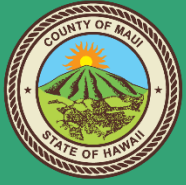

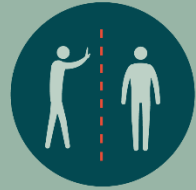

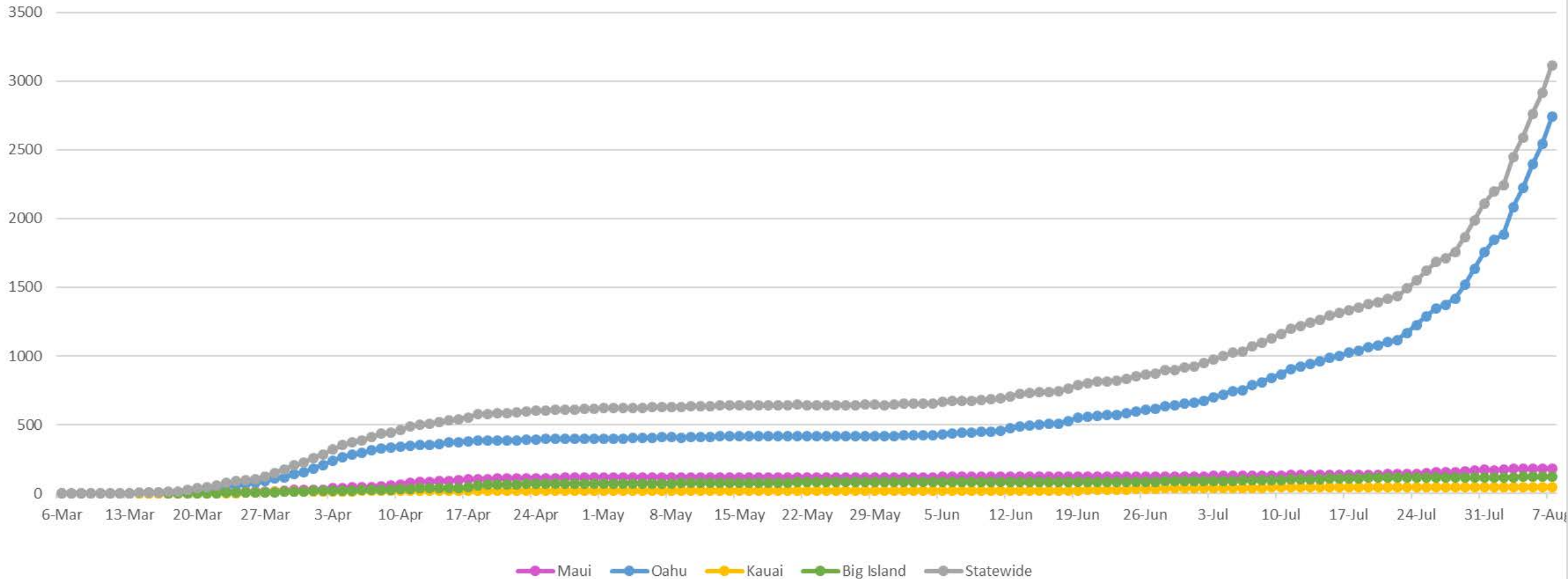

Cumulative Total COVID-19 Cases Showing Statewide Total and by County (8/07/20)

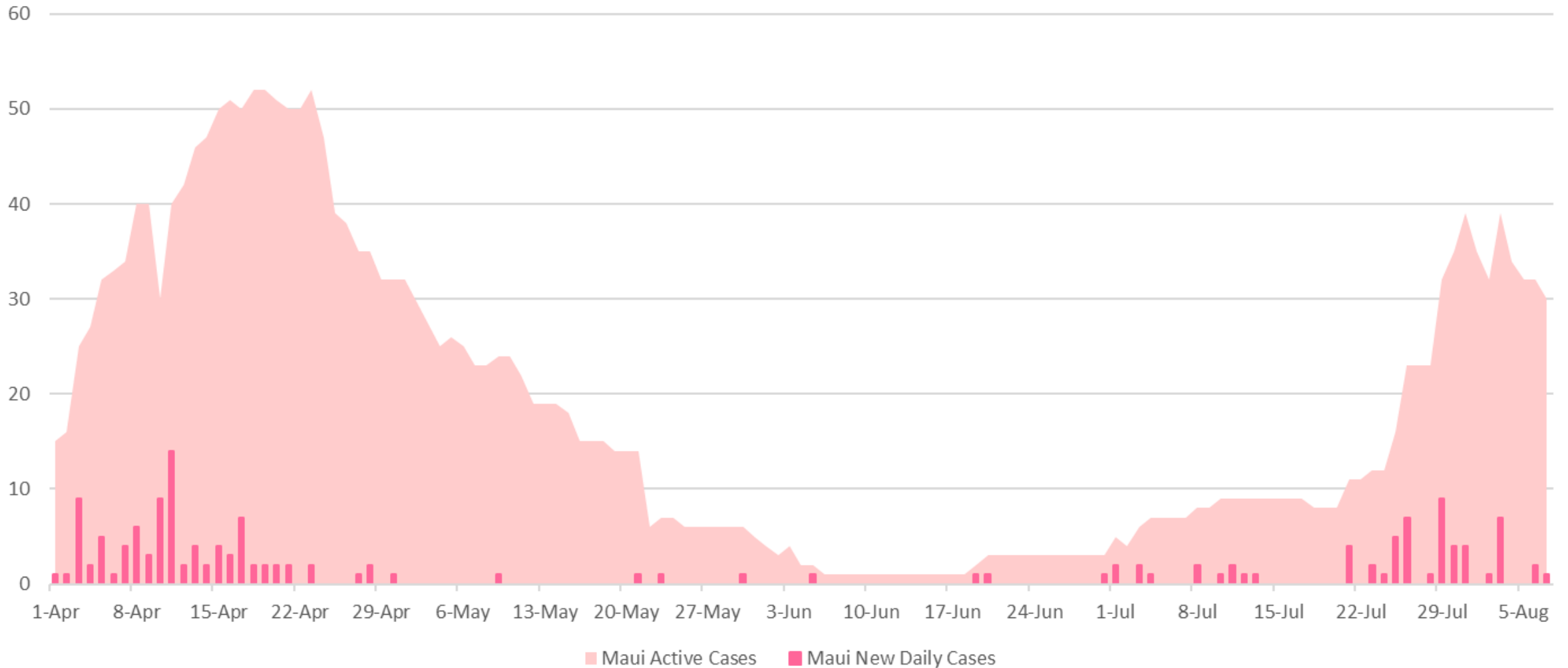

Maui County Active Cases Compared to Daily New Cases, August 7, 2020

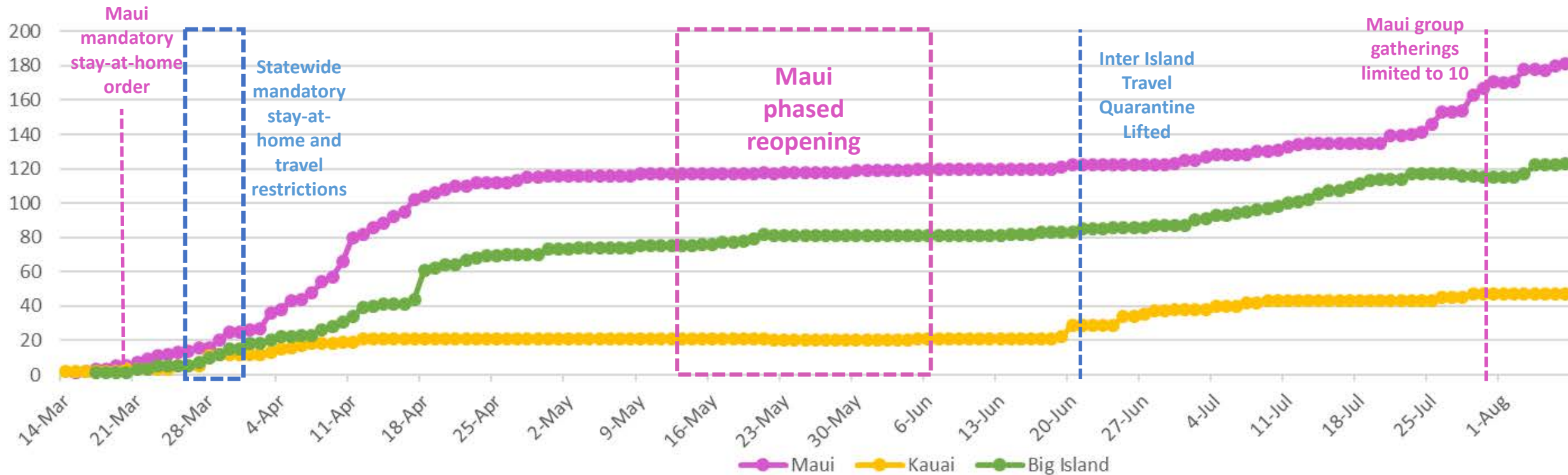

## Cumulative Total COVID-19 Cases in the Neighbor Island Counties (8/07/20)

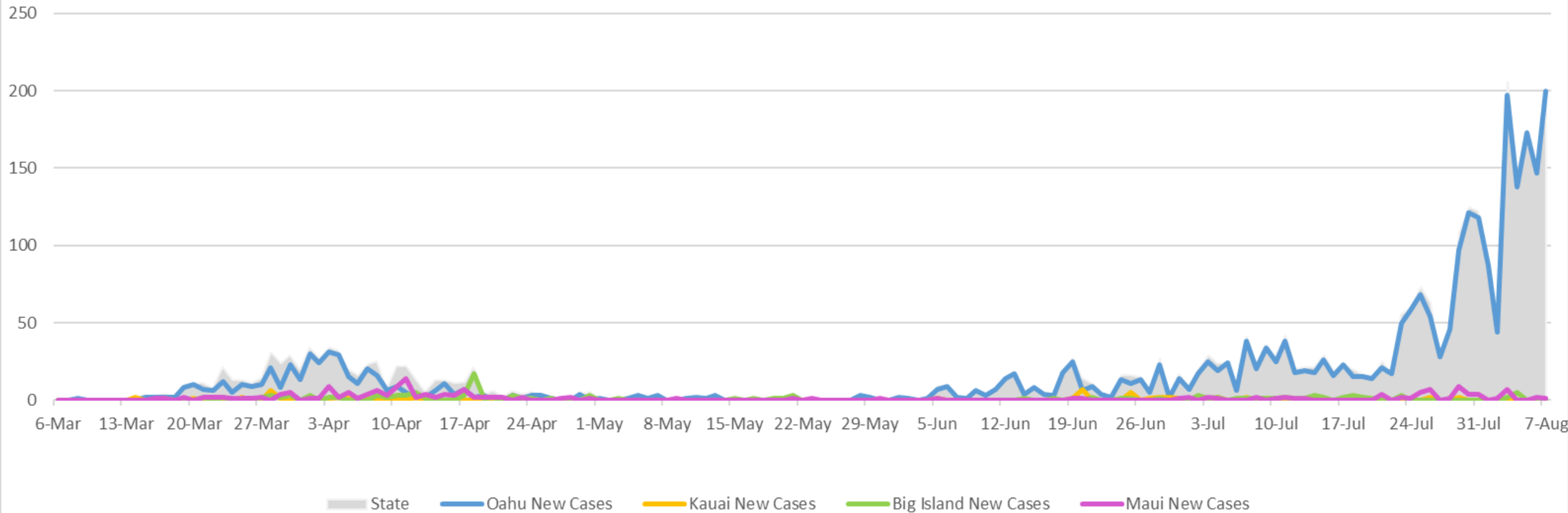

Hawaii COVID-19 New Daily Cases by County Over Time as of 8/07/20

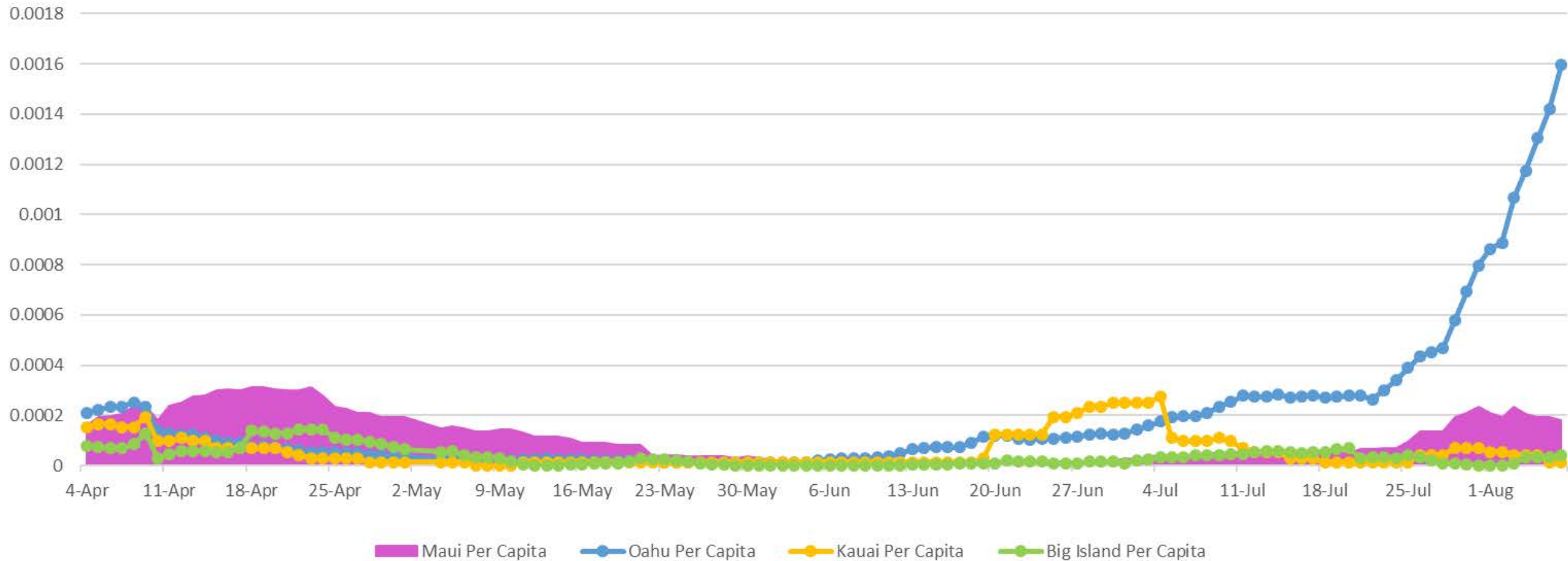

Active Cases in Isolation per Capita by County (August 7, 2020)

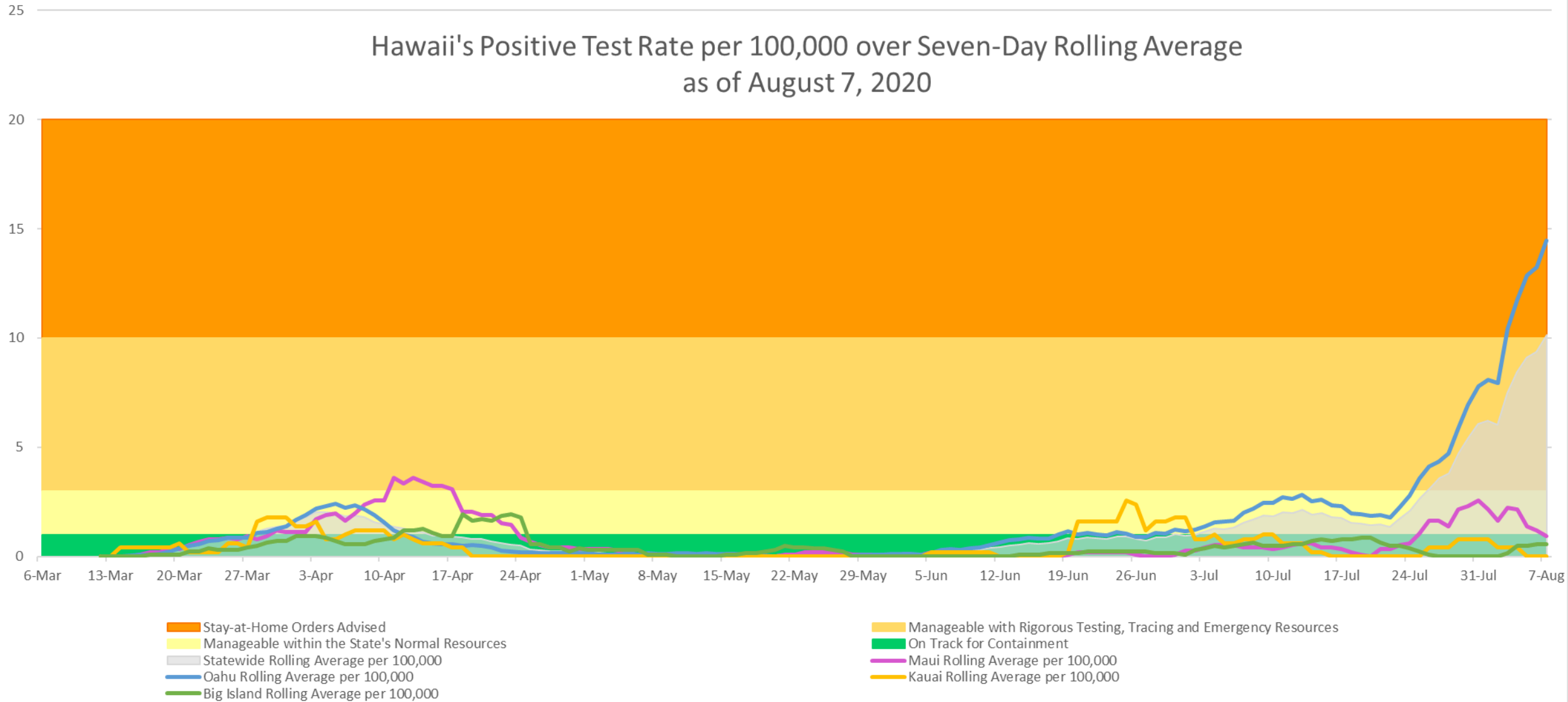

### Hawaii's Positive Test Rate per 100,000 over Seven-Day Rolling Average as of August 7, 2020



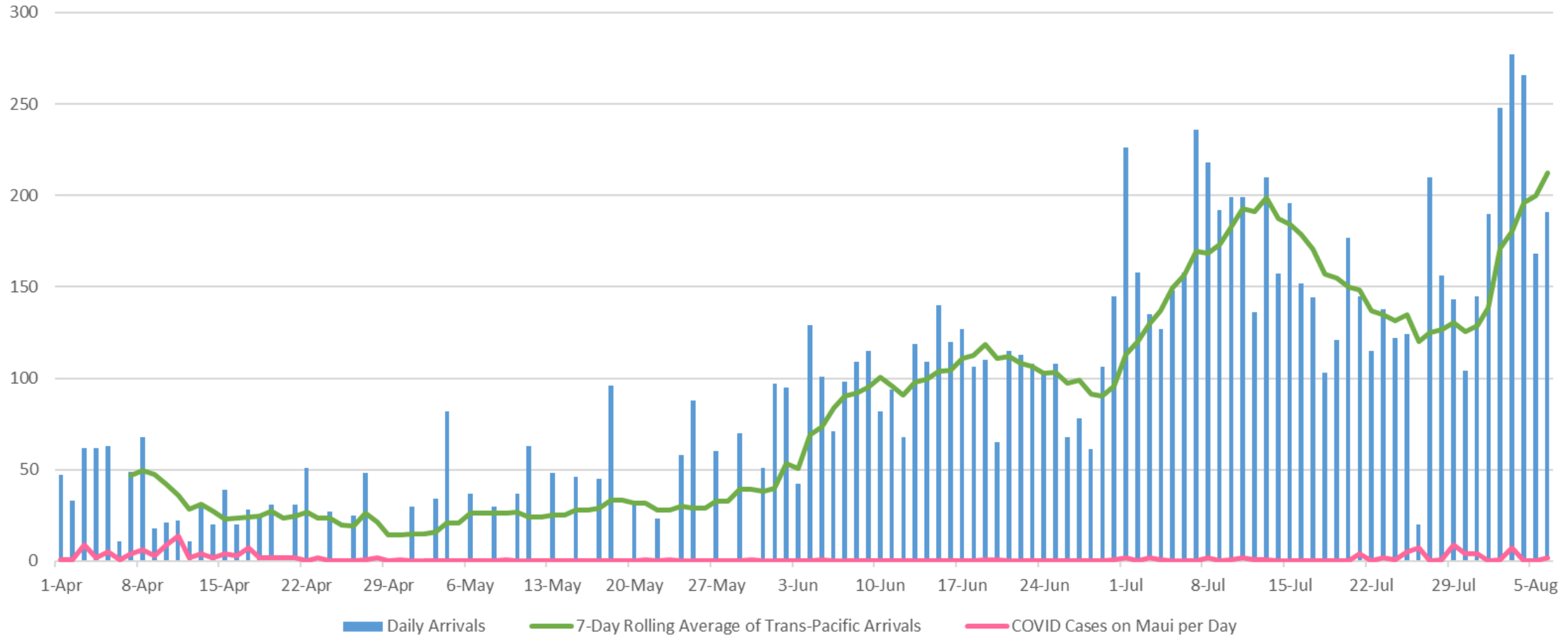

# 14-Day Mandatory Interisland Quarantine

- Yesterday, the Governor announced the reinstatement of a modified 14-day mandatory interisland quarantine effective Tuesday, Aug. 11.
- **This means that anyone traveling to the Neighbor Islands is subject to the 14-day quarantine.**
  - This includes traveling from Maui to the Big Island or Kauai.
  - It also includes travel to and from Molokai and Lanai.

# 14-Day Mandatory Interisland Quarantine

- If you are traveling to Oahu, then you would not have to quarantine for 14 days while on Oahu.
  - HOWEVER, you would have to quarantine when you return home to Maui.
- We are discouraging any non-essential travel at this time.

# 14-Day Mandatory Interisland Quarantine

- Adding today's 200 new cases on Oahu, we have now crossed over 3,100 total cases statewide.
  - This includes 1,251 active cases on Oahu.
- Reinstating the interisland quarantine is necessary to protect our community and health care system.

# What You Need to Know in Maui County

- With the interisland quarantine reinstated, the County of Maui has setup an email to handle exemption requests for Maui, Molokai and Lanai.
- Anyone who would like to request an exemption **for travel to and within Maui County** must email [TravelExemption@mauicounty.gov](mailto:TravelExemption@mauicounty.gov).
- If you live in Maui County and need to travel to another Neighbor Island County, please visit their County's website for exemption information.

# What You Need to Know in Maui County

- Maui County will remain in the “Act with Care” phase.
- **We are NOT shutting down businesses that are currently open.**
- **Beaches and Parks will remain OPEN, at this time.**
- The public is required to wear face coverings when they leave their home.
- Any social gatherings of more than 10 people are prohibited.

# What You Need to Know in Maui County

- **Businesses and places of worship have their own capacity limits under State and County rules, and are not subject to the 10 people or less rule.**
  - **Businesses and places of worship must continue to comply with health and safety rules.**
  - **The major focus of the 10 person limitations are for unsupervised social gatherings such as parties, funerals and celebrations, which have shown to dramatically increase the rate of spread of COVID-19.**

# Transient Vacation Rentals

- The Governor has not changed the State's rules regarding transient vacation rentals.
- Currently, NO TVRs may be designated as a quarantine location.
- **This would include interisland travelers subject to the 14-day mandatory quarantine, effective Tuesday, Aug. 11.**



# Transient Vacation Rentals

- **New or intended residents may still use long-term rentals for their quarantine.**
  - **However, long-term rentals can be used ONLY ONCE as a quarantine location in any 6-month period.**
- **Property owners will be held responsible and documentation will be required by the County if a violation is suspected.**

# **Maui Police Department Enforcing 14-Day Quarantine Order**

- **Maui Police Department will be enforcing the mandatory 14-day Quarantine Order for transpacific and interisland travelers.**
- **To report a suspected violation of the 14-day quarantine, email [MPDquarantine@mpd.net](mailto:MPDquarantine@mpd.net).**
  - **You may also call MPD's non-emergency phone number as a backup at 244-6400.**

# Maui Police Department Enforcing 14-Day Quarantine Order

- **REMEMBER**: 9-1-1 is for emergency use only.
- Mahalo to our police officers for their tireless work to keep our community safe during these very difficult times.

# Helpful Data and Information

- Oahu is approaching the same rate of spread as California, with 14.45 cases per 100,000 people a day.
  - California has 17.8 cases per 100,000.
- Maui County experienced its own bump in cases, but is now reporting less than 1 case per 100,000.

# Helpful Data and Information

- **Research on the effects of COVID-19 is still developing and evidence has shown that there may be long-term health impacts associated with the virus.**
- **Wearing face coverings and maintaining physical distance remain the best everyday measures you can take for your safety.**

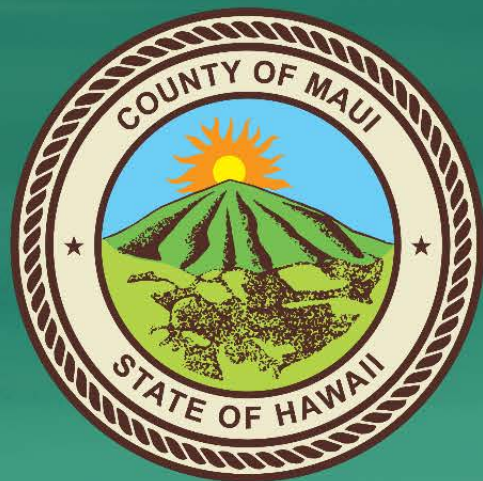
# Closing Remarks and Reminders
