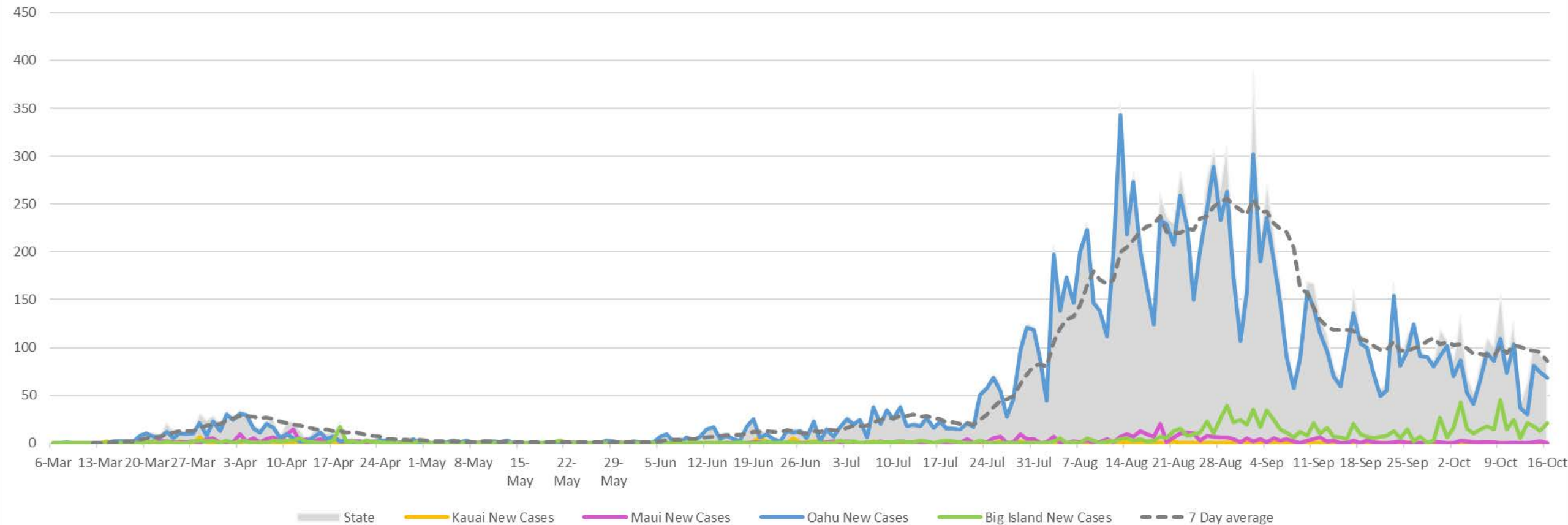

Hawaii COVID-19 New Daily Cases by County as of 10/16/20

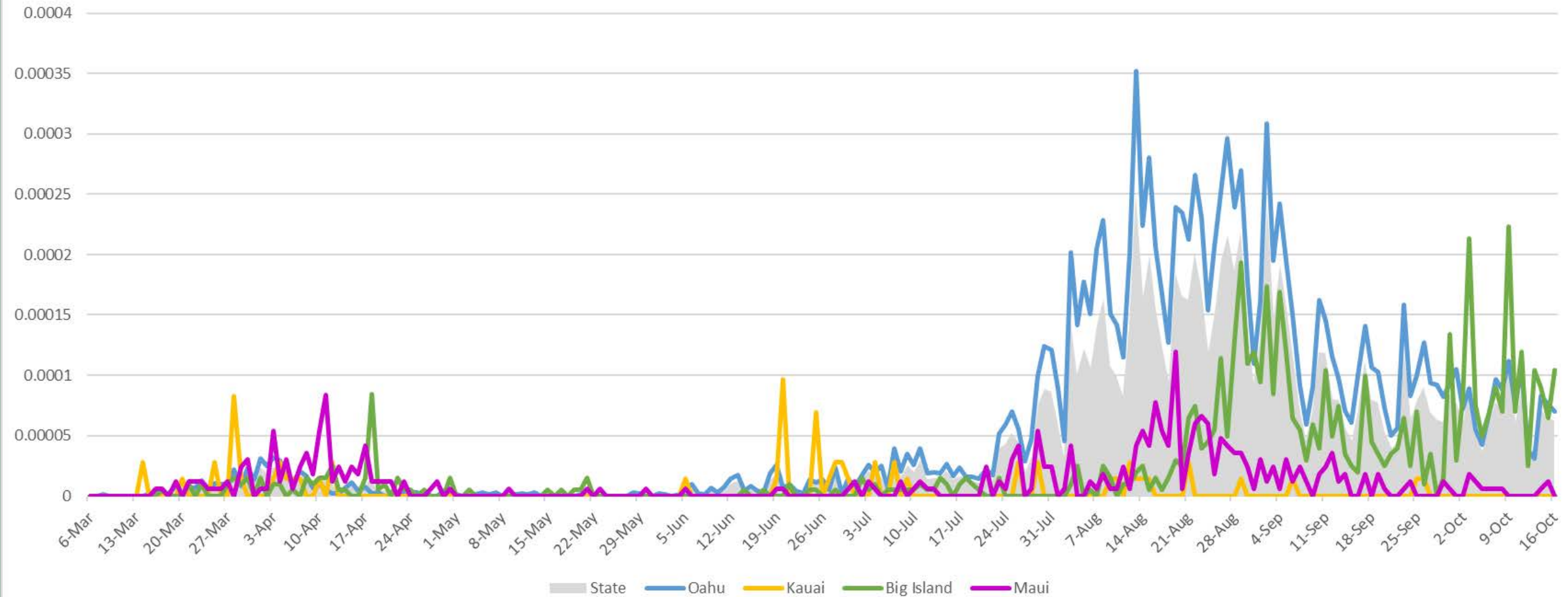

Cases per Day per Capita by County (October 16, 2020)

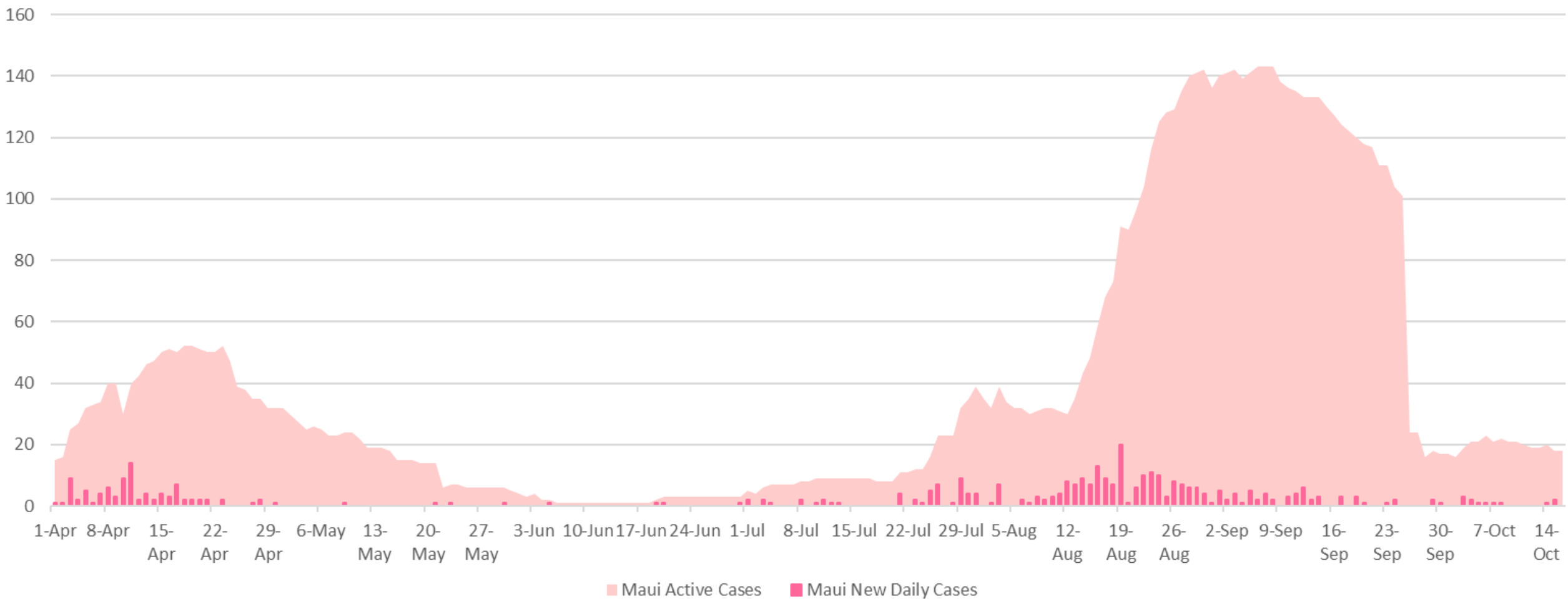

Medical Travel Exemption

- The Governor has signed and approved our updated Public Health Emergency Rules to allow Maui County residents traveling for medical appointments to be exempt from quarantine and not have to take a pre-departure test.
- The medical exemption is only for same day or overnight travel.

Medical Travel Exemption

- Travelers do not need to apply for a quarantine exemption, but must present their flight itinerary and doctor's letter with date of appointment to screeners on arrival.
- If the medical traveler needs a travel companion, this person must be specifically named in the doctor's letter.
- This exemption does not apply to any non-medical related purposes.

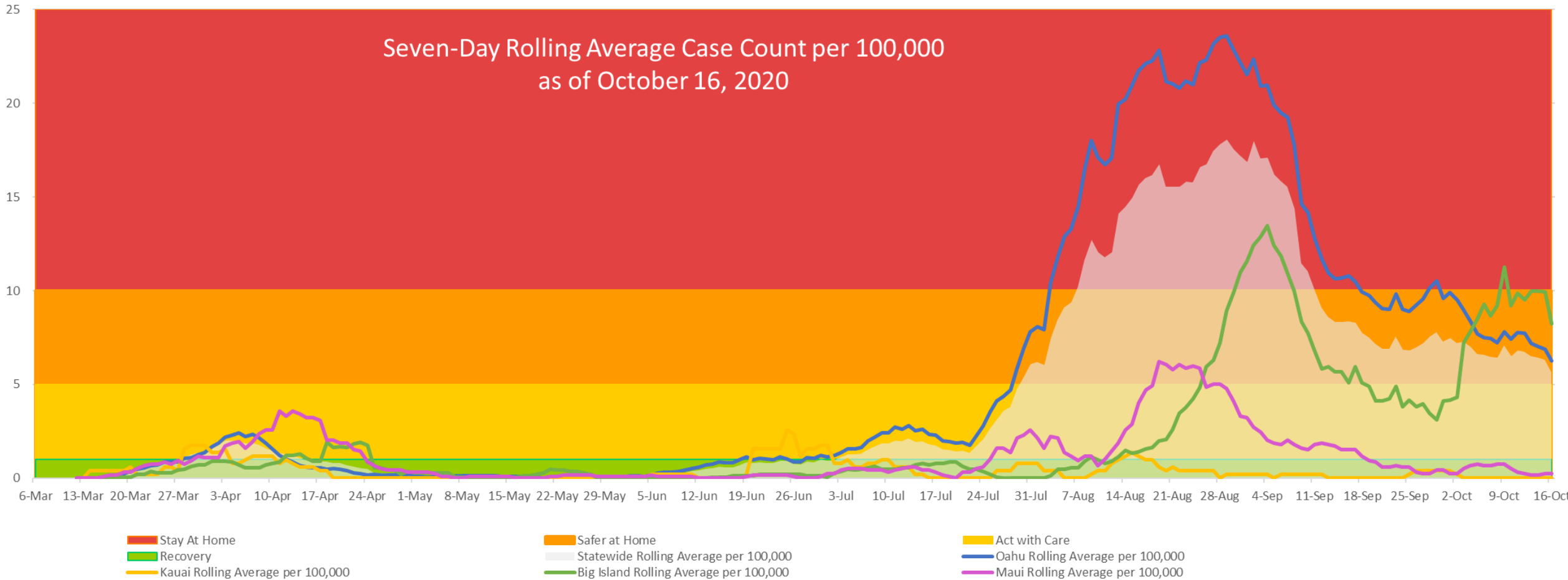
Maui County Status Update

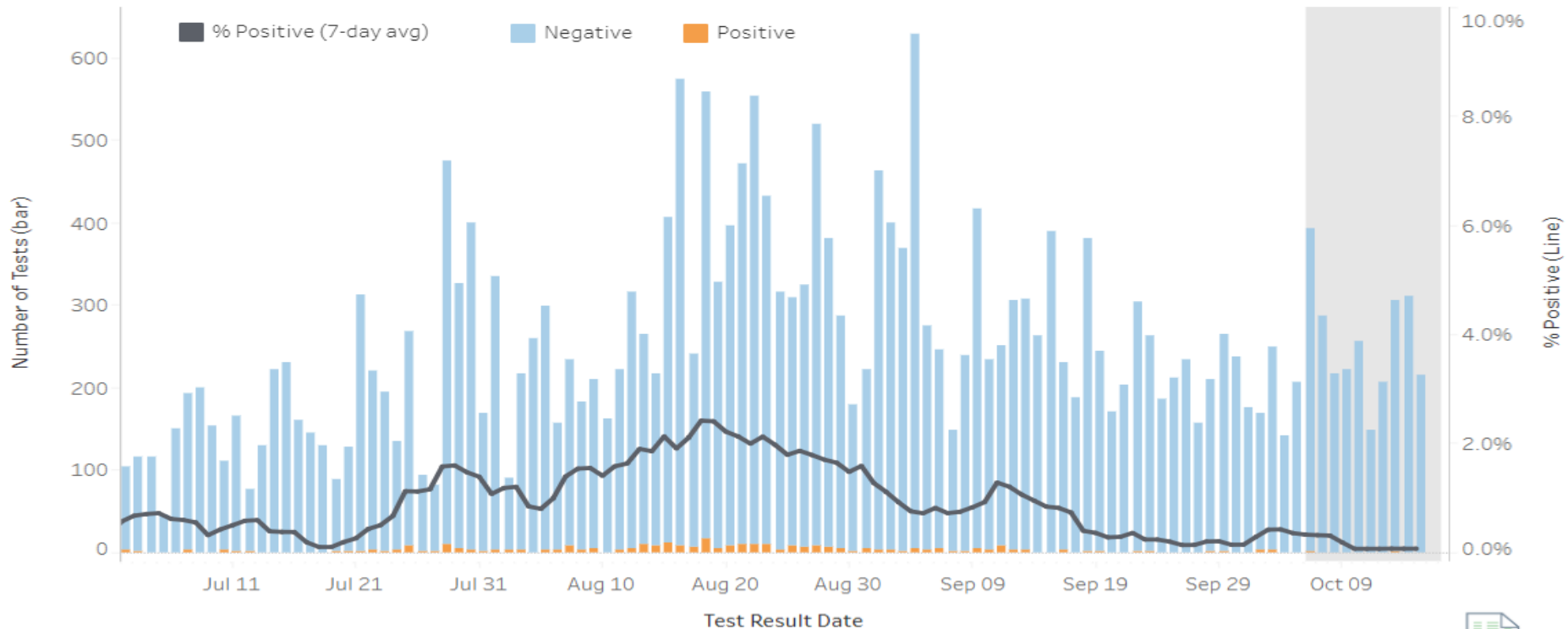

SAFER AT HOME

All incoming travelers subject to 14-day travel quarantine with limited exemptions

Daily Case Counts: 5-9.99 cases per 100,000 per day

Test Positivity Rate of 2.5% - 5%

Moderate- to high-risk businesses may be closed

Non-essential travel limited

Residents should stay home as much as possible

Only essential travel permitted

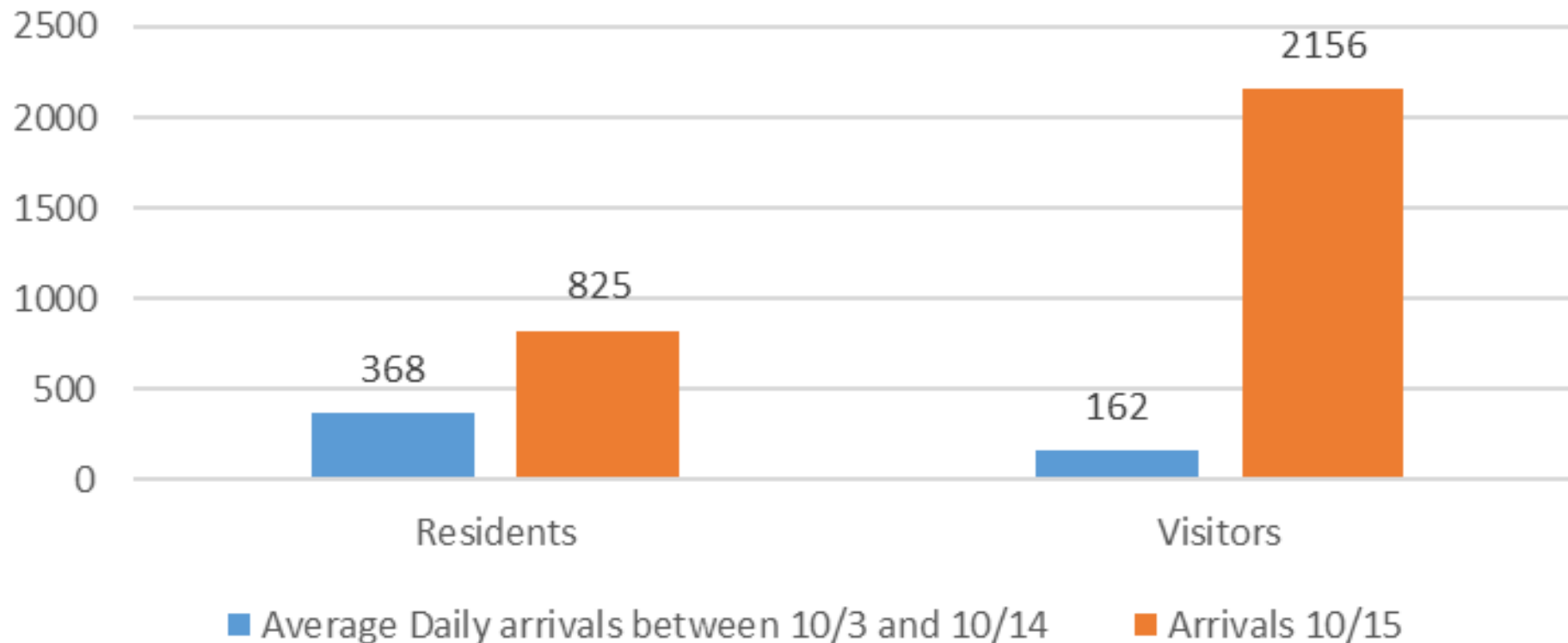

Comparison of the Average Arrivals to Maui County during the beginning of October to 10/15/20 Arrivals

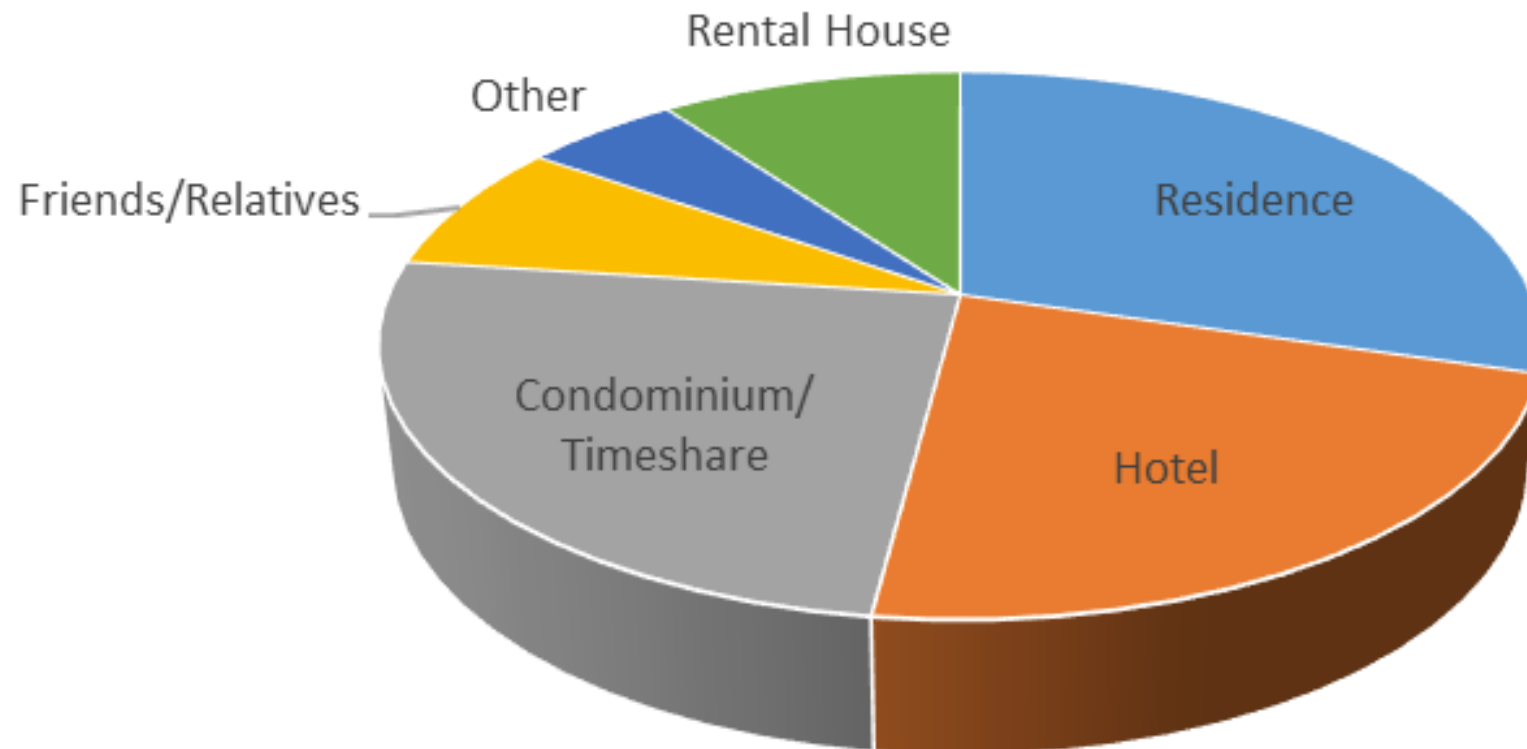

Location of Lodging of 10/15/20 Arriving Travelers

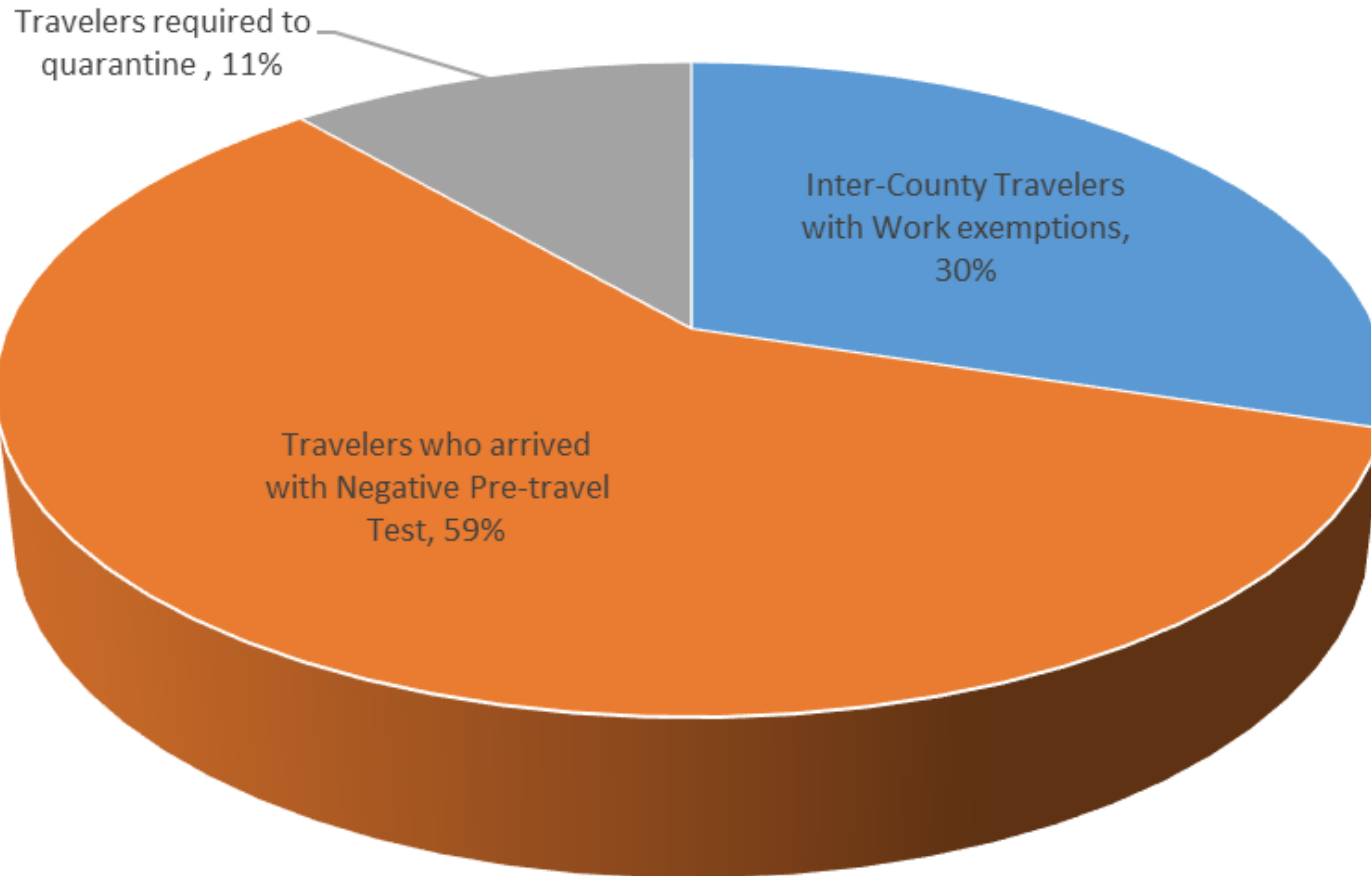

Traveler Screening Results 10/15/20



Maui County Travel Update

- According to the State of Hawaii Safe Travels Application, 2,981 passengers were screened yesterday, Oct. 15, in Maui County.
- Traveler Breakdown:
 - 2,156 were visitors
 - 825 were residents
- Traveling to:
 - 1,807 traveled to Kahului Airport
 - 22 traveled to Molokai Airport
 - 6 traveled to Lanai City Airport

Maui County Travel Update

- **Key Takeaways:**
 - The vast majority of transpacific travelers received a negative pre-departure test before coming to Maui County – 2,614 exempt travelers or 59%.
 - Another 30% were inter-county travelers with work exemptions, which is a process that has been in place for the last several months.
 - A small percentage of travelers were ordered to quarantine and continue to be monitored, though, many were awaiting their pre-departure test results.

Travelers Must Follow County Health Rules

- All travelers must follow the County of Maui's Public Health Emergency Rules posted on our website at MauiCounty.gov.
- Our rules include:
 - Indoor and outdoor social gatherings are restricted to no more than 10 people.
 - Face masks must be worn in all public spaces unless exercising, eating or dealing with a medical condition.
 - All people should maintain a minimum of 6-foot physical distance from people outside their household.
 - Anyone who is sick should stay home or at their place of lodging.

Travelers Must Follow County Health Rules

- **County parks and beach parks are open from 7:00 a.m. – 7:00 p.m., with outdoor County courts open until 8:00 p.m.**
- **No tents or structures larger than six feet are allowed.**
- **Grilling also is not allowed at County parks and beach parks.**

Three Steps for Traveling to Maui County

- Travelers to Maui County from any destination outside of Maui, Molokai and Lanai should remember these three steps:
 - **Arrive Healthy**: Mandatory pre-departure test conducted within 72 hours prior to departing for Maui County.
 - **Stay Healthy**: Voluntary post-arrival test conducted 72 hours after arriving into Maui County.
 - **Return Home Healthy**: Depart Maui County with aloha.

Three Steps for Traveling to Maui County

- **IMPORTANT NOTE:** Anyone not subject to quarantine may travel solely between Maui, Molokai and Lanai without having to take a pre-departure test.

Arrive Healthy

- Children under the age of five will not be required to take a pre-departure test.
- The test must be done through one of the State's trusted testing partners available at www.HawaiiCOVID19.com/travel-partners.

Arrive Healthy

- All travelers must complete the State's mandatory travel and health form on the Hawaii Safe Travels Digital Platform at www.travel.hawaii.gov.
- Negative test results should be uploaded onto this platform.
- Travelers are strongly encouraged to complete the forms at least 24 hours prior to arrival.
- Airport screeners will review information upon arrival and conduct temperature screenings.

Arrive Healthy

- If a traveler's test is **NEGATIVE**, they will be exempt from quarantine.
- If a traveler's test is **POSITIVE**, they **SHOULD NOT** travel to Maui County.
 - If their positive test is returned after they arrive to Maui County, they must isolate at their place of lodging and follow all directions from the State Department of Health.
- Any traveler whose pre-departure test result is not available at the time of arrival, must quarantine at their place of lodging until their negative result is submitted and verified by the State.

Arrive Healthy

- Travelers who DO NOT provide a pre-departure test will be ordered to quarantine for 14 days or the length of their stay, whichever is shorter.
 - They **CANNOT** test out of quarantine.
- Limited quarantine exemptions will still be available for essential (CISA) workers and requests can be submitted through www.MauiCounty.gov.

Stay Healthy

- Travelers are strongly encouraged to take a voluntary, post-arrival test 72 hours after arriving to Maui County.
- The voluntary second test will be at no cost to the traveler.
- The County of Maui is working with a medical provider on designated, on-site testing locations for travelers in West Maui, South Maui and Central Maui.
 - The County also is rolling out a mobile testing unit that will be visiting hotels around the island.
 - Travelers should check with their lodging accommodations for testing times and locations.

Stay Healthy

- **The County of Maui also is conducting additional community-based testing with a medical provider.**
 - **More details will be announced next week.**

Molokai Farming Cost-Reimbursement Program

- The Office of Economic Development announces its second round of funding available for the Molokai Farming Cost-Reimbursement Program.
- An additional \$200,000 has been allocated to the program to help Molokai farmers and ranchers comply with federal food regulations and state food safety laws.
 - About \$23,000 was provided in the first round of funding.

Molokai Farming Cost-Reimbursement Program

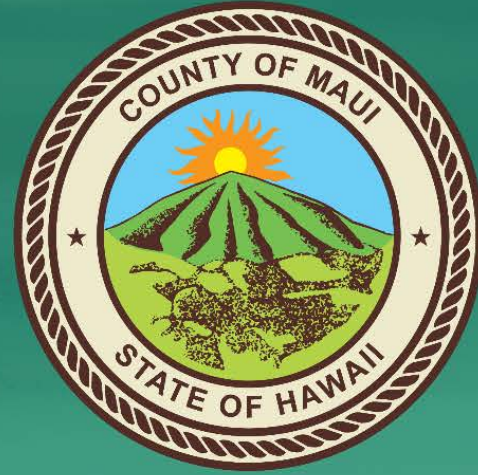
- Applicants may receive cost reimbursements of up to \$5,000.
