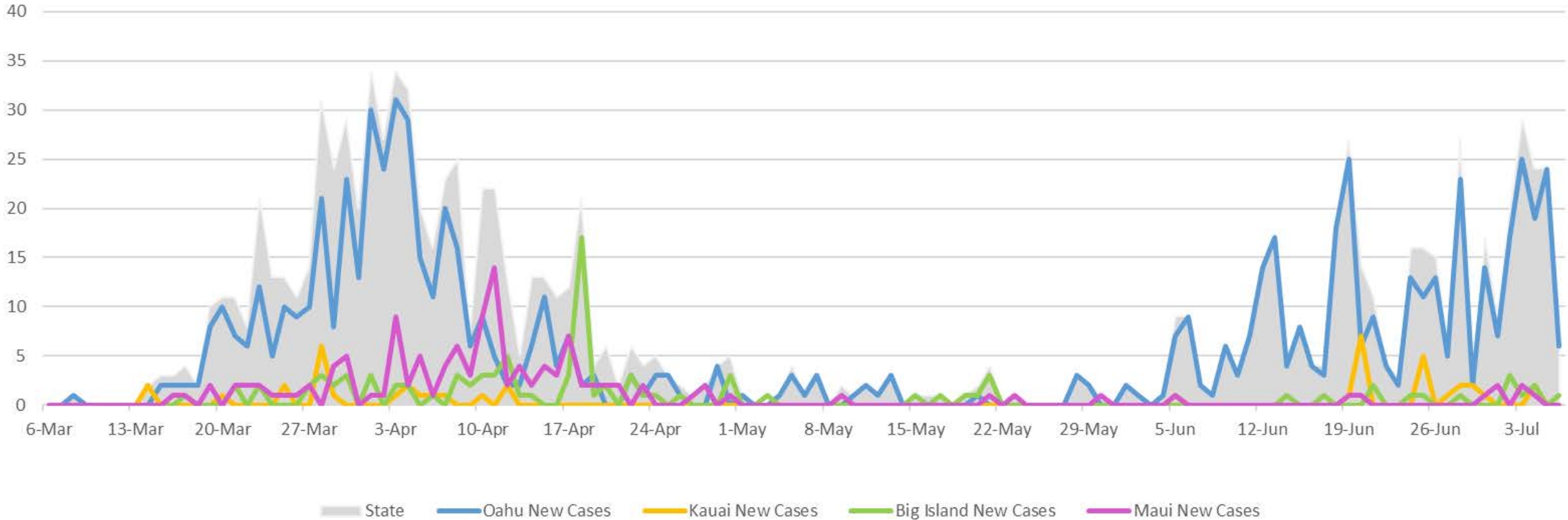

Hawaii COVID-19 New Daily Cases by County Over Time as of 7/06/20

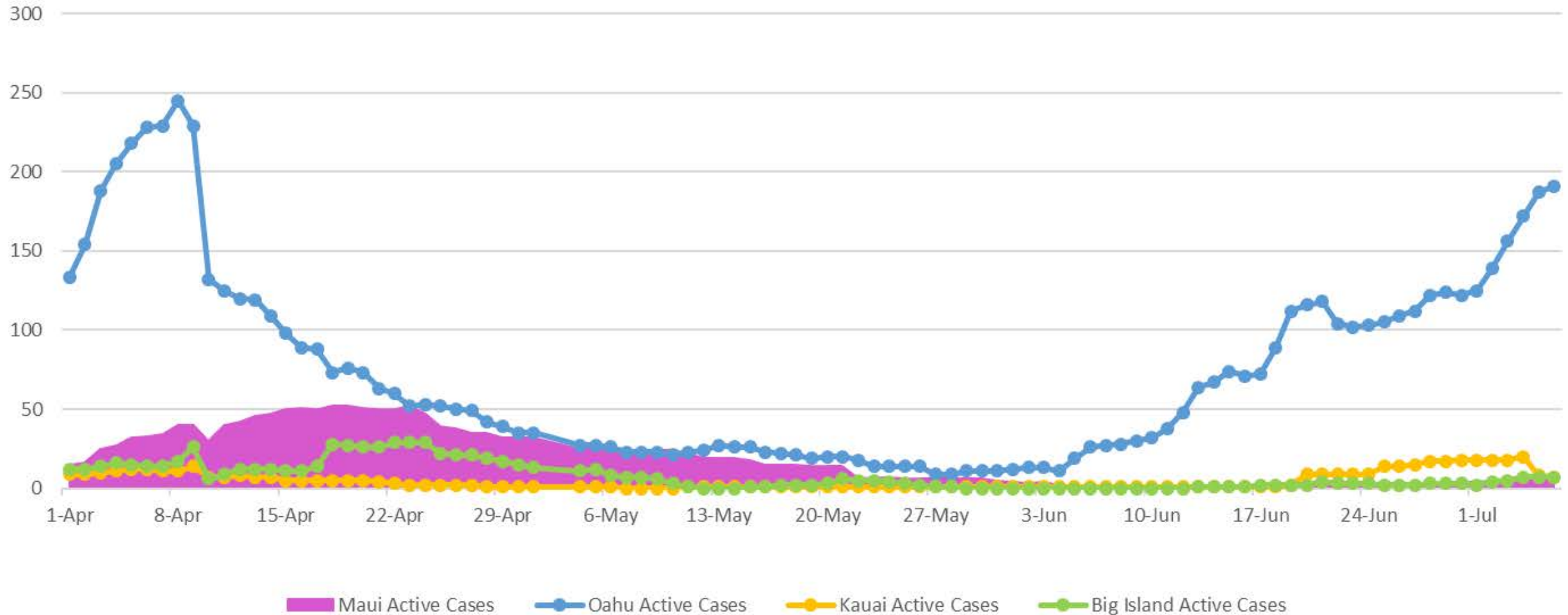

Active Cases in Isolation by Day by County (July 6, 2020)

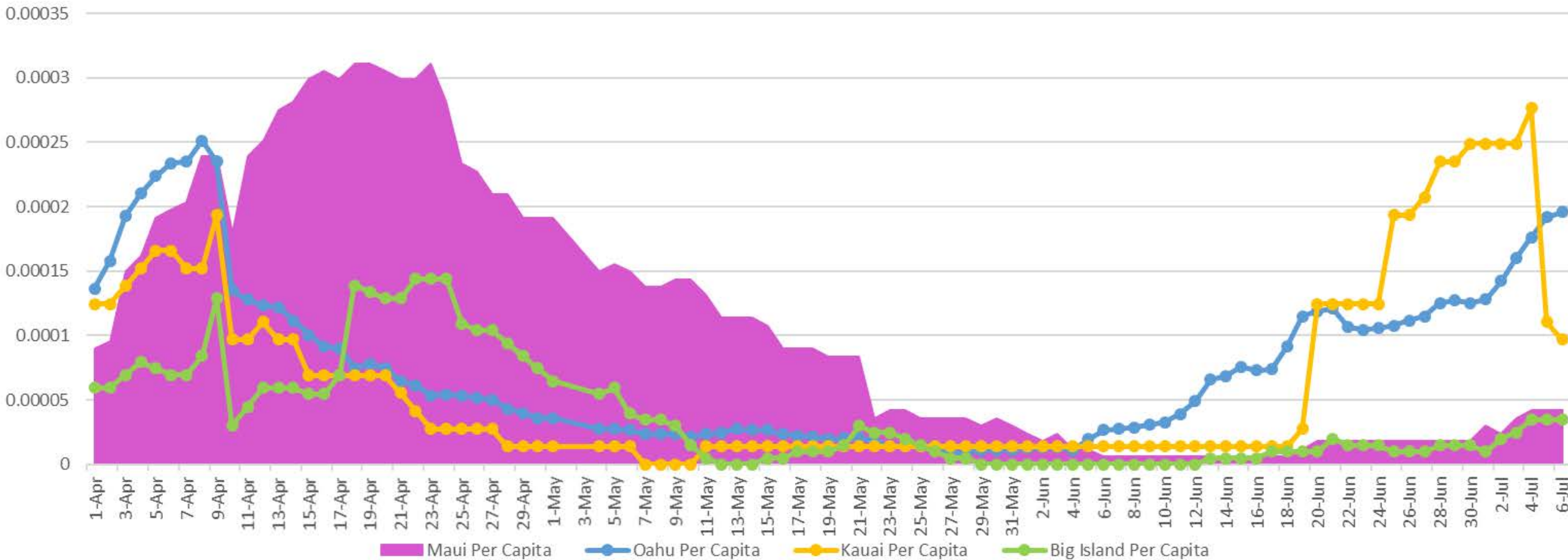

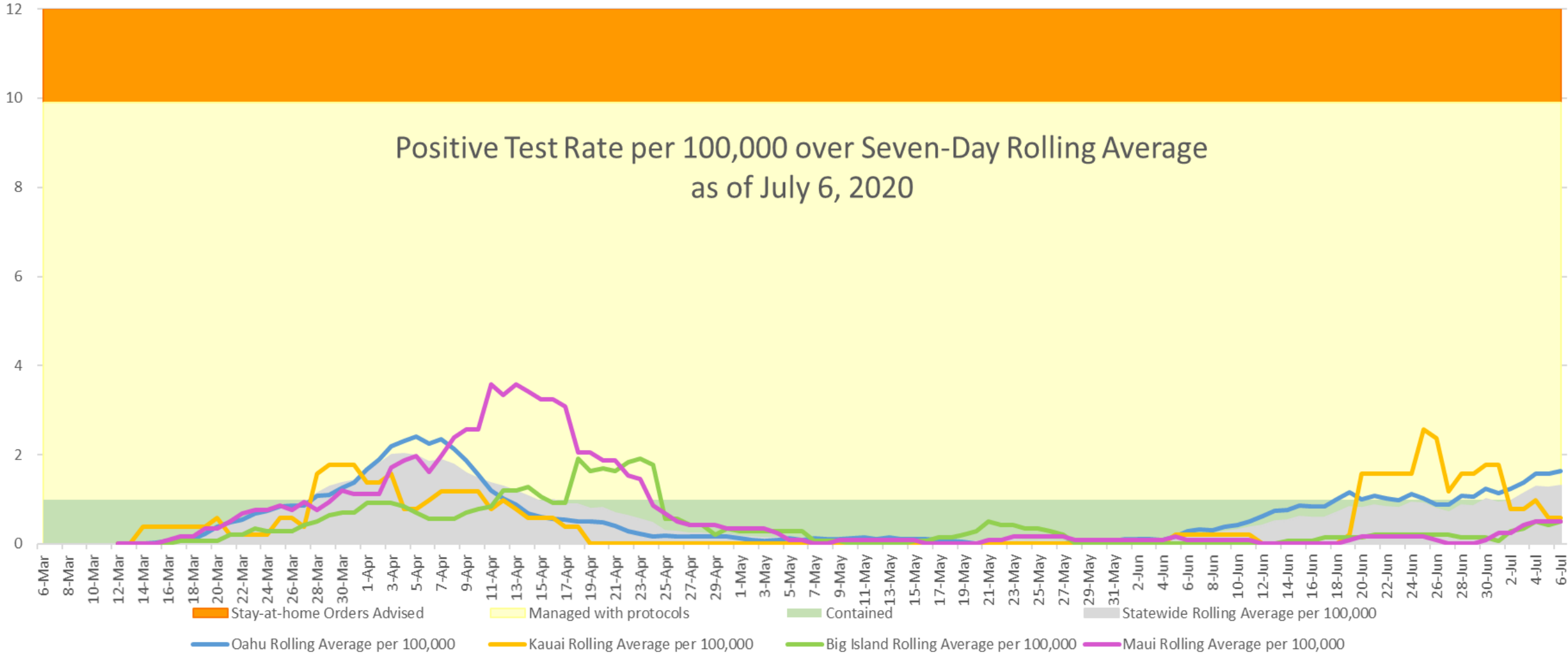
Active Cases in Isolation per Capita by County (July 6, 2020)

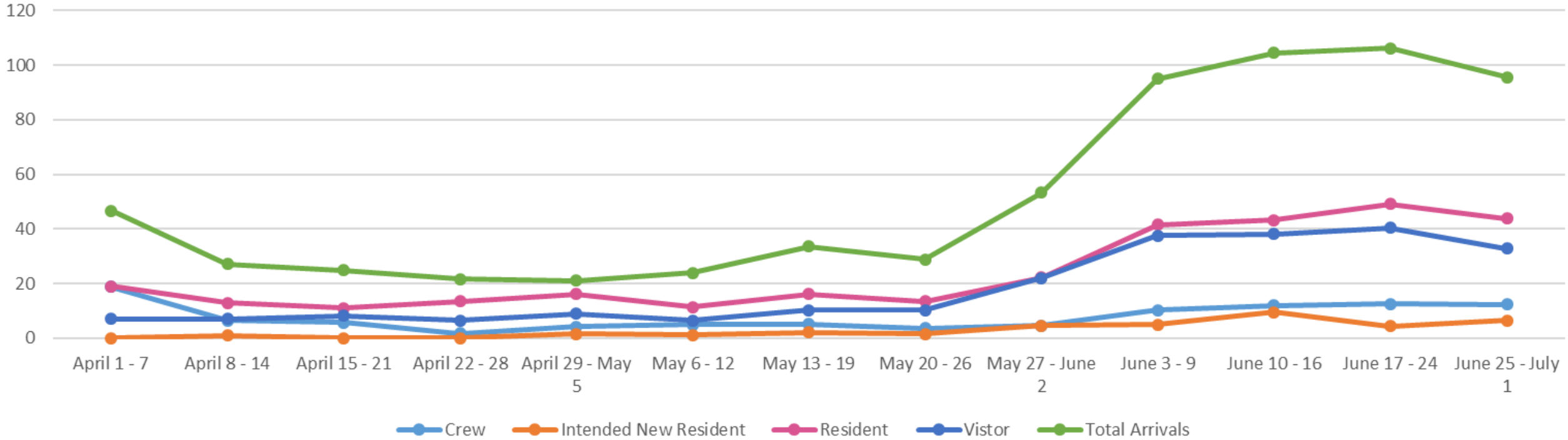

County of Maui Partnership with YMCA

- The Maui Family YMCA summer youth program in partnership with the County of Maui kicked-off today with great response from the community.
- War Memorial Gym and Eddie Tam Gym are fully enrolled, and YMCA will be accommodating families on the waiting list for Central and Upcountry locations starting next week.
- **There are still some spots available at South Maui Community Park so hurry and register your keiki.**

County of Maui Partnership with YMCA

- Families pay no more than \$40 TOTAL for their children to participate in the County subsidized program.
 - Families can also pay \$10 per week.
- The program is open to children ages 4 – 12 years old.
- A YMCA Membership is NOT required.
- Parents can register their children at www.mauiyymca.org/day-camps/.

University of Hawaii Interim Guidelines

- The University of Hawaii released interim COVID-19 guidelines last week for the upcoming academic year.
- Each campus, including UH Maui College, are developing its own operational plan taking into consideration their unique location, facilities, program needs and available resources.
- The first day of classes for the Fall 2020 semester is Aug. 24, 2020.

University of Hawaii Interim Guidelines

- **Some of the basic guidelines include:**
 - **Wearing facial coverings.**
 - **Staying home when ill or possibly exposed to the virus.**
 - **Safety practices to screen, report, monitor and manage COVID-19 cases.**
 - **Regular cleaning and disinfecting of buildings, classrooms and workspaces.**
 - **Providing cleaning wipes and hand sanitizer in each classroom and sanitizing dispensers located at classroom entryways.**

University of Hawaii Interim Guidelines

- **Some of the basic guidelines include:**
 - Reconfiguring classrooms and work environments for physical distancing.
 - Modifications to residence halls and campus eateries to ensure access to student support services.
 - Guidance on facilities usage for campus and non-campus events.

Face Coverings Make a Difference

- Studies have found that not wearing a face covering DRAMATICALLY INCREASES a person's chances of being infected by COVID-19.
- Research has shown that using a face covering REDUCED the number of infections by more than 78,000 in Italy and by over 66,000 in New York City from April to May.

Face Coverings Make a Difference

- Wearing face coverings helps prevent people from contracting the virus, but also limits infected people from spreading it to others.
- Everyone should wear face coverings when around others, especially indoors and inside poorly ventilated areas.
- Remember to wash your face coverings regularly by tossing it in your washing machine or washing it by hand using a bleach solution.

Flags to fly at half-staff for Sen. Breene Harimoto

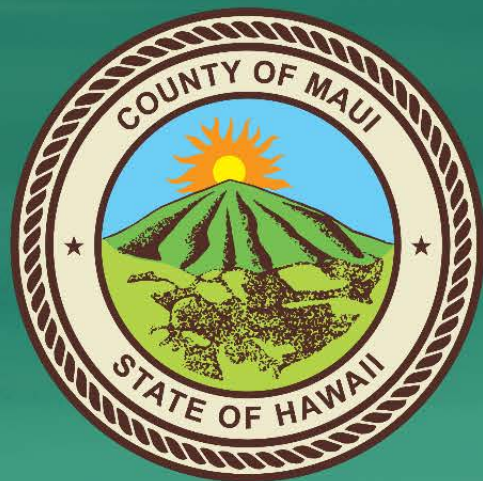
- The County of Maui will be flying its flags at half-staff tomorrow, July 7, in honor and remembrance of the late Sen. Breene Harimoto.
