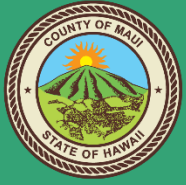

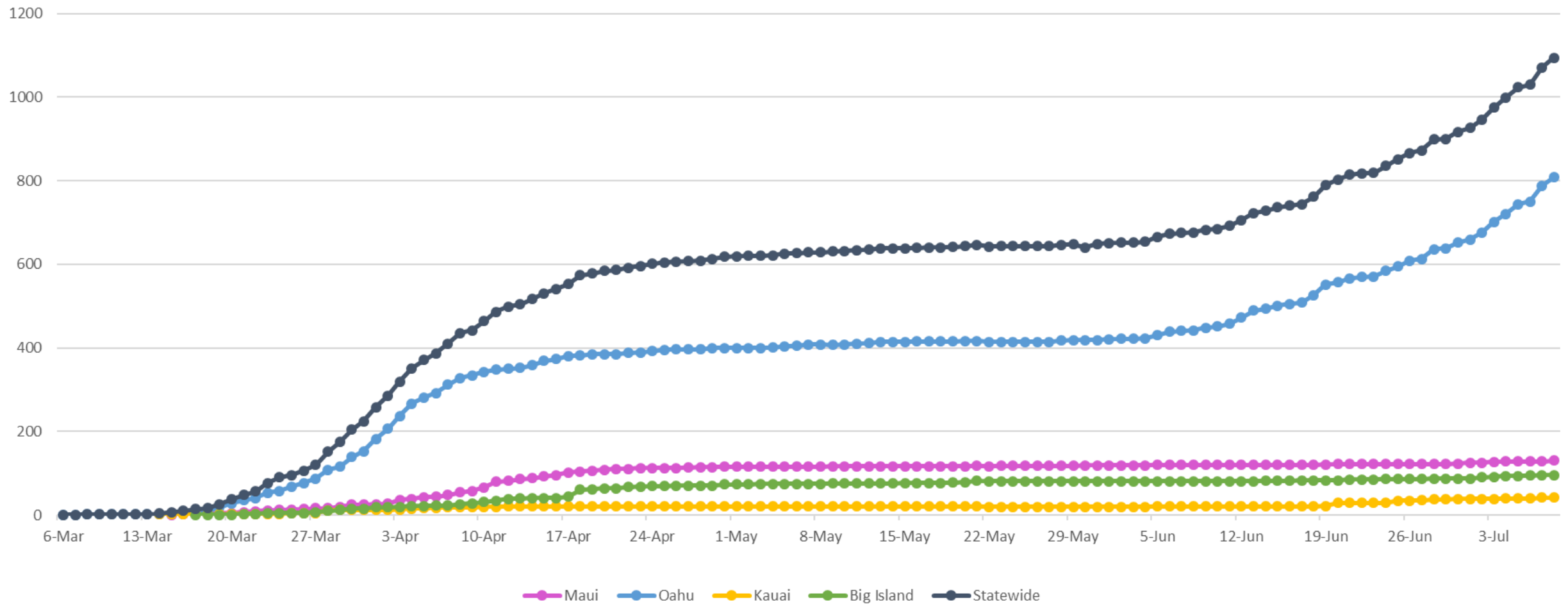

Cumulative Total COVID-19 Cases Showing Statewide Total and by County (7/08/20)

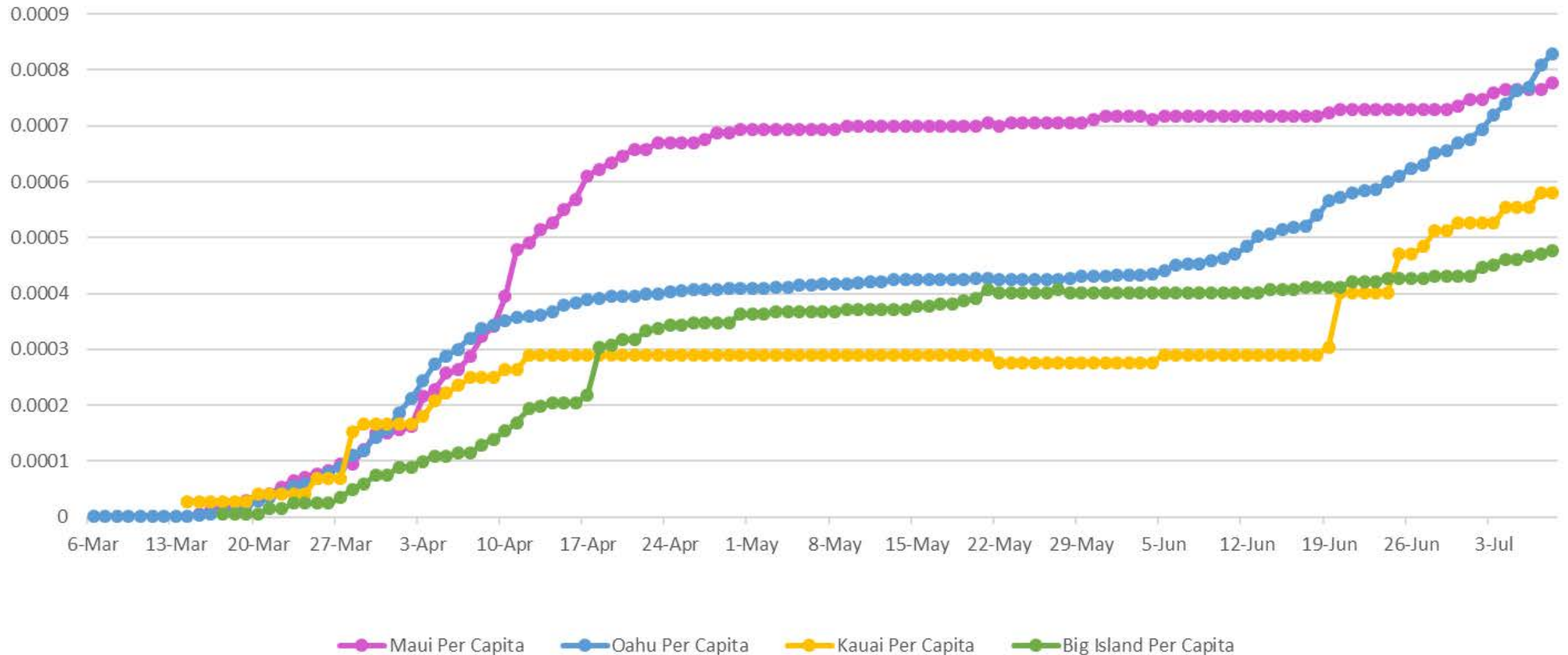

## Positive COVID-19 Cases Per Capita by County, July 8, 2020

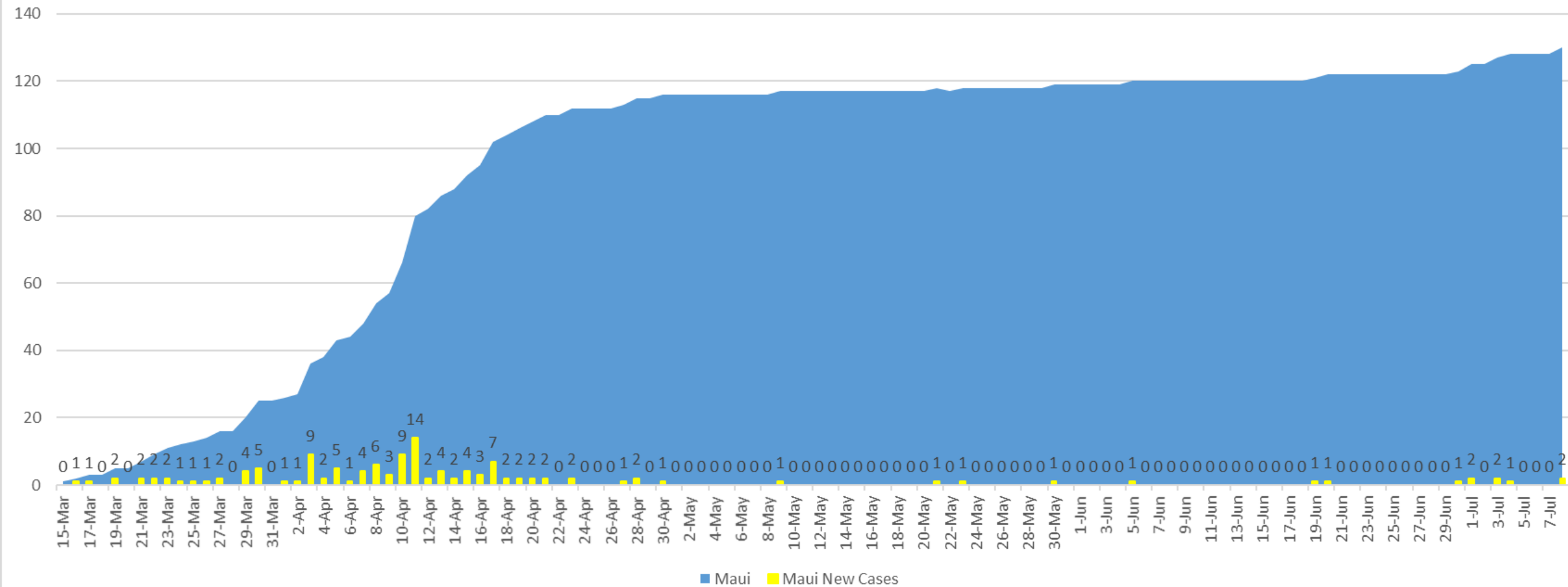

### Cumulative Maui Cases compared to New Cases by Day (7/08/20)

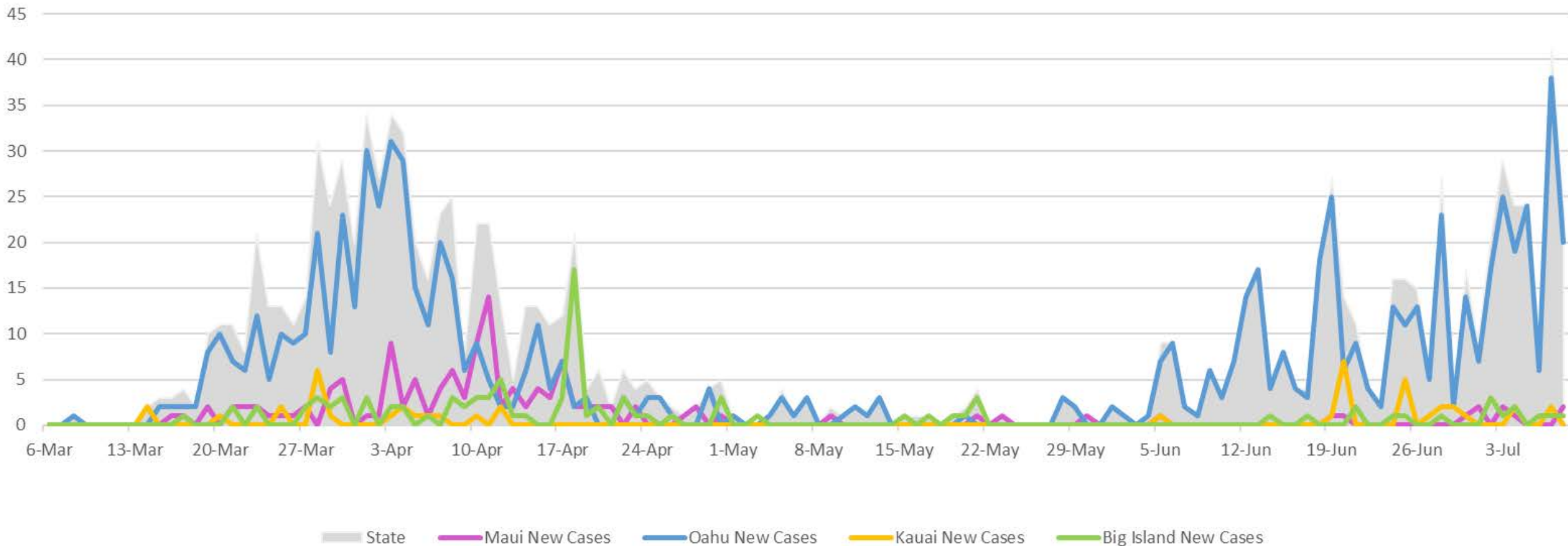

Hawaii COVID-19 New Daily Cases by County Over Time as of 7/08/20



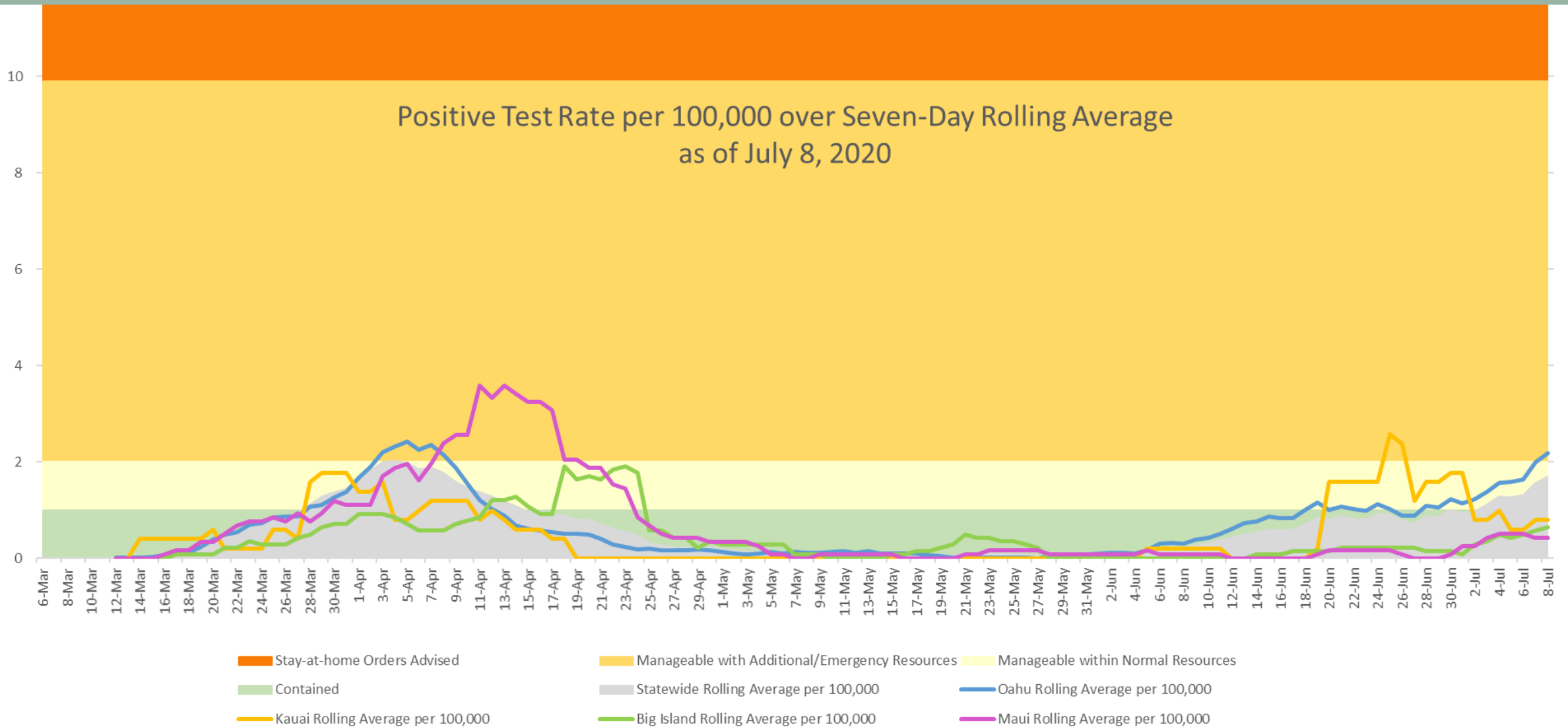

# Maui County Status Update

- While cases are on the rise in Oahu, Maui County remains prepared for possible future surges.
- Over **11,200** tests have been conducted with nearly **99%** returning negative.
- Only about a third of our ICU beds are in use, with none being used for COVID-19.
- Only **18%** of our ventilators are being used, with none being used for COVID-19.



# Maui County Status Update

- **Statewide close to 90,000 tests have been conducted with 98.8% returning negative.**
- **Statewide less than half of our ICU beds are in use and just 14% of ventilators are in use.**
- **Hawaii Department of Health continues to monitor clusters on Oahu and our Maui District Health Office remains ready to respond to possible outbreaks in Maui County.**

# Important Reminder for Travel to Lanai

- **Travelers to Lanai MUST print out the State of Hawaii Traveler Health Form and bring a completed physical copy with them to the Expeditions Lanai Ferry.**

  - Manele: 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m.

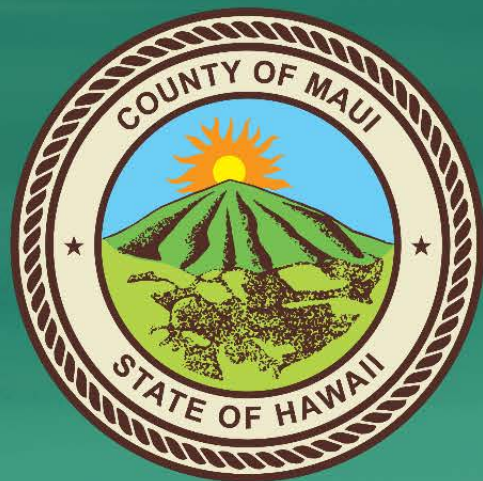
# Important Reminder for Travel to Lanai
