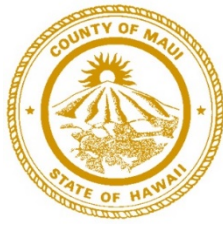

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## **EMERGENCY HOUSING VOUCHERS**

The County of Maui has been awarded 76 Emergency Housing Vouchers (EHV) through the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). The EHV's will provide rental assistance to low-income individuals and families who are:

- Homeless;
- At risk of homelessness;
- Fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking, or;
- Recently homeless and for whom providing rental assistance will prevent the family's homelessness or having high risk of housing instability.

EHV's are limited to the eligible populations listed above. If an individual or family believes they may meet the eligibility criteria for an EHV, they may contact Bridging The Gap Maui County. Pre-screening of individuals or families claiming to meet one of the four qualifying categories will be conducted by Bridging the Gap.

The County of Maui will not perform EHV program eligibility and will only accept direct referrals from Bridging The Gap Maui County through the Coordinated Entry System. The availability of EHV's is managed through a direct referral process and referrals from individuals and families will not be accepted. Please note that connection to the Coordinated Entry System does not guarantee eligibility or prioritization for housing or rental subsidy support.

All applicable nondiscrimination and equal opportunity requirements apply to the EHV program, including requirements that the County of Maui grants reasonable accommodations to persons with disabilities, effectively communicating with persons with disabilities, and ensuring meaningful access for persons with limited English proficiency (LEP).
