

## Cumulative Total COVID-19 Cases in the Neighbor Island Counties (10/09/20)



Cases per Day per Capita by County (October 9, 2020)




Hawaii Department of Education Metrics for School Reopening as of October 9, 2020

# Maui County COVID-19 Response

- The County of Maui has been working with a number of doctors, health experts and industry leaders on its ongoing COVID-19 strategic planning and emergency response.
- Metrics and procedures were developed previously to allow for the safe reopening of businesses and increased travel.
- Metrics were also developed in the event that the County would need to scale back its reopenings and recovery.

# Maui County COVID-19 Response

- **These metrics will be vitally important as the State moves forward with the pre-travel testing program launching next week Thursday, Oct. 15.**

# Maui County COVID-19 Response and Recovery

- You may be wondering why we show you these stats and graphs on our press conferences.
- The purpose for this is to monitor a series of indicators to tell us how the virus is affecting our community.
- Now that we're opening back up to travel, understanding these metrics is more important than ever.
- By continually monitoring these metrics, we've learned a lot about how the virus works and how to manage it to the best of our abilities.

# Maui County Indicators, Triggers and Thresholds

- **The County of Maui has four levels for COVID-19 Suppression and Management.**
- **These four levels are:**
  - **Recovery (minimal disruption)**
  - **Act with Care (minor disruption)**
  - **Safer at Home (moderate disruption)**
  - **Stay at Home (major disruption)**

# Maui County Indicators, Triggers and Thresholds

- Within these levels are two categories to serve as indicators that trigger an increase or decrease in levels.
- These categories are:
  - Daily Case Counts
  - Virus Control

# Maui County Indicators, Triggers and Thresholds

- **These metrics were developed with the assistance of the State Department of Health, Harvard Global Health Institute, Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health and Resolve to Save Lives, which is a consortium of the world's top public health leaders.**

# COVID-19 Level: Recovery (Where we are)

- **The County of Maui is currently in the Recovery level.**
- At this level, no quarantine is required for travelers with an approved negative test, 72-hours prior to arrival.
- **Daily Case Counts: Less than 1 case per day (7-day rolling average)**
  - Maui County is averaging 0.77 cases per 100,000 population.

# COVID-19 Level: Recovery (Where we are)


- **Virus Control: Test Positivity Rate of less than 1% (7-day rolling average)**
  - Maui County has a test positivity rate of 0.3 over the past 7 days.
- Residents should continue practicing good hygiene, maintain physical distance and avoid large gatherings at this level.
- Face masks are required in public.



# **COVID-19 Level: Act with Care (minor disruption)**

- **At this level, the State pre-travel testing program would remain in place for incoming travelers to Maui County.**
- **Daily Case Counts: 1 to 4.99 cases per day (7-day rolling average)**
- **Virus Control: Test Positivity Rate of 1% to 2.49% (7-day rolling average)**

# **COVID-19 Level: Act with Care (minor disruption)**

- **Residents are free to leave home with added safety precautions at this level.**
  - **High-risk individuals should continue to remain at home.**
- **Most business are allowed open.**
- **Gathering sizes are limited.**

# **COVID-19 Level: Safer at Home (moderate disruption)**

- **At this level, the County of Maui would opt out of the State pre-travel testing program.**
  - **All incoming travelers would be subject to the mandatory 14-day travel quarantine with limited exemptions available.**
- **Daily Case Counts: 5 to 9.99 cases per day (7-day rolling average)**
- **Virus Control: Test Positivity Rate of 2.5% to 5% (7-day rolling average)**

# **COVID-19 Level: Safer at Home (moderate disruption)**

- **Residents should stay at home as much as possible.**
- **Moderate- to high-risk businesses may be closed.**
- **Non-essential travel should be limited.**

# **COVID-19 Level: Stay at Home (major disruption)**

- **At this level, all travelers would be required to quarantine for 14-days without exemption.**
- **Daily Case Counts: More than 10 cases per day (7-day rolling average)**
- **Virus Control: Test Positivity Rate of more than 5% (7-day rolling average)**

# **COVID-19 Level: Stay at Home (major disruption)**

- **Residents are to stay at home.**
- **Only essential business and services are open.**
- **Only essential travel is permitted.**

# Healthcare Capacity in Maui County

- We will continue to work with our hospital and health officials to ensure we have adequate healthcare capacity for all of Maui County's healthcare needs.
- According to the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency, we currently have only **1** confirmed individual hospitalized.
  - Statewide hospitalization rates are down and expected to continue to decline.
- A little over half of our ICU beds are currently in use.
- Less than a quarter of our ventilators are in use.

# Travel Requests to the Governor


- Just a reminder on the details of the pre-travel testing program and other requests that we presented on Wednesday are still pending the Governor's approval.
- These include:
  - Maui County residents who travel solely between Maui, Molokai and Lanai would not be subject to quarantine or the pre-travel testing program.
  - Interisland (or intercountry) travelers be allowed to participate in the pre-travel testing program. (i.e. Travel between Maui County and Kauai County)
  - Use of legal short-term rentals and TVRs for travelers awaiting results of their pre-travel test.

# Maui County Charter Commission

- The County of Maui is still seeking applicants for its boards and commissions, including the County's Charter Commission.
- The Charter Commission consists of **11** members to study and review the operation of County government, and convenes every **10** years to review the County Charter.
  - The proposed Charter Amendments on the November ballot were proposed by the County Council – not the Charter Commission.
